No Spring, nor Summer beauty hath such grace, As I have seen in one Autumnal face.

I think I understand what Donne was saying when he wrote these words. Of all the months of the year I think I like September the most. A bit of summer still lingers but with a note of the autumnal change to come in the air. So much is ripe and ready for the gathering which is why I suppose so many churches used to hold their harvests festivals around this time – it's a season of plenty. This of course means a busy time for allotmenteers, produce to be gathered and stored, ground to be cleared. Wandering around the site its good to see what others have been growing. Those with fruit trees seem to have been rewarded well but unfortunately for me the strong winds in August took a toll on my pears. Potatoes seem to have done quite well although at the time of writing I haven't yet lifted my late's. Everyone who grew courgettes have been well rewarded and likewise with



beetroot. I'm not so sure about soft fruits. Last year I was offered quite excess fruits a number of times but crop results seem to have been a bit mixed this time around. My own strawberry plants are new so I'm not in the best place to judge. But as I have said



before allotments are not just about fruit and veg – flowers too have their place and my lavender despite early protests at being moved seem to have done quite well.

The weather over the summer has of course been a bit mixed, but we are thankful that we avoided the drought we experienced last year so water wasn't so much of a problem. We now have a water collection system

in place which has proved helpful -but please use responsibly and remember to switch of taps fully. We have had a number of working group days over the summer to help keep the sites tidy. We try to arrange these for the last Saturday in the month.



Please try to come along if you can as we can always use an extra pair of hands.

Introduction

Following a working at scale meeting in September 2017, 5 Peterborough practices decided that they would work towards a merger to become a larger practice with 5 branch sites. Along the way, other practices have joined the process as the opportunities to work at scale have proved to be successful for patients and staff alike. The name Octagon Medical Practice was chosen from staff entries to name the new merged entity.

Background

For several years, the forward plan within the NHS has been to support the merger of primary care practices to enable long term secure care for Patients. The practices within Octagon share a vision of being part of a larger service which offers many benefits to all of our registered patients. This proposed merger will strengthen the Patient care choice and service available within its Patient population and allow for investment in new technology and ways of working.

Proposal

It is envisaged that Octagon will continue to grow, and to add further Practices to our portfolio, this will ensure financial and medical stability whilst continuing to provide the opportunities a larger Practice can offer. Papworth Surgery merged within Octagon on 1st August 2019.

What does this mean for patients?

- There will be no reduction in current services offered at Papworth Surgery, and Octagon will look to develop service choice where we possibly can.
- Will this lead to more appointments being available for patients? This cannot be guaranteed, but the aim of the merger is to offer more choice without reducing any of the current service or appointments that the practice offers.
- As Octagon develop new services, our patients will benefit from these improvements as these eservices may be offered locally at the Practice.
- It is our aim to be one of the leading Practices in the country for high quality patient care.

From strength to strength

"Nearly finished ..." said one local farmer to me the other day as I asked about his progress with the harvest; also, he was quietly confident about the quality this year and hence the price he hopes to get when it is sold. I was reminded of the uncertainty he and others live with from year to year; and then realised this is no different for all of us – for example a family member falls ill suddenly, the car breaks down at just the wrong moment and when the real cost of the summer holiday hits the credit card statement, unemployment comes out of the blue and

so on. It is easy to be filled with gloom, perhaps more than ever at this time as we head nervously towards October 31st and wait to find out what sort of Brexit takes place.

I continue to be delighted by the signs and strength of real community that are an essential component in dealing with life's bumps in the road. Just yesterday I heard of neighbours rescuing an older person who had fallen in the road and injured themselves – at no little inconvenience until an ambulance came and a relative could be found and called.

The story Jesus told of the Good Samaritan reminds us the your problem is my opportunity to help, serve and support you; yet it is all too easy to walk by on the other side and think this is someone else's problem, because there is a longstanding appointment in the diary or whatever. Perhaps the biggest challenge is that so many of us feel too busy to find time which in itself only highlights the isolation and loneliness felt by some people in need.

I have only glimpsed a brief press cutting about the plans for the old hospital site in Papworth Everard. My immediate reaction is that maybe there is a message for us all in the concept of a "Wellness Centre" – that in future Papworth Everard becomes known as a place where people get better, feel better and are better as a result of being part of the community. I suggest that not only builds on our past but takes it to a new level – not just for those who may use the new proposed facilities when they arrive, but as the hallmark of the whole village.

For this sort of vision to become the everyday reality it will take more than the injection of new enterprise in one part of the community; it needs to be the commitment of the vast majority and led by the institutions that are there to serve, including the Parish Council, the churches, the school, the business community and others, but as Christian I propose it is just the sort of big dream God wants to prosper with our help and engagement.

MY WALK AROUND CAMBOURNE NATURE RESERVE

One Sunday me and my family decided to go for a walk to the Cambourne Nature Reserve. We found out about it on the Wildlife Trust Website, see https://www.wildlifebcn.org/nature-reserves/cambourne-nature-reserve. We decided to follow the suggested Cambourne wild discovery trail details on their leaflet: https://www.wildlifebcn.org/sites/default/files/2019-06/Cambourne%20Lealfet%20Web.pdf which was 1.5 km and they estimated would take 20 minutes if walked non-stop. In the end we took about an hour because we detoured somewhat but also stopped along the way several times to admire Mother Nature. You can see the route we took on the map.

It was a grey damp day, but the nature was still amazing, there were insects, beautiful wild flowers, and impressive trees. It's a great place to visit - especially for family walks, which was evident by the families we saw walking together, with their dogs and even an entire family fishing together.

We saw trees such as alder, hawthorn, maple and oak trees. The oaks were young trees but they will be big mighty trees some day.

We found a large hill, which surprised me considering Cambridgeshire is known for being flat. There were some amazing views across Cambourne and to the surrounding villages. I would really recommend going to the Cambourne Nature Reserve if you are into photography.

There were some gorgeous lakes there with fishermen on the shore. There was a unique patch of pink lily pads that were beautiful. We came across some lovely rushes and bull rushes at the edge of the lake.

There was lots of grassland with plenty of flowers and




grasses in them. We spotted Motherwell, knapweed, daisies, thistles and many others I have not identified. I also found a little beetle and a ladybird.

I really enjoyed my visit and would really recommend this nature reserve for you to visit too. It's important that we do as much as we can to prevent climate change because it damages our precious wildlife and we need this wildlife around us to teach the next generation about the biological world and the value of it.



Dunlop Britcar Endurance Championship

Sam Tomlinson - Race report Saturday, 10th August, 2019

Sam Tomlinson (British Karting Champion) from Papworth Everard and Will Stacey (Youngest UK Lotus Champion) had a very successful weekend at Snetterton for round 6 of the National Dunlop Britcar Endurance Championship, with a third place in race 1 and a win in race 2 in their Ginetta G55 Supercup car.

The day started well as Will qualified on Pole in Class 3 by an incredible 15 seconds. With Will starting race 1, we soon found ourselves not only second in class behind the Porsche 997 but battling amongst the Ferrari and Prototype cars of Class 1 & 2. Sam then took over the second stint and gained and overtook the Porsche into

the lead. With 10 minutes to go, his tyres started to go off and the Porsche had managed to regain and overtake Sam and the 3rd place, #77 Ginetta G55 Supercup car too. With a last lap epic battle to the line for all 3 cars the Porsche pipped the number 77 Ginetta to the line, with just over 1 second covering the 3 cars after 1 hour, with Sam and Will eventually finishing in third place. Race 2 started a lot better for Will, as he managed to get a strong lead in his first stint on a damp track to hand Sam a 30 second lead to the Porsche again. With half an hour left Sam maintained and grew the gap to finish the race in first place in class and an amazing outright fourth.

"The team Rob Boston racing has been brilliant all weekend and Will drove incredibly well too so it was just the perfect weekend. I would like to thank all of our sponsors for this weekend that truly made this event happen, RVS Tec, Skip UK, Camclad Steelworks, BRUCE, Headley Tyres and Martin Tomlinson Motorsport Art too."

This wasn't just a normal race for Sam though as the reason behind competing in this race was to raise awareness and as much money as possible for Addenbrooke's Charitable Trust (ACT) as this was a cause close to Sam's heart. " Molly our daughter was born at Addenbrooke's on the 28th December and was soon diagnosed with a very rare gene abnormality called CHOPS syndrome, where we were told she was the fourth recorded person in the world to have this. After 2 weeks at Great Ormond Street for a heart operation and 101 days (Race number for the day was #101) in Neonatal Intensive care unit, Molly came home on Oxygen. After 12days Molly sadly passed away at home surrounded by all of our friends and family". To stay positive and to try and give something back to ACT for all the amazing work and support they offered Sam and his family, Sam, his wife Samantha and their 41/2 year old son Alfie decided to set up a JustGiving page https://www.justgiving.com/fundraising/ sam-tomlinson5 in aid of a race event later in the year. The current figure with Gift Aid is standing at £16,425.97 which beats the £5,000 they initially set out to achieve. "We have had an amazing response to this, not just from friends and



family, but famous Le Mans racing drivers to International reality TV stars and overwhelmingly, people we don't know. It's been incredible and we would just like to say a huge thank you to everyone that has supported us.'
