Future Uses of the Royal Papworth Hospital site

Report of Public meeting

A meeting between the Hospital and village residents about the future use of the hospital site took place on Wednesday 31st January on the village hall. It was gratifying to the parish council to see 137 residents present. The Hospital fielded a team of five.

The Hospital presented their current position, which is to maintain the site until they sell it to a developer. In the meantime, the hospital will engage in a process of planning future site uses. Implementation of any proposed future developments would be entirely the responsibility of the developer who eventually purchases the site.

Little detail was presented about specific site uses proposed. It was said that although the future Hospital site had been advertised to other NHS organisations for 2 years, no expressions of interest have been received; therefore, it had been concluded that it was unlikely that a future medical use could be found for the site; although the hospital said they were remained open to suggestions and offers.

The Hospital had also been advised that another business park (industrial

park) in the village is unlikely to be successful. Some residents also commented that they did not want to see more vans and lorries access the site through the village.

A member of the Hospital team considered, therefore, that the most likely future use was a 'blended development', which I take to mean 'mixed development', including house building and community uses. Whether it might include any commercial uses, (e.g. offices, shops or a pub) is unclear.

The hospital also owns the two nurses' home sites on Church Lane. They will be selling these for redevelopment, as well as the main hospital site.

Other issues were raised by residents that were related to the hospital site, but not to future uses. Concern was expressed about how the hospital site, once vacant, would be secured against acts of vandalism, Traveller incursions, etc. The Hospital management accepted that if it is unable to sell the site to a developer before it is vacated by the hospital (2 months after the clinical services move to Cambridge), they will need to adequately secure the site, but it seemed no clear plans for this had been made.



This discussion prompted further comments about the number of vacant, unused buildings there are in the village centre. The parish council is aware of this issue. It is true that up to a couple of couple of years ago buildings were standing empty because the owners had no use for them; however, more recently, at least three buildings on Ermine Street have been sold and been granted planning permission for refurbishment or redevelopment (i.e. the former Papworth Trust head office (aka The Estate Office), the former printing factory and the Roman Catholic Church).

Now it is the new owners who are not getting on with development! Another building, the old School (former CIMA building), is owned by the County Council. The Council has submitted a planning application to SCDC to convert it to dwellings, but this has yet to be approved.

Some residents were disappointed that the Hospital did not seem to have given much thought to how the hospital could be memorialised in the village, which has been its home for the last 100 years. This is something the Parish Council will follow up.

Other more personal issues were raised about the Hospital's move, which to Hospital team undertook to deal with, directly with the individuals concerned, after the meeting.

Some residents probably left the meeting with a feeling that they had little clear idea what future uses the hospital site will be put to. It seems that the hospital is in the position that while it is prepared to discuss the future with the village and put some broad ideas forward, the detailed planning will be left to the new developer. For such a large site near to the centre of the village a more robust plan is necessary. There is a current policy in the District Council's Local Development Framework that says details of development of the Hospital site will be contained in a "Supplementary Planning Document" (SPD). (SPDs are often quite specific about the uses to which sites can be put and would probably zone for different uses). No such document has been prepared. With the Hospital leaving the village in September, there is relatively little time to get this done; however, a proposal to request an SPD from the District Council will be made at the next meeting of the Parish Council's planning committee on Tuesday 6th February.

We will continue to keep residents up-to-date through reports in the News and Views.

CHURCH LANE PUBLIC ART

Can be almost anything of a non-functional, artistic nature. It would need to be in a material that is durable and stand in an open-air, public place. Some public art includes plaques for inscriptions or poems, etc. It could be static, or include some moving parts.

It would be usual for the developer to commission an artist to work-up a design from ideas that are presented.

Country Matters by Eleanor Bladon

Body Snatchers

These last few months I've been particularly busy dealing with some tricky little undertakers. Don't worry, I haven't suffered a bereavement, I have just been conducting research for my Masters degree on Burying Beetles, one of the undertakers of the natural world. There are many

species of these fascinating beetles, with my study species, Nicrophorus vespilloides, being just one of the several that are found in the UK.

One of the things that makes the Burying Beetle so fascinating, its bizarre mating behaviour, is also what might make some readers' stomachs turn, so if you are of a squeamish nature this might be the time to turn the page. Burying Beetles need a small vertebrate carcass to breed on but they are scavengers, not killers, so they will search the woodland floor for the carcasses of small birds or rodents. With their highly sensitive antennae, it is said that they can locate a carcass over a distance of up to several kilometres away - a skill that puts our sense of smell to shame! A few beetles might find a carcass at the same time, in which case the females will fight amongst themselves, as will the males, leaving the winners – usually the biggest male and female - to take possession of it. The winning couple will then mate

repeatedly and prepare the carcass by dragging it to a more suitable spot if necessary (yes, they're that strong!), then stripping it of its feathers or fur, spreading it with antimicrobial oral and anal secretions (yummy!), rolling it into a neat ball and burying it underground. Phew, that's a lot of work for such a little beetle! The female will then lay her eggs around the buried carcass and once they hatch both parents will feed their offspring with regurgitated meat - maybe not our idea of good parental care, but it certainly works for them. The parents will stay until the offspring are able to care for themselves, with the male leaving just a couple of days before the female.

Biparental care is rare in insects, which makes the Burying Beetle a fascinating study system for evolutionary and behavioural ecology research. However, you don't need an interest in science to appreciate their peculiar ecology. If you are lucky and in the right place at the right time, you might even catch a glimpse of one. They obviously like habitats where there is likely to be a regular supply of carcasses, so the easiest place to see them is in woodland, where birds and small mammals will regularly die naturally and fall to the ground. One such place around here where we know they are present is The Wildlife Trust's Gamlingay Wood. Burying Beetles hibernate over the winter and tend to only be active between April and October, but during those months your best chance of seeing them flying is just before dusk, when they are looking for carcasses and mating opportunities. There are subtle differences between the species, but two of the most common UK Nicrophorus species, vespilloides and vespillo, are both not much larger than a thumbnail and mostly black with bright orange markings on their wing cases.

Their ecology may seem gruesome at first, but their role of recycling dead bodies is so important for a healthy, functioning woodland ecosystem, and makes it a lot cleaner for us too! So next time you're out for a woodland walk this spring, just think about how underneath your feet there might be an industrious pair of Burying Beetle parents working together to raise a family.

Nigel di Castiglione - Team Rector Breaking out of the darkness

The snowdrops have burst through and many daffodils are already sitting up proudly. Spring is on the way even if there are likely to be a few more blasts of winter weather. My confidence rests on what I see from my desk but also profound and ongoing promises from God which are there for us all

One of the challenges many of us face is to go beyond the harsh realities of what confronts us when we wake up every day, and hold challenges and problems we have in the light of who God is and how we can enjoy Him day-by-day. This is

nothing new but people of faith who engage with a local faith community have a long history of knowing that 'a problem shared is a problem halved'.

Sometimes we think things like: 'how can that be so; how can sharing what I am going through make any difference to what I have to face?' Speaking out can act like the valve on a pressure cooker – taking the heat out of what we are feeling; and draw in wisdom or perspective from others that helps us to find a way through we had not considered or thought feasible.

The Christian tradition encourages us to speak out to God also, both for ourselves and on behalf of others. When we do it is amazing! We start to discover His still small voice whispering wisdom from heaven into our thinking and opening vistas we had lost sight of.

That's one reason I am glad many of our local churches are open every day for people to spend time in quiet prayer and reflection.

One of the stories of Jesus' life (John 5v2-9) describes when he initiated a conversation with a man with major health problems who had spent many years by the side of a spa with a reputation for bringing healing. This man still believed he could get well but had lost the hope it would happen to him. Jesus pricked the bubble of his misplaced despair.

This story shows how, when filled with compassion, we see the struggles others are going through and can make a difference by starting a conversation, asking some questions that bring to the surface deep-seated assumptions that sometimes may not be right.

Let's not be so private we end up isolated with our own problems, and not so wary or fearful of upsetting others we miss opportunities to be Good Samaritan along the way.

January has seemed to be interminable, but we are now in February, and the first snowdrops are beginning to bravely face the elements - a first hint of spring. However, February can be a beastly month, frequently bringing unwelcome, cold, winter days. So there is all the more reason to pass some of your time with our jolly and productive group knitting, crocheting, cross stitching, embroidering or sewing, for two hours on the first and third Saturdays of the month.

After our second meeting of the new year, we had our delayed Christmas lunch at Waresley Park Garden Centre. It was fun, everyone enjoyed it, and the staff there were very welcoming and helpful. Advance warning here that this year's Christmas treat will again be at Waresley Park, but for afternoon tea. We are ahead of the game! Everyone has been very busy on their individual projects during January, but after some encouragement, a few members brought in finished projects. One stood out, I think, for us all, and that was a baby blanket in pale blue and white, with hearts incorporated in squares at regular intervals. The blanket was knitted as a piece, not with squares that needed to be sewn up.

The most eye catching feature was that on one side the hearts were white on a solid blue small square, and on the reverse side the hearts were blue on white squares. It was truly stunning, and some fortunate parent will have the joy of using it for her baby.

Yarn 'cakes' are very much in vogue. As the name suggests, the yarn is in the shape of a round cake, and as the knitting or crochet progresses, the colours change, creating a beautiful blending of shades. One of our members is on her second 'cake', but did not bring the piece that she had finished with the previous one. We look forward to seeing it on 3 February.

At our last session in January there was quite a variety of projects on the go. One member is making beautiful squares for a blanket, an ideal project to do over the two hours. Our primary cross stitcher has started a new kit, but did not bring the piece that she had been working

It was half done in the middle of January, so it is possible that it has already been completed. Some members are so productive, that projects come and go, with some in the middle that never make it to our meetings! There is a glorious acid green blanket being knitted by one of our expert, and very productive knitters. It is so soft and comforting to the touch. That will undoubtedly have been finished since our meeting on 14 January, but hopefully we shall get to see it, before it goes to whoever is the lucky recipient. Our member of the heart blanket is now working on a cardigan with bobbles and cables in the pattern. It is amazing that she has been able to knit this at the group, because the chat and laughter can sometimes distract us. The mammoth crochet blanket has moved on to a new square of a different design, which is coming along nicely - only 90 plus more squares to go! We had all expected to see the beautiful tiger print cardigan knitted by one member, who had bought the yarn on a whim. It is super soft, very tasteful, and she has promised to bring it to show us on 3 February. The crocheted animals are still in production. There are 'body parts' together in a bag, waiting to be united with the correct heads and limbs. They are fun to do, and easy, as long as you count the stitches all the time, and use stitch markers. Failure to do so leads to unravelling, and trying again.

Do come and join us, even if just for a chat and to see what is going on. We would love some new members - don't be shy! We welcome all, irrespective of age or gender! You will be supporting our wonderful library, as this is a community activity, and helps to keep the footfall up, and the library open.
