"We are pleased to advise that our primary care network began vaccinating patients in the highest priority group on Saturday 16th January from a base in Huntingdon. We are starting with those over 80, and will be inviting successively younger groups in turn. Surgery staff contact patients directly to make the appointments – PLEASE DO NOT CONTACT US - and take up has been high despite having to travel into town. The most efficient way for us to make these appointments is using text messages so if you have a mobile phone that you have not already advised us of please email the surgery with the number, your name, address, date of birth and your agreement for us to communicate via text message. Both Cambridge County Council and South Cambs District Council have an online reporting tool which enables issues to be reported direct to the Council:

County Council - Highways / Footpaths

You can report problems on roads or pavements on the County Council's Highway reporting tool:

This includes:

potholes / road surface issues

kerbs

verges

flooding

hedges and trees

public rights of way

road markings

road signs

traffic signals

Supporting photographs to illustrate the issues can also be uploaded to the site.

You can also use the highway reporting tool to track progress on a fault already reported. Enter the reference number for your fault or the area of the fault into the top right hand box on the map to view updates.

Issues which can be reported include:

Lost or Missing Bins / Missed Bin Collections

Broken street nameplates

You will need to quote the lamp reference number which can be found on the lamp post.

Age UK Cambridgeshire and Peterborough have been delivering these schemes for 27 years and with the funding support from South **Cambridgeshire District** Council we are pleased to be in a position to expand the scheme to those living within the above mentioned villages.

I have worked in the health and social care sector in the local area for 22 years and have extensive experience and knowledge of supporting older people in the community.

The Community warden service assists adults over 60 to continue to live independently and safely at home by providing daily contact (Monday to Friday) and support by a personal visit (COVID19 compliant) or a telephone call to ensure a sense of security and wellbeing. We can help you on a long or short term basis depending on your needs and wishes. An example of some of the things I can do to help you are;

Doing small amounts of shopping

Collecting prescriptions

Reading post and making phone calls on your behalf

Spend time with you to have a chat

Listen to any concerns and help you find a solution

You will receive a 2 week FREE trial and after that we ask for a small charge of £9 per week for a single person and £11 per week for a couple. Below are some quotes from people that use our service.

"That phone call every day to check on me gives me such a great deal of security. You can't believe what a phone call can mean at my age"

It is easy to dwell on what we have not enjoyed through most of 2020 of the last twelve months. In the end that sort of outlook can be driven largely by self-pity; often it isn't very attractive although understandable.

The sight of snowdrops peeping through and daffodils getting ready to bloom reminds us the winter is nearly

For most of us the ravages of COVID have remained at arms-length; and we have seen many heroes rising to the challenge of helping others, most especially through the work of our NHS staff and other front-line workers. Thankfulness and hope are closely related. The former recognises, when there are areas in life we can't control, things are happening still that serve us well; the latter is shaped by an understanding that good always prevails over evil in the end.

Thankfulness and hope are virtues springing from confidence in God's goodness and disposition to watch over us whether or not we give back the attention and service deserved.

Across the Papworth Team Ministry, I continue to witness many signs of God's goodness in the behaviour of so many people, whether springing from faith or not. Please, where you can, keep up the good work. One of the consequences of what you are doing is generating thankfulness and fostering hope in others!

The longer we have to remain in 'lockdown', and with severe curtailment of the freedoms we took for granted just a year ago, the more we are scuttling the power of undue entitlement that seems to have infected so much of western culture; the feeling that such and such is mine by right etc. Entitlement is not pretty to see, promotes pride and selfishness, is driven by fear and, at its worst, can lead to the sort of unseemly scenes we watched on a TV screens in the aftermath of the recent presidential election in the USA. If COVID destabilises the power of entitlement, in the longer term the world will be a nicer place for generations to come.

Most can no longer say 'I'm too busy to be thankful'. We've been given time recently we never imagined; now is the moment to seize the opportunity to make some important adjustments that will set the course of our future in a more thankful way.

For example, why not - as you wake up each morning - quietly celebrate the start of a new day and thanking God for preserving us to enjoy it. As we do this, I know from experience many seemingly insignificant reminders cross my mind – things that provoke more thanks; to the point we find ourselves getting out of bed with a smile on our face and a new sense of spring in our step! Admittedly, the majority of any given project will be worked on at home, but the two hours, twice a month at Papworth Library, provide time for oneself with others who enjoy knitting, crochet, cross stitch, embroidery, quilting and patchwork. There is yet someone to join the group who makes lace - if you are out there, please come and introduce us to your craft, (once meetings resume, of course). This writer has repeatedly emphasised the pleasure of the twice monthly meetings, meeting with crafting friends and catching up on news, projects begun and finished, what is new in yarn.....endless exchanges over this and that. Do think about joining us later in the year, when, hopefully, meetings will have begun again. We are a very friendly and chatty group working on different projects and different handcrafts. All hark back to the classic sound of 1950s & 60's Blue Note - music made for dancing, not chin-stroking. The central pool of talent regularly feature on each other's recordings.
