

#### Speeding / Speed Watch Scheme

Over the few months we have been contacted by several residents expressing concerned at the speed at which vehicles travel through the village – not only on Ermine Street but on the side roads too, including Elm Way, Varrier Jones Drive, Chequers Lane and through the Summersfield estate.

Even though part of Ermine Street, from Jubilee Green to the north of the junction with Varrier Jones Drive, is subject to a 20mph limit and despite traffic calming measures, speed tables and give way points, cars are still driving through the village at quite a speed.

The Police will only undertake speed enforcement on adopted Highways, but without solid proof of speeding they are unable to commit to setting up speed cameras or taking action.

To provide the necessary proof, a SpeedWatch scheme could be set up in the village.

Areas where speeding is identified as an issue can then be considered for enforcement work by officers.

The Community SpeedWatch scheme, run by Cambridge Constabulary trains volunteers from members of the community to get actively involved in monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through their neighbourhood.

Volunteers are trained to use speed indicator devices which display vehicle speeds. The registered owner of any vehicle seen exceeding the speed limit is sent an advisory letter by the Constabulary, explaining that speeding is unacceptable to the local community and asking them to be more considerate.

Volunteers typically offer 1 to 2 hours a month helping to reduce the speed of vehicles driving through their neighbourhood. There is no expected time commitment, volunteers attend sessions when they like, and it's a great opportunity to meet new people, and enjoy the activity whilst benefiting your community.

All volunteers are fully trained and insured by the Constabulary.

To get a scheme up and running in the village would require a core of 8-10 volunteers to be trained and run the scheme – with groups of 3 people at a time running a speed check.

If you would be interested in volunteering to participate in a SpeedWatch scheme please let us know. If there is sufficient interest we will look to set a group up.

The Parish Council will also be looking into other measures to help to reduce the speed of vehicles travelling through the village.

#### **Outdoor Gym Equipment**

The Parish Council has approved funds to purchase some outdoor gym equipment for the benefit of the village and will shortly be having various exercise items installed on the playing field.

The exact date for installation is not yet confirmed but it is hoped that it will be installed in the next 8 weeks.

Research shows that being physically active can help us to lead a healthier and happier life and people who exercise regularly have a lower risk of developing many long-term (chronic) conditions.

The equipment will include items such as an Air Walker, Seated

Chest Press, Spin Bike, Cross Trainer and Rower and will be for use of anyone aged 14 and over. All the equipment is designed to be suitable for all abilities and the items have been selected to improve general cardiovascular fitness, balance, co-ordination and muscle strengthening and allow a low impact workout.

This is not children's play equipment and is intended for exercise only and will therefore be sited a little bit away from the main play area on the corner of the playing field to the rear of the Ermine St

N / Wood Lane Bus Shelter.

January's article discussed Paul McCartney - you might have heard of him, he was in The Beatles - you might have heard of them. Well, over the past few years their later albums have been cleaned up by the wizards at Abbey Road - not just given a quick remaster, but reconstructed from the individual multitrack master tapes. Let It Be should have come out for its 50 th anniversary last year, along with the related Get Back film, and hopefully both will later this year.

The latest to receive the Abbey Road rebuild is John Lennon - you might have heard of him, etc... Step 4 - not before 21 June https://www.gov.uk

#### **Social Contact**

By Step 4 which will take place no earlier than 21 June, the government hopes to be in a position to remove all legal limits on social contact.

#### **Business, Activities and Events**

We hope to reopen remaining premises, including nightclubs, and ease the restrictions on large events and performances that apply in Step 3. This will be subject to WWthe results of a scientific Events Research Programme to test the outcome of certain pilot events through the spring and summer, where we will trial the use of testing and other techniques to cut the risk of infection. The same Events Research Programme will guide decisions on whether all limits can be removed on weddings and other life events.

As we move through each of these phases in the roadmap, we must all remember that COVID-19 remains a part of our lives. We are going to have to keep living our lives differently to keep ourselves and others safe. We must carry on with 'hands, face, space'.

Comply with the COVID-Secure measures that remain in place. Meet outdoors when we can and keep letting fresh air in. Get tested when needed. Get vaccinated when offered. If we all continue to play our part, we will be that bit closer to a future that is more familiar.

## No meetings for the time being

I think he must be retrieving the coloured die from the peg and board memory game Colour Chess. Colour Chess is based on a circular board with 24 holes which accommodate 24 pegs which are coloured underneath. There is a single coloured die with all of

the six colours. The rules of the game are simple: each player rolls the die, and then picks out a peg. If the peg matches the colour on the die, then the peg is retained by the player, counting as a point, and the same player gets another go. The children have enjoyed lots of traditional tales this month, each week we focus on a new tale and the children have fun retelling it to the group using puppets and props. A huge favourite has been 'The Gingerbread Man'. We especially liked creating our own with our lovely smelling ginger playdough, and baking our own tasty gingerbread.

The children have been exploring shape, matching, ordering and sorting. We had lots of different sized gingerbread men to put in order and count, and we used some shape finders to help us spot shapes in the environment. While searching for shapes we had a lot of excitement as we noticed our plants have been growing very well. Soon we should have some sunflowers for our sunflower key group competition and tomatoes.

Our Forest school sessions have been much warmer than previous months and busier than ever. The children have had lots of enjoyment with their imaginative play; creating seesaws, trains and buses for their friends. # HOPE FARM'S FARMING CALENDAR UPDATE

The spring crops (spring oats, spring barley and spring beans), have been drilled and the hard work of the Hope farm team that has been carried out at the farm over the winter is really starting to show. Flowers are now coming into bloom and we have installed tree sparrow nest boxes too. No tree sparrows in resident yet, but still useful to lots of other species. Hedgelaying has also been forming an attractive border alongside the Elsworth-Knapwell footpath, becoming a haven for wrens and insects.



This spring had been very dry until a few weeks ago, and we, as well as many other farmers, have been rejoicing over the wet weather, saving crops from another season of drought that pose a huge pressure on the business. Where the fields are compacted after two years of very wet winters, that has been bad news as the roots struggle in the clay pot-like soil. Luckily, there are still many fields that have come into the spring in good condition, and the heavy soils held onto the moisture and nutrients better than some of the lighter soils might do on the sandy lands to the west of here.

The farm has always looked at farming with nature as a core aim of the RSPB, but more recently we are in need of reviewing our carbon footprint, looking for mitigation measures that create benefits for nature and the climate. Subsequently, an exciting new Agroforestry trial is now taking place at Hope Farm. There are strips of a range of wildflowers already established in the field next door to Knapwell, which reflect where the tree canopies will eventually be. The spring oats in that field are looking pretty good at the moment too.



The next stage of this project will be to plant the field with apple trees and hazelnuts in the winter. 13 varieties of apple tree have been chosen, including heritage varieties from local counties. The project will also use 2 varieties of cobnut to produce nut oil for sale. Additionally, a shelter belt will be planted on the west side of the field – including Field Maple, Hornbeam, Wild Cherry, Small leaved lime and Common Alder. With a few farmers also starting agroforestry across the country, and it already being relatively common practice on the continent, we plan to look at the impact of the trees on soil carbon, yield, and biodiversity, against a control field on the farm.



If you want to see the agroforestry field, there is a footpath running along the top/south of the field (see inserted photo), so that people from the local area can see what is happening. If anyone would like to be involved in helping out with the project as it develops, then please contact the Carbon Farming Project Manager – Sophie Mott (sophie. mott@rspb.org.uk).



Later in the year tree planting will be taking place and volunteers would be welcomed to take part in this activity – no experience required. This activity will be spread across November/December 2021 and January/February.

The map to the left shows the agroforestry field and an insert map of the entire farm for reference to indicate where the project field is located within the farm. The blue lines are footpaths, which run along the south side of the field for good viewing. The coloured

strips indicate which type of trees will be going where: The green strips are hazel trees, the pink strips are apple trees, and the orange strips are a mixture of non-cropping trees to provide wind protection and additional biodiversity benefits. The tree strips are not footpaths, but you can still get a good view from the footpath.

A plan of tree species will be available in the coming months once it has been finalised and will be published in a future edition of the Elsworth Times.
