#### **Appointment system**

We've been aware that there is an unusual pressure on appointments, making life very difficult for both patients and receptionists. A year ago, with the advent of the pandemic, we changed all appointments to be on-the-day only, and made all contacts to be telephone in the first instance. A year on, that isn't working so well: often patients are told to ring at 0830 or 12 noon for an appointment that morning/ afternoon, and by 0845 /1215 the session's appointments are gone. That leads to frustration and irritation all round.

So, we've had a discussion and agreed the following:

- We'll go back to half the appointments being bookable in advance, and the remainder on-the-day.
- We'll continue to use a telephone-first system, rather than having a number of appointments as bookable face-to-face by a patient (we felt that doctors are best to decide who needs a face-to-face appointment).
- We recommend a maximum of no more than 5 follow-up patients in advance for any one morning or afternoon GP session. Often GPs will book these in themselves; with some advance booking to happen from now, it's important that we don't use all the appointments in a session before the session starts, so that the receptionists have somewhere to put folk who need same-day appointments, and for patients to be able to book new appointments in advance.
- · We have reopened some internet booking of appointments.
- Where possible, we will send texts to patients about results/ letters/ suggestions, rather than using an appointment. Please do ensure you let us have your mobile number, and keep us updated of any changes.

I have also had a look at whether we are offering sufficient appointments. Of course, it's a bit difficult as traditionally we primarily saw patients face-to-face, and there was



a moderate amount on the phone; in addition we used to do a lot of visits in the more distant past. That's all changed; in addition to working mainly by telephone, we are texting patients a lot these days; whilst a text is not the same as a consultation, it's not zero work either.

This is what I have found:

So, if we annualise up the last 3 months:

The average patient has 3 Surgery face-to-face consultations each year, of which only one is with a GP

The average patient has 2.8 phone calls a year, of which 2.25 are with a GP

The average patient used to have a visit once in 10 years; that has dropped to once in 50 years

The average patient used to have 5.8 contacts per year with the doctors and nurses at the surgery; if we don't count texts, that's unchanged in the last 3 months. If we count texts, that's increased to 6.6 contacts per year.

Increasingly, other professionls are seeing patients as well as GPs; but the GPs are responsible for supervising the operation. In my busiest year as a GP, there were 6,000 patient contacts that I undertook personally: I saw 5,000 patients in the surgery, did

640 home visits and made 400 phone calls (2001). And yet, now as a full time GP there are on average 10,000 patients contacts that a Full Time GP is nominally responsible for; that's increased to 11,700 in 2021 (or 13,300 if you add in SMS texts). So as GPs we are undertaking only 50% of the patient contacts, but of course remain responsible for the other 50% too.

As an aside, it's important to acknowledge that a lot of what we as GPs do is to manage care suggested by hospital doctors, dietitians, physios, etc; whether that be an onward referral, some blood tests, or supervising treatment, and this all takes considerable time.

Of course there is no such thing as an "average patient" (!) but the numbers do let us know how many appointments we need to be planning.

What's the short answer to whether we are offering sufficient consultations?

The total number of GP contacts per patient has dropped from 3.6 per patient per year to 3.16, a 12% reduction. But, increasingly, the job is not about how many patient contacts the GP has, but the overall picture. I would say that for a service that is free at the point of delivery and potentially open-ended, patients are getting as good a deal as they ever did. However there is an expanding team in General Practice; these include nurses, health-care assistants, the midwife, physios, pharmacists, and soon also a mental health practitioner and paramedic; and it is increasingly normal to ask to see one of these other professionals, rather than the GP, for many health needs.

#### Covid vaccinations

We have been getting on well with Covid vaccinations, will complete groups 1 to 9 (everybody aged 50 and above, and those aged 16-49 with underlying health conditions) by Easter, or soon after. Second doses will generally be offered 11 weeks after the first dose was given, and so should start over the Easter weekend for those who received their first doses in January. The vaccinations will continue to be provided at Charles Hicks Surgery in Huntingdon; at present there are no plans to deliver vaccinations at Papworth, except for the housebound.

Those aged 18-50 will mostly be done by the specially arranged vaccination centres, and local pharmacies who are also about to start vaccinating. Letters will be sent by the central NHS team to these patients.

#### **OVERHANGING HEDGES & TREES**

Cambridgeshire County Council's Highways Department have asked us to remind householders that hedges and trees should not be allowed to encroach onto the public highway.

As we move into spring, vegetation is growing rapidly and can very quickly cause problems for pedestrians when it starts to encroach the public footpaths. This is particularly an issue for wheelchair users and parents with children in prams and buggies when twigs and brambles can be at face height and easily cause scratches.

The owner or occupier of a property has a legal responsibility (Highways Act 1980 s154) to ensure that the 'public highway' adjacent to a property is not obstructed by vegetation from their property. The public highway is defined by law as consisting of any verge, footway, bridleway or footpath that is maintained at public expense and over which the public has right of way.

The RSPB recommend checking carefully for active bird nests prior to cutting and to avoid major hedge cutting during the main breeding season for nesting birds, which usually runs from March to August each year. This can be weather dependent, and some birds may nest outside this period, so it is important to check first. Birds often nest in hedges because of the safety it affords their eggs and chicks from predators, so before you start cutting or pruning your hedge, check it thoroughly to see if there is any sign of nesting activity. If there is not, it is fine to continue.

Nesting birds in hedges are also protected by the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981. Whilst a wild bird is building or using its nest, any damage or destruction it might suffer is an offence under this act.

If there are nesting birds you will have to stop and postpone trimming until after August. This ensures you do not disturb the wildlife.

Local Authorities have a legal duty to ensure that public highways are unobstructed, so they inspect roads regularly and follow-up on complaints received from members of the public.

When Local Authorities become aware of such obstructions, they can issue a formal notice for the work to be undertaken, which, if ignored will result in the Local Authority undertaking the work and charging their costs back to the owner/occupier.

Issues such as overhanging hedges, bushes and trees or any other highways matters such as potholes, street signs, damage to street furniture and obstructions or debris and mud on the road can be reported online via the Cambridgeshire County Council Highways Department reporting tool https://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/residents/travel-roads-and-parking/roads-and-pathways/roadworks-and-faults

#### PADDLING POOL

#### ATTENDANTS REQUIRED - SUMMER HOLIDAYS

The Parish Council is planning to open the paddling pool again this summer – provided the lockdown restrictions are lifted and it is permitted and safe to do so.

The paddling pool is a great asset to the village and well used each year by children from the village and from further afield. But, we need helpers to keep it running - without people to look after the pool, we are unable to open it up for the summer. It takes a great deal of work to maintain the pool so it is safe and clean to use.

We are hoping to employ 2 or 3 people (Age 18+) to share cover of approximately 5-6 hours spread out over the day from early morning until early evening, 7 days a week, from mid-July until mid-September. The pool attendant is a paid position, and all necessary training will be provided.

## Nigel di Castiglione ... Team Rector Making a difference

I have had my first jab and the second dose is booked for the middle of May. Whilst we applaud the speed of the roll-out, I know families where the opportunity to be vaccinated came too late for one or more of their relatives; I have listened to others who are fearful, still mulling over whether they should take up the offer or not

I cannot recall a time in my lifespan when there appears to have been so much divergence and fragmentation on important and often basic issues. In my view it is good to see people who have felt themselves to be without a voice speaking out. A challenge we face as a nation and in this season is learning again how we can disagree without descending into disagreeable attitudes and behaviour towards those who don't see things the way we do.

The accounts of Jesus' trials, torture and terrible death are full of 'fake news' and dreadful behaviour. There is nothing new under the sun, said a wise sage! The hope Christians nurture is founded on knowing God was working through these events, not defeated by the machinations of human behaviour and, therefore, can help us to navigate a way through these times with integrity. Nevertheless, the awful events of Good Friday followed by the joy of Easter Day were not in isolation. They were the high-water mark, so-to-speak, of his public impact, which very few recognised; he had spent 3 years turning darkness to light, sorrow to joy and defeat to victory. It is evident in his great and high-profile miracles – such as the Feeding of the 5,000; also in one-to-one encounters when sick people were healed, dead people restored to life, as well as lonely and sometimes despised individuals helped to rebuild their lives and relationships.

When his time on earth was over Jesus left a small group of people who had been captivated by their time with him, whose lives were forever changed. Meeting Jesus was their defining moment and after his resurrection they were able to turn their world upside down. Meanwhile many people thought they were misguided and wrong; but down the centuries, at their best, Christians have been at the forefront of much we applaud as change for the better. We know COVID has changed some things forever. We still don't fully know what the 'new-normal' will look like – for ourselves and for generations to come. I believe Christians can have a major influence for good in such a time of change; as long as we don't expect everybody to get it or agree with us! Jesus called his followers salt of the earth. It is a metaphor to do with influence, bringing flavour and offering protection – recognised for the good it brings when it is the forgotten ingredient rather than getting the limelight and glory the culture of today seems to value so much.





In addition staff were also supporting small groups and working with individuals. I am very lucky to have such an amazing team who have worked tirelessly to support the education and welfare of the children of Pendragon. To all parents at home who managed to get their children ready for online lessons and supported their work during the day- congratulations you did a great job.

In addition, during this whirlwind of a year, we have been blown away by the support from the community of Papworth.

In the first instance the Papworth Community Group have provided much needed supplies to families in need from the impact of lockdown, furlough and children being at home every day, nonstop eating. As well as making daily contact (Monday to Friday) to check on well-being and generally have a chat to reduce loneliness and isolation, the warden can also help with practical things such as:

- · Make a light lunch, or hot drink
- Put the bins out (and bring back in)
- Help with Blue Badge applications and other paperwork
- · Assist with post opening and management
- Make phone calls on your behalf (e.g. if hard of hearing, or memory impaired)
- Feed animals/pets/pond fish and refill wild bird feeders
- Provide company and reassurance on a short walk
- Collect and deliver small amounts of shopping
- Collect and deliver Prescriptions
- Arrange transport and accompanied visits to medical/health appointments
- Signpost and connect to other useful services, such as benefit checks.

Not only do service users value the support of our community wardens, but so do carers. We can help support family, friends and cares by taking on some of their roles and giving them back some time. It gives cares peace of mind and having 'someone else' benefits both service users and carers.

#### **Eligibility**

The only criteria is that you must be aged over 60 years (if a couple only one of you needs to be over 60, to become a service user).

#### **Cost of Service**

There is a **TWO WEEKS FREE TRIAL** and thereafter, if you wish to continue there is a small fee of only £9 a week (single person) or £11 per week (for a couple).
