# Increased emergency services presence at old Royal Papworth site



Earlier this month, Royal Papworth Hospital closed its Papworth Everard site to patients and visitors as part of its move to the Cambridge Biomedical Campus.

Decommissioning work is now under way on the Trust's old buildings, lasting through until the summer, prior to handing over the site to a future buyer.

During this time, Royal Papworth will be working with other public sector organisations such as Cambridgeshire Constabulary and Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service to allow them to undertake training exercises on the site.

Therefore, residents and workers in Papworth village should not be alarmed or concerned by the increased presence of blue light vehicles and emergency services in the area.

The activity will mainly be throughout the evenings, but the site will also be used on occasion in the day, both in the week and at weekends.

### **Annual Meeting of the Parish Council**

### The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 8th May.

At this meeting Cllr Paul Phillips, who has been Chairman of the Parish Council for many years, stepped down from the position. Cllr Pete Cruse was voted in as the new Chairman of the Parish Council for the coming year. Paul Phillips will act as Vice Chairman.

There were also changes to the chairmen of some of the Committees as Cllr Pete Cruse stepped down as Chair of the Planning Committee to be replaced by Cllr Chris Howlett.

Chris in turn stepped down as Chair of the Village Hall Committee, to be replaced by Cllr Victoria Carter.

Sadly, Cllr Adam Honeywood has stepped down from the Parish Council due to work commitments. We would like to thank Adam for his valuable contribution to the work of the Parish Council over the past year.

### **Annual Parish Meeting**

A big thank you to everyone who came along to the Annual Parish Meeting held in the Village Hall on Wednesday 22nd May. The meeting was open to all residents of the Village and was a chance to hear what the Parish Council had been doing over the past year, their plans for the coming year and to raise any questions they may have.

After the formalities of the meeting, written reports from the outgoing Chairman, Committees and District Councillor Nick Wright were made available and the Clerk presented a financial summary.

This was followed by a Q&A session, with plenty of questions being raised – particularly in relation to the Hospital's move, the future of the site and derelict buildings in the village.

Following the meeting, refreshments were served and attendees were able to chat with the Parish and District Councillors present.

We even spoke to one of the attendees who expressed their

interest in becoming a Parish Councillor!

### Tales from the farm this summer

RSPB Hope Farm sits between Elsworth and Knapwell, about 450 acres in size, managed with the aim of demonstrating wildlife-friendly farming. At the moment, it is full of birds singing, bees buzzing, and flowers bursting into bloom. For those who walk along the footpaths, you will know how the wheat, barley, oilseed rape, and beans are shooting up with the sun and welcomed occasional rain. As well as these crops, though, the farm is one of the most exciting places to be to watch wildlife.

Breeding farmland birds are in full swing, with our thirteen starling broods hatching 44 chicks this spring across the farm. They have been foraging on the green pastures around the farm and even as far as Elsworth to feed their chicks, with an incredible 40 chicks fledging and now joining the ever-increasing flock. To add to the list of new arrivals are a few broods of lapwing that you can see with an eagle eye from the tracks and footpathcs. They will fly with a signatory pee-wit to distract any predators from the precious chicks. Whilst they shouldn't be disturbed, do keep an ear and eye out to see if you can spot them! For the lapwings, it is important to provide insect food in a-plenty. Our wildflower margins are fantastic for providing a home for bugs that in turn give these species every opportunity to breed on the farm. Nothing has been quite as special as finding these chicks in the middle of our field, having hatched a couple of days previously.

The birds are always fantastic to hear and see out on the farm, but the flowers are what fill farmland with colour at this time of year. Last month saw the start of flowering season with cowslips decorating our wildflower and grass margins. Next were the clovers and now the oxeye daisies bursting

into bloom. Every week, a new colour is added to the mix that will provide a different kind of food resource for the bees across the farm that will in turn pollinate our crops. With these kind of habitats in place, it is much easier to work with wildlife, look after the ecosystem, and aside from helping us to enjoy a more exciting place to work on the farm, they help us to grow crops as well.

# Nigel di Castiglione - Team Rector Never Give Up

Many sports commentators are (rightly) loud in their praise of two outstanding football teams in the season just ended. Much of what is being said and written is about the way the managers of the two leading clubs have built successful teams – people playing well together with a strong connection to the whole squad and all the backroom staff. As Liverpool overcame seemingly impossible odds to win against Barcelona one of the slogans caught by cameras on

a shirt of a player side-lined through injury said:"Never Give Up". He was playing a part in the dugout for teammates and the watching crowds.

It is a good metaphor for finding new and renewed success in what we do. God invites us into his team, gives clear instructions and sends us out to press home our advantages and opportunities; whilst on the pitch it is down to us how we play. The complexity of it all is that many of us are invited to play on more than one pitch whilst always under the direction of the one divine coach – at home, in work or business, through our hobbies and wider interests. There is no time to get bored!

What we do as the local church goes far beyond the important contributions of those who attend services on Sundays and serve on our PCCs. For example (as we struggle to keep lawns mown at home) there are many volunteers who play their part ensuring our churchyards are presentable, our buildings cleaned, and an array of practical tasks done with care and faithfulness. Thank you for being part of the team! Nevertheless, there are moments when many of us feel like giving up. That we don't or won't can be an expression of grit and determination but - equally - a reflection of the nature of God built into our DNA, shining through and refusing to be silenced.

Christians believe nothing is impossible when we draw God into our frame of reference and perspective. This was the message the Angel gave to Mary when she queried how she would become pregnant whilst a chaste and unmarried woman, how water was turned into wine and a young child's picnic was multiplied to feed thousands of hungry people. It is why we still pray for sick people to be healed when the medics have given up, and why miracles of financial provision and reconciliation in broken relationships are part of our worldview.

This is where the value of community and family are vital. Many of us have become accustomed to assuming how we fare or fail in life is solely down to how we manage our own affairs. Our culture has adopted an over-zealous individualistic outlook; whereas what renews determination, reignites the spark of hope and unlocks the input we need is often the gift of a helping hand, a word of encouragement, the knowledge there is someone we can talk with and find wisdom from.

When Jesus ascended to heaven after his resurrection, he did not abandon his followers. He sent Holy Spirit as the new Coach and to connect us with all the backroom staff. The small band of disciples became a global force and fellowship. There is ongoing invitation where God still says: "Never Give Up!" and is willing to draw any who ask into his team.

### **News from Pendragon School**

The last week of this half term has been one of the busiest in years. We had our Architect, Engineers and designers week, which coincided with the visit of the Life education bus and ended with the School council playground fair. Mrs Brown badgered the parents in school to find links to anyone who could come into school to talk to the children and inspire them with the careers that are out there in the world of architecture, engineering and design. We had talks about F1 racing, Space travel to café design and the A14 development. As part of our PSHCE curriculum, the Life bus visits school every 2 years. The life skills sessions are delivered in a mobile classroom driven into school grounds. Coram Life Education takes a three-strand approach addressing children's knowledge, skills and attitudes, and the programmes are aligned with the National Curriculum covering all Key Stages.

Coram Life Education helps schools meet their statutory requirements for children's Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural development, and Ofsted inspection criteria for personal development, behaviour and welfare.

Children's experience of Coram Life Education's sessions was fun, engaging

and memorable. Children met Harold the Giraffe puppet ('Healthy Harold'), and friends, had discussions and watched short films about healthy eating. legal and illegal drugs and their effects, the body and how it works, friendships and their influence, and how choices and behaviours can affect dreams and aspirations. In addition, all parents were given an opportunity to come long and experience part of the lessons the children were given.

Finally on the last day of term the School council ran their playground fair. Each class in school had decided what they wanted to do to raise money to spend on playground equipment. We have had games- what is in the box to toy stalls. A great way for the children to practice their real money skills, spending and counting the money for their stalls. Next term, the school councilors will decide what to spend their money on. The children are keen to set up a quiet area so we will look to see what to buy. The final total is not vet in but it looks like over £700 was raised- well done School Councilors!.



# The Howlett Family connection to Papworth Hospital over 70 years



With the very recent move of the hospital from the village to its new site on the Cambridge Biomedical Campus I'm sure a lot of villagers are reflecting on how it has affected their lives over the years. My family would not even exist if it hadn't been for Papworth Hospital, and my family tree over the last 70 years is littered with several 'hospital romances'.

My father Frank Howlett (born and brought up in Cambridge) trained as a lab technician at the University Veterinary School and came to join the lab at the hospital in late 1949. He came as a bacteriologist but became involved in the Haematology Department, eventually becoming Senior Chief Medical Laboratory Scientific Officer. He was also in charge of equipping and staffing the labs at the new Hinchingbrooke Hospital before he retired from Papworth in March 1986.

My mother Pamela (nee Fiddy) came to Papworth as a nurse. She came from Norwich and arrived via training at Addenbrookes and Wisbech Hospitals. She remembered living in St Peters Nurses Home and at the Old Rectory. She worked in various wards and for a time was Theatre Sister when there was only one theatre and that only operated three days a week. She could remember when the pioneering cardiothoracic surgeon Christopher Parish started at Papworth, on his first day he appeared in a morning suit with pin-striped trousers! After having children, she returned to work part time for a few years in the CSSD and X-Ray departments.

Another nurse, Lily Armitage (later Long) set Frank and Pamela up on what would now be called a 'blind date', for Matron Robinson's Annual Hospital ball held in the Village Hall. They married in January 1953 and settled in the village.

My older brother Christopher was born in 1955. During Uni holidays and for a 'gap' year in 1977-78 he acted as an assistant in Theatres. He particularly remembers working with Mr Parish, Mr Milstein, Mr English and Dr Bethune. He was also on the receiving end of Papworth's care when he had a heart valve replaced in 1979 by (now Sir) Terence English. During his time at the hospital he met and later

married Sharon (nee Marsh), a nurse working on Baron and 'top-floor' Princess Wards.

I was born in 1957 and have been working as a Theatre Porter since October 2015. (I am not making the move to Cambridge with the hospital). Both my children have been employed at the hospital in the past. Anneka spent a short while as a domestic, and Jason worked as a Kitchen Porter for 2 years during his late teens.

My sister Rachel was born in 1961. After nursing training at Addenbrookes she worked at Papworth for 2 years from summer 1982-84. She remembers getting to know Keith Castle, the first successful heart transplant patient. Once when he was an in-patient for a while, he loaned her his car so she and some other nurses could go on a jaunt to the sea-side! While working at Papworth she met her future husband, Russell Grice, who was employed as an X-Ray porter and then an Operating Department Orderly. They married in 1986.

My nephew Thomas, Chris and Sharon's son, was coincidentally born in the same week that his grandfather Frank retired from Papworth in 1986. When he was 16, Thomas started work at the hospital as a domestic, then moved to Theatres as a Health Care Support Worker. He moved on to do Operating Dept Practitioner training, and later became part of the Clinical Training/Resuscitation Team. He returned to Theatres and last year qualified as a Physician's Assistant in Anaesthesia. On May 25th 2018 he married Charlotte Mann, a Cardiac Physiologist at the hospital. They have recently moved to Sawston so they can continue their careers at the new site.

So, the Howlett family's relationship with Royal Papworth Hospital continues, can any other family claim more connections?

# PAPWORTH EVERARD ALLOTMENT ASSOCIATION



I read that once, somewhere, I'm not sure where but I think I can understand what it's meaning is – a drop of rain and some warm June weather is what we need to get things growing – but not too much! April was a fairly dry month so we were glad of a drop of rain on the allotments in May. With midsummer's eve not far off things are beginning to show well on a number of plots. It's a very busy time of year for us all and some of the fruits of all that effort are beginning to show. Hopefully by the time of printing strawberries should be coming through. I notice on a number of plots people have replanted new plants. It's often recommended to replace strawberry plants every 5 years or so. It means that crops may be a little lower initially but should increase in the long run. Wandering around the site I've seen a number of asparagus plots that seem to be producing nicely. You need to have a bit of patience with asparagus, avoiding cropping in the first year and taking only a little in the second year. This gives the plants time to establish. Yes, it takes time but the end product is well worth the wait! I've also seen some nice globe artichokes starting to fruit. You see it's not all 'tater's and onions on the allotments!

May was plagued a bit by late frosts. I'd been tempted to put my tomato's out, but fortunately held off doing so. I spoke to another allotment holder who had lost a number of tomato and pepper plants to unexpected frosts. It can be worth keeping an eye on the weather reports.

The weather also put on hold our planned working day back in April, but others are planned for the future. I would ask all allotment holders to look out for e-mails letting us know when the next maintenance day is and, if possible, to lend a hand. It's important that we all try to play a part in keeping the site tidy – and of course to keep our own plots as tidy and weed free as possible.

For anyone that's interested in giving it a go there are still some plots available, just contact the PEAA. We'll be glad to hear from you. Yes, it does take time and commitment and some hard work but the results are worth it!

personal experience of dealing with the estates, wills and PoAs for his own family members. His own mother suffered with Alzheimers and we are delighted that his "fees" will be passed on to Alzheimers UK. Despite the negative nature of this kind of planning, Keyth assured us that we would feel a sense of relief when we had put plans in place.

His talk gave us an overview and basic advice and covered the problem of the fact that with rising house values, probate costs have been increasing year on year. He illustrated the differing probate fees depending where properties are located and other factors which can cause fees to escalate.

He encouraged us all to make sure we had up-to-date Wills and gave advice as to who to appoint as Executors. Will writing is unregulated and he related some warnings where fraudsters had stripped assets from an estate and related some stories of contested Wills such as Prince Rogers Wilson whose estate of \$100 plus \$200 in unpublished music attracted 700 claims and advised us to be like David Bowie who had an excellent Will and probate easily obtained. His talk also covered Inheritance Tax, Sideways inheritance, and ownership of a property, Care Home costs, Gifts made before death, and funeral planning. All serious subjects but Keyth put it over in a very interesting way with excellent slides and examples.

Members have also been asked to vote for the Resolution which they would like the Federation of Women's Institutes to take forward from the short list of two: Don't Fear the Smear and Call Against the Decline in Local Bus Services. Both are important issues and it will be interesting to see which gets the top vote. Whichever it may be, I am sure both issues will be progressed further.

Other activities in May included some of our members attending the Centenary Annual Council meeting at which Baroness Foella Benjamin was the speaker and our monthly lunch which was held at the Three Horseshoes in Gravely where members enjoyed chatting as we relaxed over our lunches.
