## Will picked for Tokyo Olympics



William Hipwell - Papworth's Paralympic Candidate Tokyo 2020 BOCCIA Squad



Will is 34 years old and will be competing at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympics, Y0 2020 later this month.

Will grew up in Little Gransden, he has two brothers (one is his twin) and a Sister. He lives in Papworth with his younger brother. He will be competing in both the individual and team competitions for BOCCIA, his team mates are David Smith and Claire Taggart.

Boccia is a precision ball sport similar to bowls. It has been a competitive sport in the Paralympic Games since 1984. Is played by athletes who have any kind of neurological impairment that impacts their motor function, some athletes play with their

He started playing at an after school club but progressed through competition to National level after finishing university in Sheffield. In 2015 he joined the Great Britain BOCCIA squad and hasn't looked back since.

He trains weekly and during lockdown his father, who is a farmer, converted his grain store into a BOCCIA court and with a rowing machine at home to keep up his cardio fitness he has continued to train weekly ahead of the game.

He is very excited but nervous to be flying out on 20th Aug to Tokyo. His sister Alice will be travelling with him as his assistant.

#### PADDLING POOL

The paddling pool opened for the summer as planned on Sunday 18th July and is scheduled to be open until the weekend of 4th/5th September. A big thank you to Mark Honeywood for preparing the pool and passing on his knowledge and expertise to our Pool Attendants Fraser, Rahul and Will who are doing a great job of maintaining the paddling pool and ensuring the pool and surrounding area are kept clean and safe for our children to use.

As in previous years, temporary toilets have been sited at the play area for convenience with 2 toilet units and a disabled access toilet with baby change facility. The toilets are emptied and serviced by the toilet hire company a minimum of twice a week and checked daily.

The pool is maintained regularly throughout the day, every day – but please help us to keep the pool as clean as possible for everyone to enjoy.

Do not allow children covered in mud and dirt to go in the pool – dirt and silt can easily block the filters causing damage to the system. Please could we also request that children do not eat food whilst in the pool or in the area immediately round the poolside and that all food scraps are disposed of and not allowed to get into the water as food debris can also easily block the pool filters.

With the high numbers of people using the paddling pool a huge amount of rubbish is generated.

Please take your rubbish home with you whenever possible, including food scraps and wrappings and soiled nappies, and use the rubbish bins at the play area for general litter only.

The paddling pool attracts families from far and wide, many of whom travel by car which can create parking problems on Ermine Street North, Chequers Lane and Varrier Jones Drive.

If you are visiting the paddling pool why not leave the car at home and walk?

We would request that people who do drive, park with consideration for other motorists, do not cause an obstruction and park within the rules of the Highway Code.

How is it that one can marvel that seemingly small adjustments can have such an impact?



# Nigel di Castiglione ... Team Rector Why does everything have to change?

'In the good old days', the Open Golf Championship was shown from early in the morning until the last player finished for 4 consecutive days. First it was Henry Longhurst then Peter Alliss as anchors to the whole event. Now I have to make do with abbreviated highlights shown

in the evening; because I have not yet succumbed to paying for subscription TV offered by for a competitor to the BBC! I am a victim of change and, for now, I don't like it!

The trouble is I am rather selective over what changes I embrace and the ones I eschew or ignore! I wouldn't go back to the days when our home was heated by a couple of fires and an occasional burst of an electric fan heater! Similarly, I have now become a fan of 'on-line' banking or shopping.

One of the 'big issues' facing the church in the UK is about how to respond to change – in terms of opportunity and expectations. There are big debates (that won't be settled speedily) about resources, buildings, whether and which posts should be paid for etc; also, more fundamentally, what it means to be human, and how best to live under God and with one another. The challenge is to distinguish wisely between the things that are essential and unalterable and others that are peripheral and very much of secondary or contextual significance; which is where and why so many struggle to agree with others!

Part of the Christian good news is this: God is committed to us changing, with His help, for the better and to be able to fulfil our potential. But as with some of the aforementioned examples, God looks for our co-operation and respects our yes or no response.

As this article reaches you, a new academic year will have begun. For some this means new clothes have been acquired, new equipment obtained, new goals set, and new relationships begun. In this setting, change is about moving on, growing up, reaching for new horizons. It would be boring, stultifying and life-sapping if things did not change.

I do not pretend to be a fount of wisdom about logistical changes being thrust at us locally – in terms of road developments, the route for the EWR and so on. But one thing I glean, as a Christian, reading the Bible is this: choices I make now have consequences down the line for others – for family, friends, colleagues and acquaintances. Therefore, I cannot afford to think just about what suits me today; and sometimes it is only when we think enough about such matters that we see underlying flaws in arguments and how changes are presented, that need correcting or challenging!
