New Cycle Path between Papworth Everard and Caxton Gibbett

Confirmation has been received from the County Council Officers that the proposed pathway between Papworth Everard and Caxton Gibbett has been given approval.

As well as accommodating a path of sufficient width (likely to be 2.5 metres in width) there are a couple of culverts that need rebuilding and extending. The road will also benefit from getting a kerb along its length which helps with drainage and protecting the grass verge.

We have funding from Highways England 'Designated Funds' and from 'Integrated Transport Block' which is funding from Department for Transport.

To construct the works will entail two way traffic lights which undoubtedly will cause some degree of queueing in the local area.

New Councillors

The Parish Council would like to welcome three new members to its ranks.

At the June Parish Council meeting, Luke Phillips, Mark Hersom and Paul Patching were co-opted to the Parish Council. Each brings their own individual skill set, knowledge and experience to the Parish Council and we look forward to working with them going forward.

The Parish Council currently has 11 Councillors but still has vacancies for 2 more to bring us up to the full complement of 13.

If you have a real interest in the village or are new to the village and want to get more involved why not come and have a chat and see if it's for you?

We're looking for people who can rise to the challenge and make a commitment to improving the quality of life for everybody in our village, no matter what your age or experience.

Knowledge and previous experience aren't essential, training is available and existing members have a wealth of experience they are willing to share. The essential element is enthusiasm and a willingness to work as a member of our team to make a difference to our village.

We hold 11 Parish Council meetings per year and in addition you will be required to become a member of one or more of our subcommittees (Amenities and Playing Fields, Village Hall, Planning) and will be able to get involved in working groups looking at specific projects if you wish.

Being a Tree Warden gives people who feel that trees matter, the opportunity to be involved with trees in their local area.

As the eyes and ears of the Parish Council, each Tree Warden decides on their level of involvement, areas of interest and what is useful to their neighbourhood.

The Tree Warden scheme run by South Cambridgeshire District Council gives people opportunities to:

Champion their local trees and woods

Survey trees and gather information about them

Provide early warning of threats, disease, decay or vandalism

Plant and care for trees

Carry out woodland management

Involve their neighbours in tree projects

Get together with like-minded people for training and field trips

Spearhead council initiatives such as its hedge tree campaign to reverse the decline of trees and hedges.

Training events are held three times a year at different parish locations and will cover topics which will be tailored to the needs of parishes in South Cambs.



Lots of Papworth children attend Elsworth Pre-School as it's a lovely, friendly, small setting looking onto fields and located 5 minutes drive away in the neighbouring village. We have a fantastic weekly newsletter showing all the children's adventures, which you can see on our website www.elsworthpreschool.org.

The Pre-School is particularly popular with parents considering sending their children to Elsworth Church of England Primary School, which has a strong reputation for being a small, caring faith school. As the catchment area is so small Elsworth CoE Primary usually has spaces for Papworth children. The Pre-School is located next to the main school and Pre-School children visit the school frequently to assist with transition, as well as having the older primary school children come and visit the Pre-School to play with them so they have some familiar faces when they start school.

Elsworth Pre-School currently has spaces available from September including 'free' government funded hours for up to 27 hours per week (Pre-School is closed Friday afternoons). Whether we voted 'LEAVE' or 'REMAIN' the perturbing outcomes of the past 3 years are the deep divisions, families and friendship groups fragmented and alarming levels of anger being displayed all over the country. We have found ourselves struggling to disagree without becoming disagreeable.

This is nothing new. The Bible reminds us these sorts of behaviours are as old as the human species. This makes me think the fundamental problems of the age are unlikely to be solved by advances in science and technology. For example, the eruption of d is contributing to our worst behaviours approaching

social media, for all its' good, is contributing to our worst behaviours spreading far more rapidly – on the pressing of a button or the touch of a screen.

When desk-top computers were first becoming commonplace. I could see how these could become a mixed blessing. My response – in days when I had a "proper job", working in a large administrative centre – was to reduce the numbers of technically-transmitted conversations to a minimum by going on 'walkabout'; taking a file to a colleague in another department rather than relying on the internal mailing system and other such strategies. It may not have seemed the best use of time to some, but it did a lot for working relationships, mutual understanding, partnership on matters of joint concern and the like.

We are now in the season of fetes, feast weeks and other similar gatherings. The challenge many face is the number of equally worthy demands for such things happening often at one and the same time. I have to make choices. Therefore, I know the temptation just to throw in a voluntary donation in the hope it salves my conscience about missing the pre-meetings, the practical tasks required in advance and the events themselves. As far as possible, to be there, to listen to one another, to catch up on news and appreciate what others have been dealing with that is probably more important than the nature of the event we happen to be supporting. Let's remember, also, those who are chronically ill or housebound who would love to be engaged in what we may spurn or feel too pressed to engage with.

In all the national uncertainty around, maybe the best response is to make sure we are out and about being together and listening well to what we all have to say. We may discover there is more that unites us than is cause for division; and if we can't say what we have to say charitably and with concern for how it is heard maybe we should hold our piece!



What a difference a day makes!

By Liv Myson, Co-Chair of Friends of Pendragon On Saturday 22nd June, between the hours of 10am and 4pm, over 100 volunteers walked through the gates at Pendragon Primary School - in a bid to "Make a Difference"!

Friends of Pendragon, the charity set up to help enrich the educational experience of the children attending Pendragon Primary School, this year set themselves a couple of extra goals, alongside their fundraising pledges! These goals were to increase community engagement with the school AND to increase the number of volunteers helping out at school. This goal, in conjunction with the School Council wish for coloured fences, gave birth to an idea... a Make a Difference Day.

A sub-committee was created, with Nicki Coles leading, to bring together both a list of jobs that could be done to make the school more aesthetically pleasing (without taking coffers from the school budget) and to bring together volunteers throughout the community.

With amazing leadership and dedication from the sub-committee; groups and individuals were pulled together to come along and volunteer some time for hard labour, on 22nd June. We had representation from 1st Papworth Scouts, who did an amazing job of clearing the Haven (the environmental area), 1st Papworth Cubs, the Women's Institute, Eltisley Garden Services, Papworth Everard Litter Pickers, parents, carers, teachers, staff and residents of Papworth alike.

We were truly blown away by the response to our call to "Make a Difference" – even people who could not attend on the day baked and dropped off snacks and drinks to keep the volunteers going. Those ice lollies were VERY welcomed at 2pm – as it was a scorching day, in the sun!

The achievement on the day was phenomenal. Fences were painted (and there was a LOT of fence to paint); bracken was chopped down; the rear gate was cleared to be usable for the Summer Fete (5th July); an outdoor Table Tennis, awarded by the Aviva fund, was put up; a wildlife pond was uncovered with LOADS of frogs; weeds were pulled up; old fences were removed; large areas of ground were prepared ready for a new Year 1 project; paving was jet washed; bins were cleaned; shelves were erected; existing planters were painted; benches were painted; and new planters were built from donated pallets – and, yup you guessed it...painted!

A huge THANK YOU to everyone who came along to help on the day, helped to plan and organise the day and helped to feed everyone on the day! We shall definitely be doing this again – what an amazing community we have here in Papworth, we should be VERY proud of our community and all we can achieve when we work together!

The Haven, a nature area located to the rear of the school, will provide children the chance to immerse themselves in the natural environment and develop practical skills.




The project was coordinated with Year 4 teacher Mrs Huntley who, over the past three years, has been an advocate for students exploring their environment and learning new outdoor skills.

Well we're now at the height of summer, midsummers day – the longest day has passed but we still have many weeks of light bright evenings ahead of us. So far, the weather has been a bit mixed and rather in contrast to last summer when we struggled with scorching heat and drought conditions. In June we had a number of weeks of very wet weather which allowed our water buts to fill up but made it difficult to get much work done on our patches. Before I launch into my usual monthly constituency update, I thought it important to explain what has happened recently in terms of my own party allegiance. As you will know, I left the Conservative Party in February to sit as an Independent MP because I was concerned the Party

had drifted to the right and it was more concerned with its own survival than the national interest. Early polling results gave us, as Independents, the confidence to formalise into a party structure, named "Change UK" to fight the European elections at the end of May. However it soon became clear that the Brexit Party was storming ahead. Believing passionately that the National interest must always come first, and that Nigel Farage did not have the right answers for the country's future, I felt our support should shift to other Remain parties who were faring better than us in the polls.

I was unable to convince a majority of Change UK MPs of this strategy and they remained steadfastly of the opinion that the party should seek to achieve as many votes for itself rather than collaborate with other parties

Now the European elections are over, I remain unwavering in my strong belief that the country must always come first. As such, I have stepped down from Change UK and returned to sit once again as an Independent with four other colleagues – Sarah Wollaston, Luciana Berger, Angela Smith and Gavin Shuker.

There are two principal reasons as to why I have done this.

I do not believe I can serve my constituents and country well if I put party interests ahead of theirs.

In the coming weeks and months I can easily envisage MPs leave the Conservative Party because they cannot tolerate a new Prime Minister who advocates a hard Brexit or no deal Brexit. Equally, there are Labour colleagues who will no longer tolerate Jeremy Corbyn's inability to fight as an opposition leader should.

Recognising that it is very difficult for MPs to leave their parties and immediately join other ones, I believe my role will be to help convene a safe neutral space in the centre ground of Parliament and offer a home for those MPs. It will allow us to work alongside the Liberal Democrats, Greens, SNP, Change UK and Plaid Cymru in the national interest, ensuring we do not crash out of the EU with no deal.

As an Independent MP with a reputation for cross party working and prioritising the national interest over party allegiance, I feel strongly that I will be able to help act as a convener.

After months of training On Sunday 2nd June, a group of 7 of us entered into the Tour of Cambridgeshire 'ToC 100' - This is 100 mile Sportive cycling on closed roads, so no traffic.
