Council Elections

As you will be aware, the Council Elections took place on 3rd May across England.

Parish Council elections were also due to be held, but in Papworth, as in many parishes across Cambridgeshire, the elections were uncontested and did not go to ballot due to insufficient candidates coming forward.

The Parish Council welcomes one new Councillor to its' ranks – Adam Honeywood, and says goodbye to Bob Baker, a past chairman of the Council, who has stepped down after many years of service. We would like to express our thanks to Bob for the valuable contribution he has made to the Council and the village.

There will be more about our Councillors in next month's News & Views!

The Parish Council currently has 9 Councillors – with vacancies for 4 more to bring us up to the full complement of 13. The vacancies will be advertised on the village notice board in the coming weeks.

Village Sign

Work on the new village sign is progressing nicely. The manufacturers are now in the process of hand painting the sign. We'll let you know more once it is finished and we have a date for it to be installed.

Village Hall Car Park Works

Work will be taking place over the summer to make some improvements to the accessibility of the North Hall for wheelchair users and to provide dedicated disabled parking bays along the side of the Hall. It is anticipated that the works will take 2 to 3 weeks to complete and during this time it is likely that the car park will have to be closed to users of the Village Hall, or will have only limited access. Dates for the work to commence are still to be confirmed but will be publicised on the Parish Council's website and via social media.

Annual Parish Meeting

The Parish Council will be holding its Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 23rd May at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. The meeting is open to all residents of the Village and is a chance to hear what the Parish Council has been up to over the last year and for electors to have their say on anything which they consider is important to the people of the parish. We hope to see you there!

Planning: The Ridgeway application

Readers of this section of the News & Views will recall that a planning application by Bloor Homes for 215 new dwellings on a site in the open countryside on the north-east edge of the village, overlooking open countryside was refused by South Cambridgeshire District Council's (SCDC's) Planning Committee in 2017. However, in March, the developer lodged an appeal with the Government's Planning Inspectorate against the refusal. Although a planning inspector has not yet formally started the appeals process, SCDC have appointed an independent planning consultancy to represent them in the appeal. The planning consultant is currently investigating the site and preparing the SCDC case for upholding the refusal of planning permission. The parish council's planning committee will also be submitting written evidence and may appear at the appeal hearing. It will take at least several weeks to get to the appeal hearing and several weeks more before the inspector comes to a decision. (If the new South Cambridgeshire Local Plan which is also being considered by a planning inspector at present – is approved and published before the Ridgeway appeal is complete, it could be that no development on Ridgeway could take place, because Ridgeway is not included as a development site in that Plan).

The parish council has recently become aware, from documents submitted to SCDC, that Bloor Homes now intends to submit a new planning application at the same site for 175 houses (i.e. 40 fewer than the application that has gone to appeal). We are not sure of the developer's reasons for making a new, smaller application at this time, but clearly it will muddy the waters and the parish council and residents will at some stage be asked by the district council to respond with further comments on the new proposals. (Any new application will not affect the progress of the original application through the planning appeal process).

Apparently Spring is here, so I hope you have been able to enjoy the few days of sunny weather that made an appearance in between the showers!

As many of you will be aware, the Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) has been consulting on

whether there should be a Park and Ride near junction 11 of the M11. Many Harston residents were concerned about the plans so last month, I attended the GCP's consultation event in Harston along with many residents, the Parish Council and local councillors.

The GCP tried to reassure everyone that the proposed P&R would not add to traffic congestion through Harston. Because there will be even greater growth on the Addenbrooke's biomedical campus the GCP understandably want to discourage M11 traffic from driving towards the City centre.

Since the meeting, I have spoken with local county councillors Kevin Cuffley and Roger Hickford and at length with the GCP's Chief Executive and Director of Transport. Although everyone recognises the enormous employment growth coming to the campus, I believe Harston residents need more data to be persuaded by the "no increased traffic through Harston" argument.

I was therefore extremely pleased by the GCP Executive Board's subsequent decision to request further analysis be undertaken and opinion sought before the project is brought back to committee for a decision. I will continue to work closely with the GCP, local councillors and the Mayor to ensure ALL options are looked at, and the best solution identified. We must find a solution that deals with City congestion, but not at the expense of our villages. If we can help Harston with their already well understood congestion at the same time, then even better.

South Cambridgeshire continues to play a leading role in all things Brexit. This was recognised recently when Parliament's Exiting the European Union Select Committee came to Cambridge to hear evidence from local stakeholders on the implications of Brexit for the science and research sector. I was pleased to able to attend the session as the Committee has an important role in examining the UK's continued involvement in EU-wide agencies and collaborative projects, access to research funding post-

Brexit, and potential changes to the general regulatory environment.

We have a wealth of experience on these topics and I am pleased that local stakeholders, such as Cambridge University, Astra Zeneca and Cancer Research UK were invited to participate.

Last month saw the consultation on the proposed closure of Cambridge Magistrates' Court come to an end. The proposal would see non-custodial work

transferred to Cambridge County Court and custodial work transferred to either Huntingdon, Peterborough or, in some cases, Cambridge Crown Court.

I have been concerned about the lack of clear information surrounding the number of cases which would remain in Cambridge, how it would be decided which cases would be transferred out of Cambridge, the cost and appropriateness of using Cambridge County Court for Magistrates' Court work, and importantly, how the needs of the most vulnerable court users would be met.

The Ministry of Justice's plans lacked information about exactly what the closure of Cambridge Magistrates' Court might mean for my constituents so I wrote to the Ministry of Justice to seek more detailed information. Sadly, the information received has not diminished my concerns and I feel the consultation has been a missed opportunity to explain the plans with clarity.

These concerns were echoed at a meeting I had last month with our Police Crime Commissioner, Jason Ablewhite so I hope the Ministry will rethink their plans.

The review will look at how road safety can be improved for all road users as well as looking at ways to boost walking and cycling.

Here is South Cambridgeshire, we know the benefits of walking and cycling so this consultation really is welcome. We kicked off in early April with our monthly luncheon and this time around 20 members enjoyed a scrumptious meal at The King of the Belgians in Hartford. As you can see from the pictures below - nobody went hungry!

Monthly Meeting: Following the normal business, we were given a most fascinating and interesting talk by Paul Browning on the history and making of wigs. Paul brought along many samples of wigs, both men and women's, in various colours and styles, and explained in detail how they were made in Germany (not from real hair) for his many clients. He went on to say that he had people from all walks of life, not necessarily those whose hair was thinning, or lost, but business people who wanted to look well groomed every day for work and these people often had 2 or 3 different colours and styles. The wigs can cost anything from a couple of hundred pounds up to and above a couple of thousand!

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT: 70TH ANNIVERSARY **RUTH HURST 91 YEARS YOUNG CELEBRATES 70** YEARS as a member of the National Federation of Women's Institutes

Ruth was born on 17th October 1926 and grew up in Waltham Abbey, Essex. As a young woman Ruth worked locally and recalls the time when, during the second world war, she was walking to work wearing her tin helmet when shrapnel landed on her head. A narrow escape for sure.

Ruth married Norman, a Horticulturalist, in April 1946 and moved to Upshire in Essex. She joined the Upshire Women's Institute in 1948 following a knock on her front door by a District Nurse and Lady Eva Buxton – her neighbours – who invited her along to a meeting. In those days, Ruth explains, the WI was so very different from today with members being mostly typical country ladies who cycled to the Village Hall for the meetings. Ruth was lucky enough to have a car! along with one other member, and was therefore always on call to pick other ladies up and take them to the various meetings. She described the experience for the ladies as 'taking them to places they had never been before' as they were rarely able to leave the village due to lack of transport – our Ruth put an end to all that!! During her time at Upshire Ruth was President of her Institute on more than one occasion. They used to travel around to other WIs within what was called 'The Cripsy Group' and share ideas and crafts. Upshire WI was formed in 1927 under the Presidency of a Mrs P Howell with 23 members. Sadly it closed in 1994.




