Papworth Everard Parish Council Report

COVID-19

As a direct result of the Covid-19 crisis, Papworth Everard Parish Council took the decision to close the Parish Office and Village Hall to the public until such time as we receive clear guidance that these buildings are safe to be publicly accessible again.

We have taken this decision for the protection of members of the public, as well as Parish Council staff and Councillors.

We are in the process of contacting all village hall hirers regarding their bookings. Any queries about bookings can be made to our Bookings Clerk at villagehall@papwortheverardpc.org.uk

Due to the outbreak, the Parish Council has had to cancel several scheduled meetings due to being unable to meet quora.

It is hoped that it may be possible to hold virtual Parish Council meetings using video conferencing technology to allow the Parish Council to transact its usual business as normal. Agendas and further details will be posted on the Parish Council's website.

Whilst the office is closed, we are working remotely to try to fulfil our obligation to service the village in this difficult time. You can still email the Clerk, Sarah Cruse at clerk@papwortheverardpc.org.uk (which is our preferred method of contact) or leave a voicemail on the office phone (01480 830360) where messages will be check periodically.

Further to the Government's announcement on 23 March, to seek to control the spread of the Coronavirus, the Parish Council's play area on Ermine Street North, the trim trail and the MUGA are also now closed until further notice.

To date we are still allowed to keep open our green spaces, so whilst the play equipment must not be used, the field itself will remain open for people to exercise on, until such time as the Government mandate otherwise. This is on the provision that individuals are adhering to rules on social distancing and not using the field as a place to gather or congregate.

We are proud of our play and leisure facilities in the village, and with the support of everyone we hope that these restrictions can soon be lifted.

The Parish Council is really heartened to see the huge amount of community spirit being shown at this time.

Please stay safe, be sensible and play by the rules - as a village we will get through this !

Overhanging Hedges & Trees

I have been asked by Cambridgeshire County Council's Highways Department to remind householders that hedges and trees should not be allowed to encroach onto the public highway.

As we move into spring, vegetation is growing rapidly and can very quickly cause problems for pedestrians when it starts to encroach the public footpaths. This is particularly an issue for wheelchair users and parents with children in prams and buggies, when twigs can be at face height and easily cause scratches.

The owner or occupier of a property has a legal responsibility (Highways Act 1980 s154) to ensure that the 'public highway' adjacent to a property is not obstructed by vegetation from their property. The public highway is defined by law as consisting of any verge, footway, bridleway or footpath that is maintained at public expense and over which the public has right of way.

Local Authorities have a legal duty to ensure that public highways are unobstructed, so usually inspect roads regularly and often receive complaints from members of the general public.

When Local Authorities become aware of such obstructions, they can issue a formal notice for the work to be undertaken, which, if ignored will result in the Local Authority undertaking the work and charging their costs back to the owner/occupier.

If your hedge is a starting to get a bit unruly, with twigs and branches sticking out towards the pavement, now is the perfect time of year to get those shears and hedge trimmers out and get trimming to help keep our pathways clear and unobstructed !

Issues such as overhanging hedges, bushes and trees or any other highways matters such as potholes, street signs, damage to street furniture and obstructions or debris and mud on the road can be reported online via the Cambridgeshire County Council Highways Department reporting tool https://www.cambridgeshire. gov.uk/residents/travel-roads-and-parking/roads-and-pathways/ roadworks-and-faults

In these troubled times

One of the gifts of these strange days when much of the world is in crisis, due to the coronavirus pandemic, is seeing how many acts of kindness are springing forth. Local communities are pulling together, serving one another, looking out for the most vulnerable. Thank you.

There seems to be one general exception – the panic buying and 'hamstering', typically of foodstuffs and groceries, by some people. It is understandable but, in many instances, it is little more than greed, self-centredness and an abuse of power.

There are people who cannot afford to stockpile even if they wanted to and there are many others who find the idea of stockpiling morally offensive, which it is. If you have been doing it, please stop and see if you can find someone nearby who needs what you have stockpiled excessively; when you find them, give away what they need. Please resist the temptation to sell it and make a profit. Fear is at the root of the worst forms of panic buying. It is an ancient tendency in human beings.

The Bible tells the story how God provided manna for the Israelites as they sojourned for 40 years in a region where otherwise they could not sustain themselves. They were to gather 2 days' worth only the day before the sabbath; otherwise they were to look daily for the new supply from heaven. They were never disappointed; and those who stockpiled contrary to instruction found what they had secreted away was not fit for purpose the following day.

The Bible's antidote is that God's love dispels all fear. We are invited to ask God to make the power of his love tangible and something we feel on the inside as much as through the circumstances we are in.

Christians are to love God first, then love one another as our number two priority. For many of us there has never been a time when these unchanging demands are being put to the test and should be followed (dare I say it) religiously.

The requirement announced by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York for Church of England churches not to meet for worship services on a Sunday will be a great loss. As with schools closing, we do not know, currently, how long this will last.

In case you wonder, this is not a holiday for clergy – instead (as I explained to my own Mum!) it's a season when we work differently. Even so, in many places our churches will be open throughout the week as places to enjoy for prayer, solitude and quiet reflection. Please keep abreast of news and other resources for spiritual encouragement we will provide through our Team website: go to www.papworthteamchurches.org.

Keep safe. Help one another if at all possible. Stop stockpiling, please. Turn fears into prayers – taste and see how the Lord is good!



Here is my rhubarb bursting through its mulch of farmyard manure.



Despite the very wet conditions we are trying to prepare our plots for Spring. That is spreading mulch around overwintering veg (such as leeks) and digging in manure and compost to prepare beds for soon to be planted veg (such as onions and first early potatoes). Soon after that the rest of the planting happens, I am hoping for a better crop of sweet corn than last year.
