





How much do you know about your local Hospice's services, who can access them and how?

Arthur Rank Hospice cares for more than 3000 people each year who are living with a non-curable illness. This could include someone who has lung disease, motor neurone disease, multiple sclerosis, certain forms of cancer and heart failure, or many other life-limiting conditions.

Whilst we are best known for our Inpatient Unit, day therapy and Hospice at Home services, holistic care and support are also provided by the Specialist Palliative Care Home Team (which includes triage, central referrals and clinical nurse specialists who deliver their care within the community); patient and family support (counselling, social workers, chaplaincy); complementary therapy, physio and occupational therapy and outpatient clinics for lymphoedema and pain management.

Referrals are commonly made by an individual's GP but can also be made through District Nurses, Arthur Rank Community Team Specialist Nurses and other health professionals. Very occasionally the referrals team receives enquiries directly from individuals and in these instances information is gathered

before the individual is required to ask the aforementioned professionals to agree a referral is necessary.

When a person has already received the Hospice's care they can self-refer by contacting our Referrals Office on 01223 675800 (9-3pm, Monday to Friday),

Bring on Spring!

Phew! After a winter that seemed to last approximately two years and involved a never-ending barrage of "Beasts from the East", it is finally spring. And I for one am in the mood to celebrate it. The days are getting longer, the weather is (mostly) getting milder, and signs of spring are popping up everywhere. So this month I thought I would share some of my favourite spring activities which will surely help you ditch that wintry mood.

Listen for Bird Song

At this time of year birds have begun signing ardently, both to attract mates and defend their precious territories from rivals, so it is one of the best times to practice identifying bird songs. This is especially easy if you have a few bird species that regularly sing in your garden, as you can become accustomed to seeing them sing, as well as just hearing them, making identification easier. There are some great free resources for learning bird song, with one of the easiest to use being the audio clips on the individual species pages of the RSPB's website.

Learn to ID Wildflowers

One sure sign that spring is here is the blooming of a stunning selection of wildflowers in the village and beyond. We are exceptionally lucky to have such a beautiful display of bluebells and wood anemones right here in our little wood, as well as sprinklings of jaunty primroses throughout the village on the road verges. Basic wildflower identification is a good project for a budding naturalist because many of the species we find around here are common and easily identifiable, and with plants the benefit is that they stay still long enough for you to grab a photo! Outside the village one of my favourite places to look for wildflowers is Paxton Pits Nature Reserve. In the summer it boasts meadows full to the brim with bright carpets of blooms, but even in April some of my favourites, including common vetch and Dove's

foot cranesbill, are flowering. If you don't know your cow parsley from your cowslip and would like a helping hand, Plantlife's website has a really handy plant and fungi identification guide to get you started.

Spy on Reptiles

The UK has six species of reptiles: three snakes and three lizards. The species that you are most likely to see around here are grass snakes, slow worms and common lizards, and now is a good time to keep an eye out for them as they will be emerging after the winter and taking advantage of sunny basking spots. Reptiles seem to be the Marmite of the animal kingdom - you either love them or hate them, and I am very firmly in the first category! Reptiles, and especially snakes, get a bad reputation because many people are frightened of them, however the only venomous species of UK reptile is the adder but it is a shy species and would rather flee than fight you, and will only bite if it feels threatened. The best place to see reptiles at this time of year is sunbathing on warm rocks in clearings of woodland and grassland, but you may also catch sight of a grass snake swimmingly deftly across a pond in search of food - they're impressively speedy!

So those are just a few of my favourite ways to entertain the whole family outdoors in spring, but there is so much to do and see at this time of year, perhaps you could also spot emerging butterflies, look for frogspawn and take in the heady smell of cherry blossom in full bloom. Admittedly, being in Britain, we cannot always expect idyllic balmy spring sunshine during our outdoor jaunts, but as famed fellwalker Alfred Wainwright once said "there's no such thing as bad weather, only unsuitable clothing".

Look out for Lambs

Is there anything that epitomises spring better than a field of fluffy gambolling lambs? Lambing time at Wimpole Farm officially starts in late April, and is a brilliant place to see newborn rare-breed lambs and learn more about the lambing process.

If you're really lucky you might even see a sheep giving birth!

I am looking at snow covering the garden. It is mid-March; this time last year we were enjoying sunshine and the grass had already been cut a couple of times. Every year is different!

For many that is a good thing, but for others change is something we struggle with – the absence of predictability, uncertainties over health, family and work are challenges to overcome or more things to worry about.

Christians are confident in the unchanging goodness of God – something that is not affected by the circumstances around us or the readiness of God to make good of the strange and difficult things that happen. When some wonder how this can be ... part of the answer is God is not responsible for everything that goes on in the world; this does not make God helpless or impotent but reflects how we have been designed to exercise freewill and take significant responsibility for ourselves, others and the world in which we live. The flip side is, I believe, God spends a lot of time waiting for us to invite Him into the situations we are wrestling with; if this was not the case our freewill would be undermined.

I continue to read and ponder the significance of Psalm 46. If you have an old Bible lying around at home, you will find this passage close to the middle. The background assumes Israel's king has known huge political pressure when his people faced dreadful consequences from an enemy. This king, who would have been seen as one of the spiritual leaders of his era, uses music and poetry to express his confidence in God birthed from actual experience; including one moment when he became aware of God speaking to him saying:

"Be still. And know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations,

will be exalted in the earth!"

Rather than rushing around trying to rescue and turn around a desperate situation, God surprises him by telling him to get re-connected and re-focussed on the presence and character of God.

Whatever is going on for you right now, in all the challenges and opportunities just ahead, let me encourage you to find Psalm 46 this year and use it as a template to allow God some space to work with you at this time. My experience is you won't be disappointed! It may be just the thing to make 2018 a very different and special year.



Well, the Beast from the East certainly visited us in South Cambs at the end of February. I'm ashamed to say I couldn't actually get my car off the drive one particularly icy day....no lady driver comments please! Back to work and the Greater

Cambridge Partnership (GCP) is consulting on another important transport initiative. They are seeking your views on a number of options for improvements along the A11 and A1307. One option would potentially include a "Mass Rapid Transport" route from the A11 via Sawston to the Cambridge Biomedical Campus. This could include the Cambridgeshire Autonomous Metro which you may have read about. Another option being considered is a new dedicated public transport link between the existing Babraham Road Park and Ride and the Biomedical Campus and an inbound bus lane from Babraham Research Campus to the Park and Ride site.

All options under consideration would involve a new Park and Ride near the A11/A505 junction. Please do have a look and feed in your views before 9th April at https://www.greatercambridge.org.uk/

I am aware that any transport project will generate questions from residents so I am keen for the GCP to hear from as many local residents as possible. Part of the challenge with these sorts of initiatives is to ensure infrastructure improvements are made whilst also retaining the uniqueness of South Cambridgeshire as such a special place to live.

I continue to focus on promoting all the infrastructure improvements we need. This includes the new railway station at Addenbrooke's, the A428 expressway (Highways England must include the Girton interchange as part of this project) and the East West Rail link. I am determined to ensure these improvements are brought about as quickly as possible so I talk regularly to both local stakeholders and those National bodies and Ministers ultimately responsible for delivery.

As we know from the A14 improvements now underway, these major projects take time to deliver but they are vital to ensure South Cambridgeshire continues to thrive and cope with our growth. I am aware for example that residents may be wondering what is happening with the A428 upgrade. Please be assured this project is still

very alive and well, just delayed by a few months due to engineering design complexities at the A1 Black Cat end. Please keep an eye on my website for updates as I know more - https://www.heidisouthcambs.co.uk/a428-black-cat-caxton-gibbet

In other news, I was pleased to be able to present a petition to the House of Commons which had been signed by 610 residents who are concerned about the removal of the post box from Cottenham High Street.

I would like to pay tribute to Audrey Brownlow and Councillor Frank Morris for their campaign to bring back the post box. I hope the Department for Housing, Communities and Local Government and Royal Mail will show they are listening.

Also in Parliament, I have recently introduced a Bill which aims to improve the way in which the Child Maintenance Service (CMS) works, so on 20th February, I met the responsible Minister Kit Malthouse MP.

The CMS took over from the Child Support Agency a few years ago and following meetings with constituents, it became clear that improvements needed to be made to the new CMS. At my request, the Work and Pensions Select Committee, of which I am a member, conducted an investigation into the way the CMS was working for children and their parents.

My Bill seeks to close the legislative loopholes that allow a minority of parents to avoid paying their child maintenance and to provide the CMS with stronger enforcement powers.

The Bill will have its Second Reading on the 27th April and I am encouraged by the Minister's willingness to work with me.

Dog Fouling

It appears that dog mess is becoming more of an issue in the village once again.

It is particularly unpleasant when it is left on the playing field for people playing sports to tread in – prior to each match, the football coaches have to scour the playing field removing piles of dog mess before they can start playing. Dog mess left on pathways can end up on shoes, scooters, bike wheels and prams and spread all over the place.

Dog fouling is not only unpleasant - it can be dangerous – particularly for children. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness and seizures. With the lighter evenings upon us and more children playing out on the on the fields and public areas in the village, allowing your dog to foul and not clearing it up is unacceptable.

It is illegal not to clear up the mess left by your dog as soon as it has fouled and those that leave their mess behind could be liable to a fixed penalty notice. It is the responsibility of the dog owner or the person in charge of a dog to clear up any mess left by the dog as soon as it has fouled - being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse.

There are many dedicated dog waste bins throughout village, there is no excuse to leave dog mess on the paths and open spaces. If you can't find a dog bin, bag your pet's poo and take it home for disposal or if no other option is available, pick up any mess and seal it well using a bag which can then be carefully placed in a standard litter bin.

Paddling Pool Attendants Required – Summer Holidays

The paddling pool is a great asset to the village and well used each year by children from the village and from further afield.

But, we need helpers to keep it running - without people to look after the pool, we are unable to open it up for the summer. It takes a great deal of work to maintain the pool so it is safe and clean to use.

We are hoping to employ 2 or 3 people to share cover of approximately 5-6 hours spread out over the day from early morning until early evening, 7 days a week, from mid-July until mid-September. The pool attendant is a paid position and all necessary training will be provided.

Pendragon Preschool Learn about People who help us!

Pendragon Preschool have gained an enriched learning all about the wonderful People who help us. We have been very lucky to have had the opportunity to have

so many visitors come into preschool and talk to the children about their roles and how they help us. We had a wonderful talk from our lovely parent Mrs Soer who is a Nurse at A & E in Addenbrooke's Hospital. The children sat beautifully and listened to her talking all about her role in hospital dealing with the very poorly people who come in to hospital via an ambulance or sometimes the air ambulance. We heard all about how as a nurse she has to keep very clean and wears some special clothes called scrubs which is a blue uniform of a jacket type top with blue trousers. She also has to wash her hands lots and wear gloves and an apron to help protect her clothes and protect from catching germs. She showed us lots of wonderful pieces of equipment that she has to use to help patients feel better and to help the Doctors and Nurses find out what is wrong with the poorly patients.



The children were then very excited to be shown how to do some bandaging, put slings on, put aprons, gloves and masks on to keep clean and listen to other children's and adults heartbeats through a stethoscope.

Preschool then learnt about the fire service and we have enjoyed making 3D model fire engines, collage fire engines, using water sprayers to spray and mix the paint up and put the fire out, cooking bonfire cupcakes and some action role play in our wonderful fire engine and small world fire station set.

We were excited to get another visitor in which was Fireman Alex Graham. He came in with his uniform on from the fire station and gave a talk to the children all about what fire man do. The children knew that the fireman put out fires, tested smoke alarms and helped people out of car crashes but when Fireman Alex told them about helping people out of floods to they were very surprised.

The children sat beautifully as he talked about and showed us all his uniform and equipment he has to wear. They were surprised at how thick and heavy it was. They then enjoyed trying on the fire man's helmet.

Along with these two people's roles the children have been learning about what they would do if they found someone hurt and who we would need to call. They all know they need to ring for ambulance, fire engine or police so we then started about the number they would call on a telephone if they needed to get help and that is 999 but they were told they must never use this number unless it was an emergency and someone really is in danger or very poorly.



The children were also very lucky to be invited to the local Papworth fire station so we had a wonderful walk down to the local fire station in the village

and were greeted by two lovely Fireman called Dave Broach and Jamie and they gave the preschool children, staff and parent helpers a very warm welcome and a lovely talk all about the role of a fireman and they also showed us all inside the fire engine and all the equipment the fire engine holds.

Preschool children loved the talk and were all very excited to be allowed to sit inside the fire engine.

Next we had a visit from a wonderful Dentist lady Mrs Dawson who came in and gave the children a wonderful talk about her role as a dentist lady. The children enjoyed learning about teeth and counting their 20 milk teeth which are known to a dentist as deciduous teeth and then learning about how your teeth fall out when you are about 5-9 years old and your big teeth called your permanent teeth start to grow.

The children enjoyed watching Mrs Dawson dress her dentist teddy up in all the correct uniform and equipment, he had special glasses and a light and some tools which he used to look at and check the children's teeth.

The children learnt all about how to brush their teeth, 1 minute brushing the top teeth and tickling their gums and one minute brushing all the teeth along the bottom tickling their gums. They were also told they should use a pea size amount of toothpaste.

Mrs Dawson then finished the talk off if a lovely game about a dinner plate and a tooth. The children were shown some food cards and they had to decide whether the food shown they were allowed to eat only at dinner times or whether they were allowed to eat it at any time of the day as it was kind to the teeth.



We have also been very fortunate to have a visit form Wood green animal shelter. Jenny and Nat came in to give a wonderful talk to the children all about the role of a vet carer, a vet and a vet nurse. The children enjoyed being invited up to take part in role

playing in the roles of these people and act out the role using pretend guinea pigs. The children were all very excited at the end to see two real guinea pigs called Rosie and Star appear out of the cage and enjoyed taking it in turns to stroke them.

Finally we finished the topic with a very lucky visit from PC Coppard the local community officer for school visits for South Cambs area. He gave a wonderful talk to the children



which gave them a super insight into the job he does and we were also very lucky in the fact that he brought the Police car into the school car park and we were able to go and see it, sit in it and make the the sirens go.



Papworth Fete Victoria Sponge Recepe



Ingredients:

- 3 medium eggs weighed in their shells (probably 6oz/170g)
- The weight of the eggs in Butter / Soft Margarine
- · The weight of the eggs in Caster Sugar
- The weight of the eggs in SR Flour
- Raspberry Jam to fill home made / good quality

Method:

- 1. Set oven Gas 4 160C (fan oven) or 180C
- Grease and base line the bottom of 2 20cm/8" sandwich tins
- 3 Cream butter/margarine and sugar
- 4. Beat the eggs then gradually add to the mixture beating well each time
- 5. Sieve the flour and fold into the mixture with a metal spoon
- 6. Divide equally between the 2 tins and bake 25mins in the middle of the oven.
- 7. They are ready when they are golden, shrunk from the sides of the tin and spring back when touched
- 8. Remove from the tins and fill with raspberry jam when cold to avoid jam bleeding into the cake
- 9. A light dusting of caster sugar on the top will finish it


