Latest News and Reports from P



Covid is thankfully dominating our lives a little less in recent weeks with the easing of lockdown. We continue to work in a covid-secure manner, with enhanced cleaning, social distancing, staff wearing PPE and we continue to offer most appointments as telephone initially. As the case numbers have dropped we have unlocked our doors to allow more freedom of access to the surgery building.

We continue to staff the Primary Care Network (PCN) vaccination clinic at Charles Hicks Centre in Huntingdon. We are making fantastic progress. Uptake is very high and we are proud to be part of such an important project. We have now completed all first vaccinations for cohorts 1-9 (as per the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation). We are steadily working our way through the second doses and are ahead of the national average for vaccinations. Cohorts 10 and beyond will be called for vaccination by the Government at a mass vaccination centre, which are not run by us at the PCN.

Appointments and staffing: We are under a lot of pressure at the moment as we manage staff shortages, long waiting times for appointments at the hospital, pent-up demand from the lockdown and the ongoing work of the covid vaccination programme as well as the daily challenges of a busy GP practice. We are all working extremely hard but it is a real challenge and sometimes we won't have enough appointments available to satisfy the demand. We continuously review the best way to manage our appointments and have recently made some changes. You will now normally be offered a pre-bookable appointment when you call, possibly a few days ahead, rather than an appointment on the same day. Please rest assured, if you have a medically urgent problem you will be either seen or spoken to by a clinician using one of our 'on the day' appointments. We only have a small

Papworth Everard Parish Council Report

East-West Rail Consultation

East-West Rail has recently launched a 10-week consultation on the route of the new Oxford to Cambridge rail track - including the section that runs through a new Cambourne station (which will be either to the north or south) and the surrounding area.

You will have seen consultation packs with full details about the project coming through your doors in the past week or so.

There are 5 proposed routes, but it is routes 1 and 9 which are showing as the emerging preferences. Both these routes travel to the north of Cambourne and would see a new station situated to the northern side of Cambourne and the A428.

The Consultation: The consultation is open now and closes on 9 June 2021. This is the second public consultation to share the project plans. Following this consultation East West Rail will analyse responses and use these alongside continuing environmental, economic and technical studies to help shape various aspects of the project. There will then be a further stage of consultation, following which the application for powers to build the new railway will be submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport.


Section D: Clapham Green to The Eversdens is the section of the project which will have the greatest impact on Papworth Everard.

Following the announcement of the preferred route option, East West Rail have now identified and assessed potential route alignment options, as well as considering possible station locations on each of these route alignments.

Alignments 1 (Dark Blue) and 9 (Purple) to the north of Cambourne have been identified as emerging preferences for several reasons:

- They benefit from a shared 'travel corridor' with the proposed A428 Black Cat to Caxton Gibbet Improvement Scheme, meaning they already cover a route used regularly to connect people to places
- New housing and communities there is more potential for new homes and communities in the area (particularly for Cambourne North compared to Cambourne South)

We have shortlisted five options for the route alignment in this section

- Economic growth alongside the development of new housing, a new station could bring
- economic growth to the community, creating more jobs and prosperity
- Value for money they are expected to be less costly to deliver than other alignments connecting to the same station pairings

Housing and economic growth Alignments 1 and 9 are more likely to stimulate large-scale housing growth due to the potential availability of land for development around a new Cambourne North station compared to alignment options that serve Cambourne South. It would be expected that a significant number of new homes and new communities will be built to the north of Cambourne with East-West Rail claiming that this could be achieved without causing Papworth Everard, Knapwell and Elsworth to join up, and a site in this area is already identified in the emerging Greater Cambridge

Local Plan. There are also fewer heritage assets and areas of woodland and habitat in the area to the north of Cambourne.

We would urge you to review the consultation documents you have received, or look at the plans, maps and information provided online at www.eastwestrail.co.uk/ consultation and submit your comments by 9 June 2021.

The vaccination program seems to be rolling out beyond expectations although the lurking threat of mutations of the virus keep appearing in the news. The impact of the past 14 or 15 months is far-reaching, highlighted before

the nation by the strict COVID protocols in place for the funeral of HRH Prince Philip.

I bumped into a schoolteacher recently. In response to my enquiry, she volunteered 'We're all very tired.' It was the end of the first week back after Easter; clearly the "holiday" was not a time of rest for her and her colleagues. This is not surprising. Schools have had a torrid 12 months, not always as

visible as the right and proper attention given to those on the front-line as health and care workers.

An underlying issue, I suspect, is the 'needs-must' demands driven by the pandemic have destroyed many of the important and life-giving rhythms people had in place; including times for rest, recreation and holidays.

For some the destruction of the old may be the prompting we need – to review and put in place new patterns, to prevent us from suddenly becoming much too busy again and too quickly.

This has long been a challenge for me, particularly working as a member of the clergy, where often the busiest days of the week were at weekends when others were used to taking time off; and exacerbated somewhat by 'living on the job'. In that sense the pandemic has catapulted many others – forced to work from home and needing to create boundaries around what is work and when to rest – into a similar predicament.

As a Christian, I am struck by the mentions recorded of Jesus taking time out with family, friends and sometimes to be alone, by himself or in prayer with God. What I find, in the gospel records, is not so much a rigid patten to adopt slavishly but principles to work with and shape to the life and responsibilities I have. One of the consolations I find, as a person of faith, is that working out the practical details is not just about trial and error; rather, discovering God IS interested in our well-being and health at all times!

When it comes to new ways, new patterns and new disciplines I can, in faith and with resolve, declare 'With the help of God, I will.'

This is a moment, even a season, of new opportunities. Let's take time to move forward carefully; but doing so mindful that Christians invite everyone to know God close up and personal day by day.

As the Queen reminds us, this is a constant source of strength, on good days and bad days.

The dainty bells call us to pay our annual homage To catch a glimpse and catch our breaths of nature's generous beauty on display, The echo of birdsong, a halo to our view.



Spring has truly sprung, non-essential shops have opened and lockdown restrictions are slowly being eased. The road map is on track to release all restrictions on 21 June, with more social interaction permitted from 17 May. All this sounds great, but it is not necessarily good news for everyone, due to what psychologists call re-entry anxiety. The fact that we have been in lockdown for the best part of a year has given rise to anxiety - and even fear - about mixing with family and friends again. It is not that the fervent wish to see everyone again 'for real' rather than via FaceTime or Zoom is absent, it is simply that many of us have acquired the mindset that proceeding out into society once again seems a monumental task. Most of us have missed the normal round of life that is lived beyond the four walls of our homes. Yet we have become accustomed to our lockdown living and many of us may not feel ready to jump in and pick up our old lives.

The trick to resisting re-entry anxiety is to make modest steps in the first instance. Going to the gym, meeting one or two friends for lunch, or spending an afternoon with family you have not had the chance to see and hug are just a few of the many ways to get you back to something resembling a pre-Covid-19 life. Joining a group like the Papworth Craft Group would be a gentle reintroduction to mixing with others in a social setting, while enjoying the opportunity of two hours with your favourite craft without any domestic distractions.

The countrywide reports on the boom in sales of crafting materials would logically suggest that there will be some Papworth Everard residents, who, over the past year, have resumed their crafting hobby, or taken up a new one. Come to the first post-lockdown meeting of the Papworth Craft Group and show everyone what you have been making over the past year. There may be current group members who are concerned about venturing out after such an extended period of enforced isolation. When the first meeting is announced, prepare your craft bags and take the plunge! Everyone will have much to catch up on after such a long gap since the last meeting in March 2020, as well as a lot of finished projects to show off. Fingers crossed that 21 June will be the beginning of post-pandemic life!

A very big thank you to those ladies who have offered to knit squares for the charity blankets. Now that all the squares have been used up, there is a need to restock! A special mention and huge thank you to Sonja Allerton, who has spent the best part of the last 12 months joining squares to make blankets and crocheting borders around every one of them. There are large blankets and smaller ones, each one unique. When there were no more squares to join, Sonja began to crochet blankets. The large donation of yarn arrived just in time. For anyone who feels they would like to knit some squares, they should measure 20 cm x 20 cm or 8 inches x 8 inches. All ends sewn in please! For the most part the squares are knitted using double knitting yarn on

With only a few hours' notice, we were open for critical worker children and 5 days later the teachers were delivering at least 2 live lessons every day, teaching the children in school. In addition staff were also supporting small groups and working with individuals. I am very lucky to have such an amazing team who have worked tirelessly to support the education and welfare of the children of Pendragon. To all parents at home who managed to get their children ready for online lessons and supported their work during the day- congratulations you did a great job.

In addition, during this whirlwind of a year, we have been blown away by the support from the community of Papworth.

In the first instance the Papworth Community Group have provided much needed supplies to families in need from the impact of lockdown, furlough and children being at home every day, nonstop eating. Their group of volunteers have been available at a moment's notice to support in whatever way they could. The other crucial element of support was how members of the community supported us with electronic devices.
