UPDATE FROM DOCTORS SURGERY

Covid does indeed seem to be waning: We have had no new cases in our population for more than a month.

We are still telephoning everybody who wants to make contact with a GP, but following that initial contact, we are seeing more patients in the surgery now; relaxation of the 2m rule to 1m will help a lot too! Our nurses and Health Care Assistants are also undertaking a large part of their usual work; nearly all of that is face-to-face. We do still ask everybody to use a face mask when visiting the surgery (we will provide these if you don't have one).

Nothing stays the same for long in the current climate, but sometimes the old ways are the best! We have decided to split from the Octagon umbrella after less than 12 months. It started well, but it has not lived up to expectations.

However I am delighted to let you know that Drs Hannah Greenwood, Dr Kari Coulson and Dr Flora Bailey are coming on board as partners with me, so we will be a partnership of 4 (Gang of 4?!). I have agreed to stay on at 2 days a week for at least 18 months to help the new partners bed in with the management of the Practice. I have to say I am really pleased that we have achieved this outcome.

The date of de-merger is not yet firm but looks like it will be 30th September.

Papworth Village Hall

In line with Government guidelines, the Village Hall remains closed for use.

The Parish Council will review the situation on an ongoing basis and will reopen the Village Hall once it is agreed that it can be opened safely and with any necessary health and safety procedures in place as required.

At this time, the Parish Office, situated on the 1st floor of the Village Hall also remains closed. The Clerk continues to work from home and can be contacted by email clerk@papwortheverarpc.org.uk (Messages may also be left on the office answerphone on 01480 830360 but callers may experience a delay in a response as the answerphone is only checked for messages periodically).

Pavilion

The Parish Council is delighted that planning permission has finally been granted for construction of a sports pavilion to be built in the space between the changing rooms and tennis courts on the playing field site.

As part of this project, there will be some minor changes to the fence line of the tennis courts as well as a hard surface car park being laid. The brick entrance way to the playing fields and Rocky's Car Park will be widened to allow better access and the brick pillars and King George V plaque will be reinstated.

Now permission has been granted, the work will commence quickly, with the first arrivals on site due from Monday 29 June. It is hoped that the project will be completed by the end of September.

A428 Black Cat to Caxton Gibbet Improvement Scheme - Consultation

The scheme to dual the A428 between the Black Cat Roundabout and Caxton Gibbet is in the final planning stages before a submission to the Secretary of State for a Transport Development Consent Order (TRCO) which will be submitted later in the year.

Following a consultation held last year, some amendments have been made to the scheme and its design.

Highways England is running a supplementary consultation between 24 June and 28 July 2020.

A new two tier junction at Caxton Gibbet will allow vehicles to travel to and from the new dual carriageway from the A1198 (Ermine Street).

- The existing Caxton Gibbet roundabout will be maintained on the south side of the main carriageway.
- 2 A new roundabout will be constructed at ground level on the north side. The two roundabouts will link under the new dual carriageway via an underpass.
 - Access to the service area will be unaffected.
- Drivers will access the filling station and shops on the south west side of the junction by using a link road and a new roundabout.



Nature Diary July by Holly Blue

The weather at the start of Summer has been promising and we had progression of young families through the garden. Noisy Starling youngsters monopolised the bird feeders and bird bath. As they moved on and the air became calmer the Blue Tits and Great Tits took over with demanding youngsters. The adults constantly flying back and forth filling ever open mouths and becoming more harassed looking as the days went by. Now we have the House Sparrows, the young ones chirping and fluttering wings at whichever adult is closer hoping to be fed.

By now our skies should be full of Swallows, Swifts and House Martins, but where we usually see them swooping low over the fields and across the ponds the numbers are definitely down this year. This has been reported nationwide and one theory is that as the migration started from Africa to Europe high winds and cold temperatures hit the Aegean Sea in April and thousands of small birds were left dead. The birds were reportedly found in the streets of Athens and around the Aegean Islands as Greece is on the flight path for hundreds of thousands of birds which migrate in Spring and Autumn.

Hopefully some of you will have Swallow nests on your property and the young should be leaving soon. The parents will go on to raise a second brood and sometimes even a third. After the tragedy this spring it is now more vital than ever to provide nesting sites and help the numbers of these beautiful birds increase. Imagine flying thousands of miles, battling the elements only to find, on your arrival, your nesting sites destroyed.

The ponds by the allotments are a great source of wildlife. Summer visitors Reed and Sedge Warblers can be heard singing. Both sets of warblers are very difficult to see, but if you stand quietly and watch you can see the reeds moving as they travel through. The Reed warbler has a very loud "Churring" call and are plain brown birds. The Sedge Warbler is a small bird with a distinct eye stripe. Its call is very loud and rambling and the Male can change its phrases frequently to attract a mate. More phrases equals more mates!

The Coots on both ponds are raising families, as are the Moorhens and Little Grebes. A pair of Mallard are around but do not seem to be nesting.

Common Blue damselflies can be seen everywhere and Four Spot Dragonflies can be seen basking in the sun. Keep a look out for the Emperor Dragonfly and the Broad Bellied Chaser darting over the water.

Things to look out for in July,

Dragonflies and Damselflies on the wing.

Hobbies catching dragonflies in flight

Swifts usually fledge in July, watch for them high in the sky. Bramble Flowers make a good nectar bar for a variety of Insects.

Silver Washed Fritillary and Marbled White are some of the Butterflies you may see, as well as Comma, Large Whites, and Painted Ladies.

If you have planted night scented flowers in your garden such as Stocks or Nicotiana look out for Moths and even bats out hunting

Remember to keep your garden ponds and bird baths topped up with water.



PAPWORTH EVERARD ALLOTMENT ASSOCIATION



Summer Solstice was 20th June, this means we are now in the phase of allotmenteering where we start to harvest the crops from the plants we carefully planted and / or cultivated in winter and spring.



That means picking strawberries straight off the plant and straight into your mouth, sorry collection bowl

We also have gorgeous gooseberries (both red and white), blackcurrants, raspberries and other fruit that grows on canes.

We also have quick growing crops that we grow from seed including beetroot, spring onions, carrots and lettuce. These you plant

the seed and expect to crop in approximately 2 months. We keep planting every 3 to 4 weeks so we can crop almost continuously.

The potatoes are getting earthed up on a regular basis, this both encourages more tubers to grow as well as stopping the top-most tubers going green from sunlight.

We have already eaten a few of our over-wintered onions and have cut-and-comeagain spinach and chard (which may have escaped its original planting bed, but we are not complaining too much).





can harvest now, we also have brussel sprouts growing strongly. Forget the awful sour tasting things you get on super market shelves, I am talking the crisp, flavoursome, sweet "mini cabbages" that I look forward to eating with my Christmas dinner.

So we have crops to harvest and enjoy now, plants we are growing now for future enjoyment and plants we will

be planting soon for future crops. So as always you never run out of jobs up the allotment, while there is watering, weeding, prepping beds etc.

We now have a waiting list for a plot on the allotment, this year has proven very popular with people taking up plots. This list will be dealt with on a first come, first served basis, so if you are interested, contact us at enquiries@peaa.uk and get your name on the list soon.

Being wise and realistic in an uneasy world

As 'lockdown' constraints are easing mixed emotions are in evidence. Some of the greatest challenges are faced by those around us who have been 'shielding' for about 4

months. The other day, when I asked how one such individual was faring, she said: "I'm thoroughly fed up.... Not seen one son since early December ... the other came to see me last weekend for the first time since early March..." Meanwhile, others are concerned they may be facing unnecessary risk if they venture out of doors too soon.

The importance of being good neighbours and faithful friends has been a definite gain in these difficult times; this is something we must not let slip and endeavour to strengthen in new ways. It is the natural behaviour of a person of faith – living well for the glory of God and the benefit of others.

For a variety of reasons – some hard to fathom for many – the churches seem to be at the tail end of the relaxation of lockdown arrangements; one commentator put it recently that it seems one can pray anywhere apart from in churches! The reality he highlighted, accidentally whilst making his point, is churches are first and foremost communities of people in fellowship with God and one another; we happen to use particular buildings as places for gathering together which we come to cherish and find solace in. Other activities and focal points of human contact are learning something similar in this new season.

Many people find comfort in Psalm 23. This begins: 'The Lord is my shepherd ..." One of its' striking features is (whilst reflecting on his relationship with God through different situations and life-contexts) the author, David, never suggests a person who knows, and trusts God is immune from the difficulties or challenges other people face. Rather she or he can go through them in the confidence God leads, guides, equips, sustains and watches over us. I suggest Psalm 23 a good resource to pick up, read and reflect on regularly in the days to come.

Here is my suggestion for the next few weeks:

- a) look out the old family Bible or the little copy of the New Testament and Psalms you were given at school;
- b) find a quiet place to be able to read and reflect for a few minutes in the early part of each day;
- c) read Psalm 23, allow it to get beneath the surface, then,
- d) turn the phrases into simple prayers.

You will be surprised at how this sort of spiritual activity refreshes your engagement with God and opens your eyes to how we can be God's hands, feet, ears, eyes and mouthpieces to others we come into contact with, through the rest of the day.



Summer is well under way, lockdown is being eased, but alas the Papworth Craft Group is still unable to meet. Hopefully, in the not too distant future, meetings can take place in a 'COVID Secure' way. Watch this space for updates!

Crafting can help one to relax, especially once one gets caught with the project in hand. As noted before in this column, there has been an upsurge in the demand for crafting materials. Lockdown has afforded more time to spend on projects that are perhaps only picked up on an evening or two during the working week in the past. Crafting can aid mental health, and no doubt working away on a project has had a positive effect on mood, and how one copes with this hugely difficult period. Completing a particularly challenging project can do wonders for lifting mood and generate calm and positivity. There is always help to hand, as different members have strengths in various crafts. Sometimes crafters can lose heart with the project being worked on, especially if repeated mistakes are being made, resulting in very slow progress. A chat with the whole group or an individual holds out the prospect of working through the persistent problem - and then a soothing calm ensues and you can confidently work on.

So, what to do in lockdown when there is no one to inspire or help? Technology comes to the rescue, of course! Instagram and Pinterest are both brimming with ideas on the crafting front. The images are endless, and while it can occasionally lead to feeling a touch inadequate, when one person appears to crochet three blankets a week and another four detailed cross stitch samplers, on the whole both Instagram and Pinterest are never less than engaging. For instruction in just about ANY activity, make friends with YouTube. More often than not it can solve your crafting problem. Learning from a fellow member during a group session is very rewarding as you chat and laugh about the trials and tribulations of resolving the problem in hand. YouTube offers a different experience. For one thing, you can enlarge the images - really helpful - but best of all you can stop and rewind as many times as you like.

Where to get inspiration and solutions to crafting problems if one does not have the internet? There are so many crafting magazines on the market that there is bound to be at least one that suits. The plethora of craft magazines can lead one down the slippery slope this one for cross stitch, this one for crochet, oh! and look, one that deals with lots of handcrafts. A visit to the magazine isle can prove very expensive! However, lockdown has saved money on petrol, train and bus rides, as well as excluding random visits to the shops that have been closed. 
