Papworth Surgery Flu Vaccination Notice

The nights are drawing in, it's getting colder and we're

starting to think about Christmas.....and the FLU JAB!

For most healthy people, influenza is an unpleasant but usually self-limiting disease. However, children, older people, pregnant women and those with underlying disease are at particular risk of severe illness if they catch it.

Vaccination is the MOST Effective Way to prevent influenza

If you think you fall into one of the categories above, please contact the surgery for an appointment. We can also vaccinate your child if they are aged 2, 3 or 4 (i.e born on or after 1 September 2014 and on or before 31 August 2016)..., although if your 4 year old is already at school they will be vaccinated there with the older children.

If you're not sure whether or not you are entitled to a flu jab, just contact one of our nurses at the surgery to check.

Papworth Surgery is holding two Saturday Flu Clinics on the following dates:

Saturday 13th October and Saturday 27th October and we are taking bookings now!

We will also have Flu Clinics available during the week, just ask at reception.



A vaccine to prevent shingles, a common painful skin disease may also be available on the NHS to people in their 70's. Please ask if you think you may be eligible and if you would like this at the same time as the flu jab.

Pneumococcal Disease

The pneumococcal vaccine protects against serious and potentially fatal pneumococcal infections. You may be eligible for this vaccination at the same time as the flu jab if you are an adult aged 65 and over, or a child/adult with certain long-term health conditions.

Please ask if you would like this at the same time as your flu jab or need to find out if you are eligible.

Playing Field

Work is due to start in the second week of October to install metal posts around the perimeter of the Playing Field to prevent any future illegal encampments. We will then be able to have the concrete blocks removed.

Dog Mess

The football season is well underway and although the amount of dog mess on the field has decreased thanks to people keeping their dogs on leads and being more vigilant, it is still necessary for the officials to do a sweep of the field and remove dog mess to ensure it is clean before each match.

With many dedicated dog waste bins around the playing field and throughout village, there is no excuse to leave dog mess on the field, paths and open spaces. If you can't find a dog bin, bag your pet's mess, seal it well and it can be carefully placed in a standard litter bin – or take it home for disposal. It is the responsibility of the dog owner or the person in charge of a dog to clear up any mess left by the dog as soon as it has fouled - being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse!

Planning

The Local Plan for South Cambridgeshire was adopted by South Cambridgeshire District Council on Thursday September 27th, having been approved by the Government Inspectors earlier in the month. Adoption of the Local Plan means South Cambs District Council will now use the plan as the cornerstone in all planning decisions made for the area. It contains the key housing sites the council will be expecting to see developed over the coming years.

The Parish Council's Planning Committee has received notification that the application by Bloor Homes for 175 houses on land to the East of Old Pinewood and Ridgeway (S/1783/18/OL) has been refused by the South Cambs District Council. In addition, Bloor's appeal against the planning permission refusal for their original application for 215 houses off Ridgeway (S/2647/15/OL) has also been withdrawn.

Many thanks to all the parishioners who submitted letters of objection or worked with the Parish Council to robustly defend against the applications.

At the Parish Council's Planning Committee meeting in September, an application for additional units to be built on the site of the former hospital car park behind the DHL building on Sterling Way was recommended for approval.

The Committee also recommended for approval, plans to increase parking at the Caxton Gibbet services. The scheme would provide additional car park space behind the existing Subway and Broccoli buildings with the exit from the car park being re-routed out via the small access road and out onto the A1198 to the south of the site, with traffic entering the car park via the existing entrance.

Papworth Everard Village Design Statement

Papworth Everard is fortunate to have been selected as one of six South Cambridgeshire village for which a Village Design Statement (VDS) is to be prepared, with the support of South Cambs District Council and funding from central Government

The Design Statement will identify both good and bad design in the appearance of current village buildings and will set some guidelines for any new developments in Papworth Everard (e.g. the redevelopment of the Royal Papworth Hospital site, after it moves to Cambridge early next year).

The Parish Council, South Cambs District Council and the independent consultant tasked with consulting the village and preparing the document are seeking a wide range of views from village residents. This is an invitation for you to join a Steering Committee that will be meeting to provide those views for incorporating into the VDS. The commitment will be relatively short-term as it is intended to issue a draft document before Christmas. It will mean attending a couple of 'workshops' in the village and a one day 'study tour', to visit recent developments in other places, which might help to focus views on what should happen in Papworth.

As the eyes and ears of the Parish Council, each Tree Warden decides on their level of involvement, areas of interest and what is useful to their neighbourhood.

The Tree Warden scheme run by South Cambridgeshire District Council gives people opportunities to:

- Champion their local trees and woods
- Survey trees and gather information about them
- Provide early warning of threats, disease, decay or vandalism
- · Plant and care for trees
- Carry out woodland management
- Involve their neighbours in tree projects
- Get together with like-minded people for training and field trips
- Spearhead council initiatives such as its hedge tree campaign to reverse the decline of trees and hedges.

Training events are held three times a year at different parish locations and will cover topics which will be tailored to the needs of parishes in South Cambs.

The first event will be held in November 2018 followed by events in March and July 2019

Nigel di Castiglione Team Rector How time flies!

After a long and hot summer, we are in the season village shows, Harvest festivals and suppers. I am thinking of rotas for January to April! That's right – it's the nature of church life these days as resources have to be spread ever more thinly; we have to keep ahead of the calendar to ensure we get the support we need from colleagues to fulfil our regular patterns of ministry.

Before then we have Remembrance and, of course, the Christmas season. This will be a particularly important Remembrance Sunday as 2018 marks the 100th anniversary of the formal end to World War 1, and it falls on a Sunday. This year we are having our Village Remembrance Service in the Village Hall; why don't you plan to join us?

Remembrance is not just about looking back to wars that occurred before many of us were born. These days recruits to the armed services have to face up to the real prospect they may be called on to go into cauldrons of conflict; many of us were seared by the sight of so many service people bring brought home having been killed in Iraq with sombre parades to honour them as they were driven through Wootton Bassett.

The early months of 2019 are likely to be another defining time in the history of our nation as the Brexit deadline approaches and we still don't know on what terms any deal will settle.

Sometimes I wish, wouldn't it be good to stop the clock and take stock for a few weeks before we hurtle into the next onslaught of busyness? It isn't about to happen. As a Christian, however, I know God invites me to be still before Him (Psalm 46v10); and Jesus clearly had a discipline of getting alone to pray on a regular basis. He doesn't stop the clock ticking but allows us to recalibrate, be refreshed and refocussed in his presence, in readiness for all we have to face or deal with.

This is one of the benefits the church adds to many villages I serve and perhaps close to where you live: in Papworth Everard St Peter's church is open every day – so that you (with me) can find space away from other demands to have time with God. Tell yourself you are welcome, because you are! Make a visit and in your prayers include one from Samuel who, having been pointed in the right direction said to God: "Speak for your servant is listening."

You won't be ignored or disappointed!








Magic Mushrooms

With temperatures dropping and the nights closing in, for me October signals the start of a steady decline into winter. After a beautifully warm summer it is easy to be pessimistic about the changing of the seasons, which is why it is important to savour all the highlights of autumn. One of my favourites is the abundance of colourful and quirky fungi currently adorning our woodlands. Ask most people to think of a woodland fungus, and they will probably imagine a fairytale-style toadstool sitting nestled on the forest floor, or perhaps an earthy-coloured mushroom perched on a tree trunk like a sturdy bracket.



But the mushroom is only the fruiting body of a fungus, like a flower on a plant, and the fungus itself is far more extensive than what you can see above-ground. Beneath that archetypal mushroom, a complex network of tiny branches, called hyphae, stretch far underground tapping into the soil to derive nutrients like phosphorus and nitrogen which allow the fungus to grow. Sometimes these branches gather in such numbers that they are

visible to the naked eye, forming cobweb-like clusters called mycelia.

Fungi form a taxonomic kingdom of their own, which is, surprisingly, more closely related to animals than plants. And while their effect on the planet may not be as immediately clear as that of animals and plants, they are absolutely vital to healthy, functioning ecosystems. Fungi are one of the main decomposers in forests, using enzymes produced by their hyphae to break down leaf litter and dead wood, from which they absorb nutrients essential for their growth.

Fungi also play an important role in ecosystems by forming relationships with other organisms. A mycorrhiza is a symbiotic association between a fungus and the roots of a plant, meaning that both parties benefit from their partnership. The fungus' hyphae extend the underground network of the tree's roots, allowing the tree to absorb more water and nutrients from the soil, and in return the fungus receives a source of carbon produced by the tree during photosynthesis.

Similarly, fungi form mutualistic relationships with algae and cyanobacteria (photobionts), which result in lichens. Since there are so many species of fungi and photobionts, there are a seemingly endless number of fascinating lichen forms, many of which can be seen and appreciated growing on rocks and trees in our local woods.



Away from the important woodland ecosystem services that fungi provide, they have a massive impact on human life. In fact, innovative uses of fungi have changed the face of modern medicine. A number of antibiotics are derived from species of fungus, including the widely used penicillin. And if the not-so-humble fungus' life-saving properties haven't convinced you that they are truly marvellous, just remember that yeast is a type of fungus for which anyone who enjoys a crusty loaf or a cheeky tipple should be very grateful.

The service will offer....


- GP appointments routine only
