The Papworth Everard Parish Council is responsible for the upkeep of many village facilities, including:


- o The playing fields and the main children's play area and paddling pool

Nigel di Castiglione Team Rector 'Follow the Star'

This is a phrase headlining the Church of England's publicity for Christmas 2018, but it's a use of words that resonates in different ways to different people.

In the narratives about the birth of Jesus the 'star' was the external sign that persuaded some eastern scientists God was doing something new that should be explored rather than kept at arms-length. They made a long journey, overcome various obstacles and

got to meet the baby Jesus. The star was their invitation to take notice, come close, be welcomed and offer their worship. They have never been forgotten.

Many will look at who is 'the star' in choosing a pantomime or a show as one of the activities of their Christmas celebrations this year; it is easy for us to be caught up with celebrity, have a good time and then for it all to recede into little more than a memory.

As an adult entering his brief but momentous public life, Jesus said frequently 'Follow me'. Those who did found their lives turned upside down; they became the small group described as turning the world upside down, with God's help.

My question as we approach the end of another year is whether we want to be known for having made some nice memories – and that is important – or as individuals, groups, communities and a nation who, with God's help, make a difference that becomes a world-changing legacy. I believe this is at the core of being a devoted follower of Jesus today.

This is not a plea per se for more people to come to church services. Of course, we would welcome that and believe it is an important expression of faith – you will find details in this magazine of what is on offer locally to you in the next few weeks. Of greater interest to me is the vision for more people personally and collectively making a difference for the common good in all the arenas and contexts of our lives; a difference that will last far beyond the horizon of our own lives.

Fundamentally that's what Jesus did and offers; he invites us to live connected to God and to be the means of the culture of heaven invading the world we live in now

Meanwhile be assured of my prayers for a happy festive season and that you find more of God's favour throughout 2019.



The children and families of Pendragon Primary have been thinking about other children and families this term.

Our harvest collection resulted in a great collection for the Godmanchester food bank. We talked in assembly about Remembrance and supported the Royal British Legion poppy appeal.

Well done to the whole school (including Foundation Stage), -you could hear a pin drop! All the children contributed towards a display remembering the First World War dead from Papworth and the Year 6 children presented facts to help us all realise how big the numbers 11,000 and 16

million are (the numbers of people who died on the last day of the First world war and the average total war dead between 1914 and 1918. I have not yet been told how much was raised by the children from the Poppy collection but they did have to refill our box during the week! We have welcomed 53 children into Foundation stage this year.

Looking at them practising their production of Santa's Hat, it is hard to believe that they only started school in September.

Year 1 visited Duxford as part of their 'Up, up and away project' – a lovely sunny day with lots of aircraft on the ground and in the sky for the children to look at.





Year 2 enjoyed a visit from Florence Nightingale to tell all about her time in the Crimea. This was part of their Heroes topic.

Year 3 have been busy learning about Ancient Egypt; this week they have made their own cartouches with their own names on.

Year 4 visited the American War cemetery at Madingley as part of their study of the effects of the Second World War in our local area. We were thrilled to receive the following email:

"I just wanted to compliment you on how bright and enquiring the Pendragon children were. They are pretty young to be battling with some of the concepts that they encountered at the cemetery, but managed brilliantly. I am sure that this was testament to the preparation that had gone on at school prior to the visit.

It was noticeable, that by the afternoon session, they had really taken on board the themes that we were all trying to put across; making links right back to the introduction – good work.

They were delightfully 'tiggerish', which is how one would expect children of that age to be. It was a wonderful to host such enthusiastic and well behaved students at the cemetery.

We hope that you will be able to come back again next year as it was a pleasure to be visited by Pendragon Y4's in 2018."

It really doesn't seem possible that we have reached November – where has this year gone!? Don't even tell me how many days there are until Christmas!! October was a very busy month and as my newsletter can only ever provide a snap shot of my

Over the last month, I have uploaded information about Brexit, local infrastructure projects and a range of news articles, including my speech in the Budget debate about Universal Credit. You can also hear my recent questions to the Prime Minister about Brexit and also sleep-in shifts in the care sector.

As you will know from my last newsletter, I held a public meeting to discuss the state of play regarding Brexit. More than 150 constituents attended, making for a lively and passionate discussion. This type of engagement away from the Westminster bubble is invaluable for me as it helps to ensure I do my very best to represent you. Whatever your views on Brexit, it is important for me to know what you are thinking. As the negotiations with the EU reach their inevitable conclusion, I will let you know about any further meetings I plan to hold.

Over the last month, I have been working hard to ensure the future of the Whippet X3 Papworth bus service. The service was originally due to stop this month, but through a joint effort with the District Council and our Mayor, it was possible for funding to be put in place to keep the service running until the end of March. This will 'bridge the gap' until some proposed changes to bus services, due to be in place from April 2019 are finalised. I will continue to work to provide a long-term sustainable future for this service as it is a lifeline for Papworth.

I am pleased to report that the Health and Social Care Secretary, Matt Hancock accepted my invitation to visit South Cambridgeshire. He began his day with a trip to CMR Surgical Limited (pictured) who are based on Madingley Road. Their development of surgical robotics will transform how surgery is carried out in hospitals all over the world, its real ground breaking stuff. Matt also visited Addenbrooke's Hospital, the Genome Campus and Granta Medical Practice in Sawston where he heard about their innovative plans to radically improve how primary care is delivered. It is fair to say Matt went home very impressed with our constituency! #proud

Digital connectivity is vital to all of our local businesses. The Government's Gigabit Voucher Scheme is offering small and medium sized businesses vouchers of up to £3000 to cover the cost of installing Gigabit-capable broadband.

Businesses can claim against the cost of connection either individually or as part of a group. Residents can also benefit from the scheme as part of a group project which includes businesses, and can claim a voucher of up to £500.

One gigabit is the same as 1,000 megabits – so it's a big leap forward in connection speeds that could benefit your business into the future.
