Bypass Resurfacing

The County Council's Highways Department has confirmed that the bypass around the village is to be resurfaced following ongoing issues with increased road surface noise.

They will be overlaying the existing road surface with a quieter material. This will perform similar to the original road surface and should help to reduce the noise levels that some village residents have experienced since the road was resurfaced 18 months ago.

The resurfacing work is scheduled to commence on the 16th March. Work will be undertaken overnight (between 2000 to 0600 hours) and is planned to be undertaken for over 8 shifts (not including Saturday and Sunday night).

A TTRO (temporary traffic regulation order) has been granted for closure of the road during the working periods and a 40mph speed limit at other times for the duration of the work.

The alternative route for vehicles is:

Northern closure via A1198 - A428 - A14 - A1198 and vice versa; Southern closure via B1040 - A428 and vice versa.

The Parish Council has requested that signage is displayed at either end of the village to help deter vehicles from driving through the village during the road closures.

Footway lighting upgrade

South Cambs District Council have advised that existing footway lights along Baron's Way, Ridgeway, Brookfield Road and Chequers Lane (plus a few in other locations) are scheduled to be updated to LEDs over the coming weeks. It is anticipated that the majority of the units will have been upgraded by mid-March.

The more energy efficient LED bulbs, which will emit a white light rather than the current yellow light, will reduce energy consumption and therefore lead to energy cost savings for the Parish Council.

A428 Black Cat to Caxton Gibbet improvements

During the summer of 2019 Highways England carried out an extensive consultation including 17 events across the region. Over 2,500 people took the time to visit and talk about the plans to improve journeys between Milton Keynes and Cambridge.

The feedback from the consultation has shown that there is overwhelming support for both the proposals and the consultation process.

Since the consultation, Highways England have been reviewing the feedback which includes over 900 responses. They are continuing to work through people's comments in detail and as they consider the responses, they may make changes to the scheme. If significant changes to the design are made, further consultation on those changes may be made.

It is vital that all aspects of the design are right to ensure the benefits of the scheme are maximised whilst also minimising any impacts on communities and the environment. Highways England will continue to work closely with stakeholders to shape the design

and understand the impact on local communities and remain committed to opening the new road in 2025/26.

A detailed Public Consultation Report will be published later this year as part of the planning application to build the scheme. This will detail all comments, Highways England's response and any changes made to the plans as a result.

Submission of the Development Consent Order (DCO) application is likely to happen in summer 2020 which will give time to consider any local concerns around the wider impacts of the scheme at key points on the road network. It will also give time to ensure assessments around noise and air quality from the changes in traffic patterns are as detailed as possible

Since the consultation, Highways England have been carrying out ground investigations and surveys along the proposed route. These are important and will give the team a clear picture of the types of soils, rock and groundwater along the route to assist in designing structures and planning of how these will be built.

Archaeological trial trenching has also commenced in the area. These investigations will help Highways England understand the significance of the archaeological resource and inform how they can avoid or minimise harm through design and mitigation. The first phase commenced in early 2020 and will run until the end of summer.

Papworth to Caxton Gibbet/A428 cycleway

The project to construct a cycleway/footpath along the A1198 from Papworth to join the existing cycleway running from the A428 Caxton Gibbet roundabout towards Cambourne, is continuing.

The basic design is in place and, although it has been subject to some delay, the full detailed plan and project costings are expected by the end of March.

It is hoped that subject to final surveys and agreement of costs, contractors could be on site in the summer, with the works likely to take approximately 10 weeks to complete.

The Parish Council will be in regular contact with the Project Manager and will provide further updates as they arise.

St John Ambulance Brigade demonstration at Papworth and District Day Centre

On 11th February we were very surprised and lucky to have James demonstrate some essential first aid skills. He is the leader of the St Neots division of St John Ambulance Brigade.



He explained the initial assessment of a casualty using the acronym DR ABC, and went on to demonstrate Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR.)

James then showed us how to use a public defibrillator machine, by first phoning the ambulance service on 999 in order to be given the instructions to open the combination lock and then how to proceed. James explained where to attach the defibrillator pads depending on the age and size of the casualty.

Finally, he demonstrated how to put a casualty into the recovery position.

James' delivery of the first aid skills was highly professional and good humoured and was appreciated by everyone present.

Anthony Brown

Member of Parliament for South Cambs

As I write, it has been just over nine weeks since the general election, although it feels like a lifetime ago. So much has happened in the early days of this Parliament both nationally and locally.

The UK has officially left the European Union and must now focus on negotiating a new trading relationship with our European partners. For South

Cambridgeshire, a crucial aspect of this new arrangement will be the provisions on agriculture. I was therefore delighted to make farming issues the focus of my maiden speech to Parliament during the debate on the government's new Agriculture Bill. In the coming weeks and months I want to engage closely with local farmers to better understand their needs, so that I can best represent their views in Parliament as it shapes the country's future agriculture policy. If you would like to be involved in these discussions, please get in touch.

Last week I enjoyed a fascinating visit to the new Royal Papworth. It is the first UK hospital to be rated outstanding across every CQC category, which is a testament to the talent and commitment of its staff and management team. I saw the site where the Cambridge Heart & Lung Research Institute (HLRI) will be built, a brilliant example of the how the Biomedical Campus brings together the world's best clinicians and researchers to develop new treatments for the most challenging conditions. We are so fortunate that this local expertise will improve healthcare not only here in South



Cambs, but across the world. I know there are concerns about the UK's ability to collaborate with EU research partners post-Brexit and I therefore raised this matter in Parliament with the Science Minister in January. He offered assurances that the UK would remain committed to the Horizon 2020 programme and would seek as full an association as possible with its successor scheme, but I will continue to meet with local stakeholders and push the government on this issue.

One of my key pledges as your MP is to help to fix our creaking transport system. We had some extremely welcome news this month when the Transport Secretary announced that East West Rail will take a northern route through Cambourne, where local commuter demand is highest. This is not only great news for Cambourne, but also for residents in Bassingbourn, who were overwhelmingly opposed to EWR taking a southern route.

The new Cambridge South Station will form a critical new transport hub for the Biomedical Campus. I have already met with Network Rail to find out more about this project and to discuss parking problems at local stations and the notoriously problematic level crossing at Foxton.



PAPWORTH EVERARD ALLOTMENT ASSOCIATION



Well this winter has certainly been wet. The allotments have been going nearly 7 years now and I have never known it quite this wet for this long.

Despite that we have been busy up there, all 5 beds of asparagus (2 older beds we can fully crop, 3 newer ones we are still only gently cropping) are mulched in manure. All the rhubarb plants are equally well manured, in fact the rhubarb was sprouting from its base when I mulched it. It can't wait to get growing.

The 4 new mulberries we planted are covered in buds along with the rest of our fruit canes. The leeks we overwintered are looking good and tasting even better, they are far stronger in flavour and smell than the leeks you get from a supermarket. The brussel sprouts were not great this year, they are still growing and we will get a small late crop off them, but we had no homegrown sprouts on our Christmas dinner. I will make a point of planting earlier this year.

We have had a few new joiners this winter and it's an excellent time to take on a plot. You can plan your plot layout and where you want permanent crops (fruit canes, rhubarb, globe artichokes etc) and where you want your rotating crops (potatoes, broccoli, leeks etc). You can also layout any paths you want, and when it dries a bit you can even get an early start on prepping the soil.

We still have a few empty plots and some ground we can mark out for new ones, so if you would like one, or even just a tentative look to see if you might like one, contact us on enquiries@peaa.uk, or pop up and chat to anyone up there.

I have had a number of approaches from constituents who are worried about the rate of development in South Cambridgeshire. I share many of their concerns and will be lobbying national government to ensure that we do not become victims of our own success. Whilst growth is welcome, it must be carefully managed and local people's voices must be heard. Infrastructure should always be put in place before expansion - 'I before E' as the saying goes. You can make your views known by taking part in the initial consultation on the Greater Cambridge Local Plan - which contemplates a significant increase in housebuilding - at www. cambridge.oc2.uk.

Wysing Arts Centre is a nationally recognised organisation supporting artists from around the world. 




