An Apology

The Parish Council would like to offer an apology for the recent condition of the grassed areas around the churchyard, cemetery and Village Hall car park and grounds.

Over the past couple of months, the contractor employed by the Parish Council to maintain the play area, churchyard and cemetery and Village Hall grounds has not been fulfilling the terms of their contract and the maintenance of these areas has been irregular and far from the standard required.

This has unfortunately caused the cemetery and churchyard and village hall car park to become somewhat overgrown and unkempt.

The Parish Council have met on site with the Operations Manager from the company to work through the issues and have sought their assurance that the expected standards are maintained, and the areas are kept in a much more presentable state in the future.

We would like to offer our sincerest apologies that this has been allowed to happen.

The contractor, CGM Ltd has also issued the following apology:

"After visiting the churchyard, we can see that our service delivery fell below what we expect of our operatives. Moving forward we will endeavour to provide the service you both expect and deserve and apologise for any problems we may have created".

The Parish Council will monitor the standard of work over the coming months and take any further action as necessary.

Village Hall Bookings

It has been and extremely quiet time for the Village Hall over the past 18 months. The Hall has been closed for business due to the Covid restrictions and various lockdowns almost continuously since 23 March 2020.

Since 19 May, we have been able to open up to a few of our regular hirers who are permitted within Government guidelines to run their events in a covid secure manner, with full risk assessments being undertaken for each event prior to the booking being confirmed.

We hope to be able to reopen the hall fully for all events from 19 July - this is of course subject to the Government's restrictions being lifted on that date.

We are currently taking provisional bookings for events after 19 July – if you are looking for a venue to hold your event – from an exercise class or band practice to a wedding reception or birthday party please contact the Bookings Clerk for more information and to check available dates. villagehall@papwortheverardpc.org.uk

Outdoor Gym

You should soon see outdoor gym equipment being installed on the playing field on the corner to the rear of the Ermine St N / Wood Lane Bus Shelter.

This is not children's play equipment and is intended for exercise only and is therefore being positioned a little bit away from the main play area and trim trail.

All the equipment is designed to be suitable for all abilities and will be for use of anyone aged 14 and over. The items have been selected to improve general cardiovascular fitness, balance, co-ordination and muscle strengthening and allow a low impact workout and will include items such as an Air Walker, Seated Chest Press, Spin Bike, Cross Trainer and Rower.

Play Area / Paddling Pool

We are hoping to have the paddling pool ready for use for the start of the summer holidays.

With the end of social distancing restrictions (hopefully from 19 July) any pieces of play equipment currently out of use to aid social distancing, will be released.

As in previous years, temporary toilets will be sited at the play area for convenience.

With the high numbers of people using the paddling pool a huge amount of rubbish will be generated. Please use the rubbish bins at the play area or ideally take your rubbish home with you - please do not leave nappies in the bins!

We ask that everyone does their bit to ensure the pool it is clean and safe for everyone to use and enjoy. Do not allow children covered in mud and dirt to go in the pool and please remove any litter – debris and silt can easily block the filters. Please could we also request that children do not eat food whilst in the pool or in the area immediately round the poolside and that all food scraps are disposed of and not allowed to get into the water as food debris can easily get caught in the filtration system.

The paddling pool attracts families from far and wide, many of whom travel by car which can add to the parking problems on Ermine Street North and Varrier Jones Drive. If you are planning a visit the paddling pool why not leave the car at home and walk?

We would request that people who do drive park with consideration for other motorists, do not cause an obstruction and park within the rules of the Highway Code.

Regarding vegetables Chris suggested members could put some compost into a container, set some lettuce and spring onion seeds, then when they grow the leaves can be freshly picked as and when required.

Chris was a very entertaining speaker and considering she was suffering from a bad back she still kindly joined us from her granddaughters bed, for which we were very grateful.



Still on the subject of gardening, here are some lovely words from Daphne with supporting pictures from her garden.



Papaworth Surgery Patients Link

COVID-19 Vaccination Programme

Papworth Surgery will shortly be withdrawing from the Covid-19 vaccination service. Our last clinic is on Saturday 19th June at the Charles Hicks Centre. In future a second dose will be via the National Booking Service online at Coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccination - NHS or by calling 119.

You will be asked for your name, postcode and NHS number (patients can still book if they do not have this) and then you will be offered a choice of appointments at one of the local Vaccination Centres or Pharmacy sites offering the same vaccine as your first dose.

JCVI guidance recommends you receive your second dose between eight and 12 weeks after your first dose. However, if it has been over 12 weeks, you are still encouraged to book an appointment to receive your second dose to ensure you have maximum protection.

Awaiting first dose?

Once eligible, patients will be invited by the National Booking Service to book an appointment at one of the local Vaccination Centres or Pharmacy sites online via Coronavirus (COVID-19) vaccination - NHS or by calling 119.

For people under 40 without other health conditions, current advice is to have an alternative to the Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine. The COVID-19 vaccine is safe and effective and protects you and those around you. It is the biggest vaccination programme in NHS history and has already saved thousands of lives by preventing the spread of Covid-19. Please book your second dose without delay.

Non-NHS Services

Due to the increased workload through Covid, the turnaround for non-NHS administrative work including private letters and medical reports can be delayed by 2 – 4 weeks. Please bear with Papworth staff who are trying their best to complete paperwork in a timely manner.

The NHS does not pay for some of the services we provide. These include private sick notes, insurance forms, holiday cancellation forms, medical reports, fitness to travel certificates, firearms licencing, private prescriptions, passport signing and some vaccination services. Fees for these services, which are in line with BMA approved national guidelines, are displayed in the surgery.

Last month's article discussed John Lennon - you might have heard of him, he was in The Beatles - you might have heard of them. No sooner had the ink dried on that, came the announcement that the latest to get the remix/remake treatment was All Things Must Pass, the debut album by George Harrison - you might have heard of him, etc...

This triple vinyl (or double CD) album has been cleaned up by the wizards at Abbey Road - not just given a quick remaster, but reconstructed from the individual multitrack master tapes. Not only that, but expanded with an additional five records (or three CDs) of out-takes.

Nigel di Castiglione ... Team Rector Getting things in perspective

As I write the group stage games of the Euro 2020 football championship are under way. A big question is just how far can the teams from the 'home nations' (England, Scotland and Wales) get in the competition. The answer may well be known by the time you get to read this edition! Already

be known by the time you get to read this edition! Already there has been the shocking incident of a player from Denmark collapsing because of a cardiac arrest, which put the significance of the game and competition in a fresh light. Seeing the player's partner being comforted by team-mates whilst others were praying alongside their stricken colleague moved even the hardest of hearts.

Many people have remarked how life under the COVID constraints has forced a re-think about what really matters and highlighted some things are not terribly important. All over the country people are asking the same question about organisations and activities they have supported and worked for, often over many years.

In the past few weeks Christians have celebrated Ascensiontide, Pentecost and Trinity. We have been reminded Jesus left his first disciples with an enormous vision and almost no strategies for bringing it about; they would be his witnesses to the farthest corners of the known world – even though most of them had ventured hitherto, probably, no further than the distance between London and Cambridge. History tells us they caught the vision and, with God's help, fulfilled it; which is why we are beneficiaries today.

One of the means we have appreciated is the power of the internet; including how we connect with family and friends, for shopping – essential and otherwise(!) and also for being and doing church. Some things are quicker, others seem to take an interminable amount of time, whilst not a few just don't happen or seem important any longer.

As Christians this highlights the importance of Jesus having cast a vision and leaving the implantation to us; the mission remains unchanged whilst the means can evolve and change. It's all about extending our reach and influence rather than clinging on to methods and tactics that were ideal previously but need updating.

Currently I have a backlog of weddings on my radar; where couples were forced to cancel or needed to rearrange to ensure the people who need to be present could be there safely. It's a reminder marriage is one of those timeless entities and the way chosen happily by many as the way to flourish and build family. At the same time some of the precious times in the past year or so have been the small weddings – when only 15 or 30 was the upper limit of attendees – a throw-back to a previous generation when that was the norm because it was all people could afford.

This is a time to hold fast to the big visions God inspires and sit lightly to some of the methods, processes and events that seemed to have served us well thus far.

This month I thought it might be interesting to find out some history of the Day Centre, some investigation revealed that the Papworth and District Day Centre charity was established in March 1995, 26 years ago: just over a quarter of a century!

Entering the Day Centre there is a real sense of calm and nostalgia about the place and the feeling of a well-oiled machine that has operated like clockwork for ages. The ladies on one side of the room, the gents on the other. Three coffee tables arranged just so for tea/coffee then put back in order for the three card tables from the cupboard to be set up for dominoes, etc. (many of the ladies preferring to knit.) Then put tidily away again.

Then tables set out for lunch, with glasses of squash laid out on the tables, volunteer helpers eagerly queuing at the kitchen hatch with clients' specific vegetable preferences, etc.

Then onto the afternoon's entertainment, the nearest thing to a time machine, sometimes singing songs from many decades ago, or bingo, quizzes, and a variety of other games. Another round of tea/coffee, then home at 3pm after a great day.

The details of how the Day Centre runs under normal circumstances are below:

The cost is £13 per day including tea and coffee and a delicious two course meal cooked by our resident chef, Jane. We would normally meet every Tuesday between 10am until 3pm in The Community Centre, The Close, Papworth Everard. The centre is fully wheelchair accessible. Transport is available in certain cases.

So, when we get the all clear we will contact all our clients and hope to see you all again then. If you are not already on our list and would like to give it a try then please get in touch in readiness for our return.

The longest day of the year is already in the past and the country waits to see whether the majority of restrictions that were imposed, due to the Covid-19 crisis, will be lifted on 19 July. Experience over the 17 months since the initial lockdown would suggest that it is best to manage expectations and expect the unexpected. As it is, there will not be any meetings of the Papworth Craft Group in July, but hopefully meetings in August will be able to go ahead.

Since our last week was on the third Saturday in March 2020, there will be a lot of news to catch up on, not just about how everyone has coped with the difficulties of daily living through the pandemic, but what projects have been completed over that time.

Working with your hands is one of the most grounding activities one can do and there is evidence that handcrafts (and also gardening) have provided solace and comfort to many people during lockdowns. Some have rediscovered knitting, say, or cross stitch, while others have started from scratch, earnestly watching YouTube tutorials on the craft of their choice - thank heavens for its gift of teaching people how to crochet! Inspiration can be found in buckets on social media, especially Instagram and Pinterest. However, beware of the danger of feeling inadequate when seeing someone post that they have started and finished a huge cross stitch sampler in five days, or a king sized crocheted blanket in the blink of an eye.

It can be rewarding joining a sew along, (SAL), knit along, (KAL) or crochet along (CAL), whereby the pattern is released over a set amount of weeks. However, there are always those who post on social media that they have finished the current week's reveal less than twenty four hours after the release of the pattern! How do they do that? Do they even take time to eat?

Did you know that it is possible to do a PhD on wool? There are seventy two different breeds of British sheep. One young woman was so fascinated by this and the textiles that wool from individual sheep produced that she travelled all over the country, documenting them for her PhD. What an amazing direction to take a passion for wool! No one in the Papworth Craft Group is researching for a PhD in wool, crochet, thread or textiles - unless lockdown has inspired a group member to apply their passion in this way - but that does not mean that the joy of crafting is necessarily any less intense. At every meeting members have projects past, present and planned to share. Who has found a new yarn?

What are those interesting books over there? Look at that beautiful cross stitch piece that has been months in the making! This sharing is fundamental to the dynamic of the group and it is always pleasing when new members turn up and soon become an integral part of this dynamic. Put simply: We all really enjoy our meetings!


