

Nature Diary

January 2021

If you are walking the bypass footpath, just take a few minutes to stop look across the pond near the Shilpa roundabout. There are small groups of Tufted Ducks and Teal as well as Mallard. Great to see these spending the winter here.



Tufted Ducks above left, are resident all year in the UK but their numbers increase in the winter as they are joined by visitors from colder climates. Teal above right, are a pretty little duck and gather in large numbers in the winter on gravel pits, reservoirs and flood meadows. Most of these are also visitors from Baltic and Siberia. In the summer they head back to breed, although a small number may stay

in the North of the country.

Scanning the trees at the back of the pond, you may spot a Buzzard shown left, or a Red Kite, shown below, especially if the sun is out as they seem to like to sit in the winter sun. Buzzards are now thought to

be our most common bird of prey, quadrupling in numbers since the 1970's thanks to protection and now banned use of pesticides. They eat rabbits, small rodents down to earthworms and also road kill. This varied diet ensures that they can always find something to eat.

Red Kites were once common but persecution drove them almost to extinction in Britain. Following reintroduction of Red Kites from Europe



in the 1980's the numbers are beginning to increase. Red Kites are top predators eating both live and dead prey, and their diet consists of small mammals, young rabbits earthworms and also fish.

Also along the by pass is a Kestrel. It can be seen most days hovering, or perched, and searching the grass banks that line the road. A Kestrel has the ability to keep its head still while it hovers, even in strong winds, helping it to pinpoint its prey by sight. In the winter months it likes to perch to look for food thus using up less energy.

Winter is not as barren or bleak as it may seem. There are some flowers that will bloom in winter. Of course the one that comes to mind is the Snowdrop, shown right, carpeting the woodland floor before the Bluebells appear. I have not seen any in the Papworth Woods but maybe someone knows where to find them. Of course, some of the best sights for us can be seen at Anglesey Abbey or Wimpole Hall. Please check the National Trust



Website to see if these are open at present. Snowdrops are used in modern medicine. They contain a substance called galantamine, which can be used to treat memory loss and has been used in the UK to treat the symptoms of Alzheimers disease. Their latin name is Galanthus Nivalis which translates as "milk flower of the snow".

Primrose, shown below, is a tough little wildflower and can bloom from late December through to May. Last



year Papworth woodland was carpeted with them in the spring. They like damp shady woodlands making our local woodland perfect for them.

Lesser Celandine covers the woodland floor from January to May. It looks like a large Buttercup and is an invaluable source of nectar for early insects.

January is the month for the RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch. We are all "locked in" in tier 4 at present so what better way to spend an hour. This year you can take part between 29th - 31st January. All you have to do is spend an hour counting the birds in your garden. You don't have to be an expert, the RSPB provide an identification sheet and many hints and tips. Sign up today to take part at rspb.org.uk. You do not have to be a member and all results collected help to give a picture of the state of our wildlife throughout the UK, get the kids to join in with you, its really good fun for all the family.





Wildlife up the allotment is particularly important to us growers. Good wildlife (toads, bees and hoverflies) are to be encouraged as they deal with not so good wildlife (for allotmenters) such as slugs and aphids such as greenfly and blackfly.

To encourage bees of all varieties we grow lavender at the end of most of our beds. As well as bees, lavender also encourages butterflies, whilst their caterpillars can have a nibble at a vegetable or two. It's a small price to pay for having the sight of a butterfly floating around. Of course cabbage white butterfly caterpillars can take



advantage of our generosity and really savage any leafy crops, but they can be hand picked easily enough (plus the birds like eating them).

Soon after starting the allotment we spent a few very wet days planting natural British hedging all round the plot. Most of these turned out to be covered in very large, sharp thorns. These have at last become large and dense enough to be popular with birds as can be seen in the used nest above found in our hedging.

Most plots also grow sunflowers and these are immensely popular with birds, some of whom eat the seeds on the plants and others who eat the dropped seeds on the floor.

We have plenty of birds around the allotment. They do seem to like trying our patience though.

We have 2 pheasants who love to hide in the fruit canes and tall veg and then flap out on us to test our hearts work. We also have numerous pigeons that enjoy pecking out the top of any brassica plants we grow.

RE-PLAY PAPWORTH
