# Future Uses of the Royal Papworth Hospital Site

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING WITH THE HOSPITAL

The Parish Council is pleased to have been able to arrange an open, public meeting at which it is expected the Papworth Hospital management will be able to present their current proposals for uses of the hospital site following the hospital's move to a new home on the Cambridge Biomedical Campus, near Addenbrookes Hospital, in the city, in September this year.

# The meeting will be held at Papworth Village Hall at 7.30pm on Wednesday 31st January 2018

This meeting is open to all village residents wishing to attend As reported in December's News and Views, the Parish Council was shown at a meeting in November, some preliminary plans of what is proposed for the soon-to-be vacant site.

The Parish Council gave some initial, verbal responses, which took into account the comments and suggestions provided by residents at the public meeting hosted by the Parish Council last September.

Following the November meeting, the hospital updated its proposals and plans. The Parish Council has responded again, this time with some brief written comments on possible development proposals. Therefore, the dialogue between the village and the hospital – for which we waited so long - is now underway.

We assume the hospital will again revise their proposals and present the latest plans for residents to consider at the public meeting on 31st January. (As yet, there is no indication of what the planning authority - South Cambs District Council - thinks of the Hospital's plans for the site).

# Happy New Year from the Parish Council!

#### **NEW YEAR, NEW CHALLENGE**

The Parish Council currently have vacancies for several new Councillors.

Parish Councils are the first tier of local government. They deliver a range of services at a community level and their role is to represent the local community, provide services to meet local needs and improve quality of life and community well-being.

There are lots of reasons why people want to join their local Parish Council - often it is because they want:

- to speak on behalf of their local community and to help local people and represent their needs and concerns

As County and District Councils face funding cuts, more services are being delegated to Parish Councils, with a corresponding increase in workload and responsibility. We're looking for people who can rise to that challenge and make a commitment to improving the quality of life for everybody in our village.

Knowledge and experience aren't essential, training is available and existing members have a wealth of experience they are willing to share. The essential element is a willingness to work as a member of our team to make a difference. Could you participate constructively in the government of Papworth Everard Parish, playing your part in the formation and scrutiny of the Parish Council's policies and budgets, assisting in the management of the services that the Parish Council maintain on behalf of the village, whilst ensuring, at all times, that the Parish Council is properly managed?

Are you willing to represent the interests of the whole electorate, alongside dealing with enquiries, representations and occasionally complaints from individual Parishioners?

We'll expect you to attend all Parish Council meetings (currently 11 per year), preparing as necessary beforehand and being properly informed about the issues to be discussed.

## Update on proposed improvements to the A428 and Caxton Gibbet roundabout

It has been reported by Victoria Carter, who recently joined the Parish Council, and who attended a meeting organised by the Highways Agency for Parish Councils and by Pete Cruse, a Parish Councillor, who spoke to the Highways Agency by phone, that no firm decisions have yet been taken by the Agency on either the preferred route of an upgraded A428 or an improved roundabout, despite holding a public consultation on proposals in early 2017. While it is still intended that the A428 improvement scheme will go ahead, it is understood that the earliest it will start is 2020, after completion of the A14 upgrade.

#### Sewage Farm (aka 'Water Recycling Centre')

Information has been received that South Cambs District Council has given the County Council planning permission to erect two glass-reinforced, plastic kiosks to house electrical control equipment at the Water Recycling Centre.

If you notice unpleasant odours emanating from the sewage works at the North end of the village please report it to Nnglian Water on 0800 145145.

#### **House extensions**

At the December 2016 meeting, the Parish Council's Planning Committee recommended that South Cambs District Council give approval to two proposals for extensions to the rear of two domestic properties in Papworth Everard – one in Byfield Road and the other in Ermine Street North.

#### Tree works, North Lodge Drive

The Parish Council was invited by the South Cambs Trees officer to comment on proposals for work on tress with tree preservation orders near the play area North Lodge Drive. This work could range from minor surgery to felling and is normally undertaken by landscape or tree contractors for clients (in this case the client is the developer David Wilson Homes). However, the information which accompanied this application was inadequate and the Parish Council's Planning Committee maintained an objection to any works until full details become available.

# **Nigel di Castiglione - Team Rector** Excited or fearful?

As I write it appears there will be regime change in Zimbabwe and questions are being asked whether Angela Merkel will be able to form a new government in Germany. Many people are feeling nervous what a new year will bring; will it make them less likely to make any challenging resolutions?

On the other hand, I have just been speaking with someone who – after more than 80 years of robust health – has had 2 significant operations in the past

year and both have gone better than she feared beforehand. We really don't know what will happen and many fears turn out to be unfounded.

One of the joys we will have witnessed or heard about over Christmas was seeing children and grandchildren opening presents with great excitement and pure joy. There is something very attractive about the way young children have complete confidence only good things can happen around them; then we watch them grow and witness how in years to come they seem to develop the same anxieties and uncertainties many adults wrestle with.

Jesus once said, 'Unless you become like little children you cannot enter the kingdom of heaven'. He was encouraging childlikeness (not childishness!) in how we think about and learn to trust in God. Of course, that feels a lot harder for some than others, because they have grown up with bad experiences that have tainted their perspective on eg the idea of God as our Father.

Childlikeness, in matters of faith and religious belief, really only works when we can be confident that God is utterly good and no hint of evil, deceit and malevolence can be found in him. But this is what authentic Christianity believes, commends and offers.

A retort I have heard often goes like this: "I'll believe it when I see it". I suggest that makes no sense – because when we see something we no longer need to believe in it! The challenge is to turn that sort of thinking upside down and start saying "I'll see it when I believe it!" That's the foundation on which all worthwhile relationships are built including agreeing to marry someone, who I buy a car from, the people we work with etc.

My prayer is that everyone in Papworth Everard will have an exceptionally good, happy and prosperous year in 2018; and if we start the year believing that, we will have more days to be full of hope, expectation, and (dare I say) joy than if we embark on 2018 full of gloom, dark fears and the prevailing view that says everyone and everything is against us!



# Country Matters by Eleanor Bladon

### A Bird's Guide to Winter Getaways



Throughout November and December people often lament how it's getting colder and the days are getting shorter, so it's easy to see why many of us would rather curl up on the sofa with a hot chocolate than venture outdoors. But all is not lost! To some the British winter is so attractive that they will even travel thousands of miles to get here. Sure, they may have feathers to keep them warm but we have waterproofs and wellies so there's no reason we can't enjoy the weather as much as them. I am, of course, talking about our winter migrant birds.

A few weeks ago I was helping with the bird ringing stand at an RSPB event. Bird ringing is carried out by fullytrained licensed ringers who know how to safely catch and handle birds – it is perfectly harmless to the bird and allows us to collect important scientific data about them (weight, size, age etc.) which can inform conservation measures. The practice gets its name from the tiny ring which is placed on the bird's leg once its data has been recorded. The brilliant thing about these rings is that if a bird is subsequently caught by someone else they can find out where that bird was ringed. Although nifty GPS tags can now show us the exact migration route followed by a bird, simple numbered rings have been informing our knowledge of migration for over 100 years. Amongst the resident blue tits, great tits and chaffinches which were ringed at the event, we caught a redwing. Ringing data has told us that most of these little thrushes travel to the UK and Ireland from as far away as Scandinavia, Russia and Iceland to enjoy our relatively mild winters.

Some redwings arrive in the UK as early as September, with more arriving in flocks from October. They absolutely love hedgerows and woodlands with fruit-bearing shrubs and trees, like hawthorn with its juicy berries, and open fields where they can find worms. With our woods and green spaces, Papworth is a good place to spot these little visitors. From afar a redwing may look like any other

little brown bird but get a little closer and you'll notice its striking cream stripes above its eyes and below its cheeks, its heavily dappled underside and, the feature which gives it its name, the glorious russet feathers under its wings. They are rarely alone so you're likely to see them enjoying a meal in a group, and they may even be interspersed with a flock of fieldfares, another winter migrant.

So next time you're fed up with our damp and gloomy weather, just remember that for some birds Papworth is an all-inclusive dream destination for a winter getaway. After all, who needs sun, sea and sand when you've got a good supply of berries and worms?

As we build up to the big day, I was excited to be invited to Cambourne to switch on their Christmas lights.

This had a rather unexpected twist – as I was sawn in half on stage! I'm pleased to report

that both parts of me were put back together in time for me to make it to the Fen Drayton "Call my wine bluff" fundraiser later that evening – well done to the organisers of both events, and a special mention to the surgeon on standby!

Staying with Cambourne, I continue to pay very close attention to the developing proposals for the Cambourne to Cambridge busway and park and ride.



The Greater Cambridgeshire Partnership's (GCP) consultation on the proposed sites for the park and ride and busway routes is now live. As part of my promise to listen to residents, I went along to the GCP's roadshow in Coton, so I could gauge residents' views on the latest options first hand. This is a really important consultation as the outcome will shape how we deal with congestion issues and improve the transport links so desperately missing in Cambourne.

On the 10th/11th/12th November, I joined commemoration services at the Cambridge American Cemetery in Coton, in Sawston and my home village of Elsworth. These services are such an important date in the calendar as we came together to recognise the service of our Armed Forces past and present. We must never forget.

Last month's Budget contained big news for our local area with a number of key measures:

- •A new East West Rail company will be set up to deliver a rail link between Oxford and Cambridge.
- •Addenbrooke's station The Government committed £5 million to develop our proposals for a station on the Biomedical campus.
- Construction will begin on key elements of the Oxford to Cambridge road expressway.
- •£1.7 billion will go towards improving transport for English cities with our Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority receiving £74 million.

South Cambridgeshire is a great place to live and work and I will continue to keep a very sharp focus on all the

local infrastructure improvements needed to ensure we stay that way. I'm also in conversation with Highways England, Network Rail and our local authorities regarding the Foxton crossing and Girton Interchange. I have slowly but surely pushed these long overdue projects up the agenda and will keep you posted. Initial meetings are promising!

It is always such a pleasure to visit local schools and I continue on my mission to get round all sixty six of them! I have in the last few weeks opened the new library at Bellbird Primary in Sawston and visited Perse Upper School (pictured right) in Cambridge. Students remain a source of the most difficult questions!

I was also pleased to visit Orwell Brownies and Melbourn

On 1st December, I was pleased to be invited to support FareShare and Tesco at their Christmas food collection

at the Bar Hill store.

Local people were so generous with their donations of food. Tesco also add an additional 20% as well as providing FareShare with food from their distribution centres. To ensure this good food does not

go to waste, Fareshare then distribute it to organisations such as hostels, children's breakfast clubs and meals for older people. 



The Choir also sang at the carol service at Elsworth Church and to the Papworth Day Care Centre.




Lunch: About 25 members enjoyed a traditional Christmas lunch at the Waresley Garden Centre where we were looked after very well with great food and service.


