

News Update

Housing Maintenance Updates

Papworth Trust are undergoing a programme of external redecoration to 67 properties on Ermine Street North and South. The work will be started this financial year and be completed by the end of March 2022. The contractor providing this work will be CLC Ltd. Tenants will receive communication from the Trust when the work is to commence.

Papworth Trust are aware that one of our contractors has issued paper flyers to some of our tenants in respect of works taking place in the coming months. Unfortunately, they did this without our knowledge and the letter did not have the information required. We apologise to anyone affected by this and are working with the contractor to ensure the right information is disseminated by the appropriate persons.

Papworth Trust encourage our tenants and those who call in on their behalf to try and avoid peak times to ensure you get through to someone that can help you quickly. Our busiest times are generally Monday mornings and Friday afternoons with the mornings being the busiest period. If we do not answer the call straightaway it is because our lines are busy whilst we manage other calls. Each call is placed into a queuing system and will be answered where possible. Alternatively, you can leave a voicemail message on the answerphone facility, you will hear a beep and can then leave a message providing your name and contact number. We would respectfully ask tenants to not persistently call unless it is an emergency.

External influences such as Covid 19, Brexit, the 'pingdemic' & a UK National HGV driver shortage have had a direct impact on how the Trust are currently delivering the Housing Maintenance services. As a result, the Trust are balancing, as best as possible, our service standards whilst facing material shortages and resource issues. Furthermore, Papworth Trust Teams have been directly and negatively impacted by Covid 19, the 'pingdemic' and staff shortages. We appreciate our tenants understanding and co-operation whilst we continue to address all outstanding reported repairs.

Changes to Booking System

Updated 24th August 2021

Patients who have a medically urgent problem should telephone the surgery to request a same day appointment. We only have a small number of 'on the day' appointments available.

These appointments are released at 8:30 AM and 1:30 PM so you may be asked to call back at one of these times.

Please note this is a change from the previous time of 12 Noon.

If your problem is not medically urgent, you will be offered a pre-bookable appointment for as soon as possible.

Patients' Link is there to represent all surgery users and to help raise funds for additional surgery equipment.

It is also your opportunity to meet and chat with doctors from the surgery.

Tree Warden

As the newly appointed voluntary Tree Warden for Papworth I want to encourage us all to appreciate, care for and celebrate the trees and woods in and around the village.

Trees Please

Trees are important for our health and well being. They provide shade, shelter, colour, fruit, blossom, habitat and history. Deciduous or evergreen; mature specimen, woodland group or planting scheme; garden feature or vigorous hedgerow: they give beauty, grandeur and structure to our surroundings.

Many of the most important trees in Papworth are protected, either by tree preservation orders, conservation area designation or planning conditions. They enhance the local scene and the wider landscape. They lift our spirits and deserve to be celebrated. Each season brings a renewal of their value to us. From Spring to Winter, they set the mood and colour of village and countryside.

Trees teem with life, both biological and mythical. Beetles and spiders, moths and caterpillars, wasps and swarming bees; birds roosting, singing, nesting and feeding; climbing squirrels, and, below, foxes' earth and badgers' holt; fungus, lichen, ivy and more.



Mystery and folk lore, magical story and darkest fairy tale. The mystery of the Wild Wood in the Wind in the Willows and the romance of Sherwood Forest. Adventures with Rupert in Nut Wood and Pooh in the One Hundred Acre Wood. The Ents marching on Isengard in Lord of the Rings, the coming of Birnam Wood to Dunsinane in Shakespeare's Macbeth. Woods and trees fire the imagination of us all.

More Trees Please

There is an initiative to plant more trees across the UK to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. Called the 'Queen's Green Canopy', the initiative invites everyone – individuals, schools, community groups, corporates - to enhance the environment by planting trees from October through to the end of the Jubilee year in 2022.

It would be good to hear if any individuals or local groups are going to follow this up.

As well as inviting the planting of new trees, the Queen's Green Canopy will dedicate a network of 70 Ancient Woodlands across the UK and identify 70 Ancient Trees to celebrate Her Majesty's 70 years of service.

Fancy a new challenge this autumn? Why not give your local choir a try! Sing Papworth is back to rehearsing, and we're looking forward to welcoming some new faces.

We're a friendly community choir based in Papworth Everard, with members coming to us from Papworth and the surrounding villages. Led by musical director Jenni Pinnock, we meet on Monday evenings 8-9.30pm, usually at Pendragon Community Primary School (rehearsals include breaks and often refreshments!). All are welcome - whether you're a complete newcomer to singing or have sung in choirs before. Notation reading not necessary (many of our members don't read!) - just the willingness to come along and give it a go.

We sing a wide variety of repertoire, from classical to pop, folk songs to musicals. We aim to hold a couple of concerts every

year, and participate in local events where possible. We'd love to see you no matter your voice type (and even if you're not sure!) - but we'd particularly like to boost the number of male voices in our ranks! We're keeping aware of COVID-19 best practice by having spacing between choir members, additional ventilation and hand sanitising in our rehearsals, alongside keeping records in case of any positive cases.

PAPWORTH TO CAXTON GIBBET PATH / CYCLEWAY

Good News!!

Work on the path/cycleway between Papworth and Caxton Gibbet roundabout is due to start very soon.

You may have seen that street lighting posts at the roundabout to the south of the village have already been moved back from the edge of the road in preparation for the cycleway to be built.

It has been confirmed by the Interim Team Leader Infrastructure, Project Delivery at Cambridge County Council, that an order for work has been placed with the contractor, Milestone, and work will be starting w/c 18th October 2021.

Site clearance work and the set-up of the site office will take place during that week prior to the construction work starting from Monday 25th October.

It is anticipated that the work will take approximately 12 weeks to complete, with construction happening overnight where possible - some road closures are to be expected during the works.

Diversions will be in place via the A428 and B1040 with a temporary reduction of the speed limit along parts of the A428. Diversions will be clearly signposted, with traffic travelling southbound out of the village towards Caxton Gibbet continuing to use the A1198 and traffic coming northbound into the village using the diversion via the A428 / B1040 at Eltisley to re-join the Papworth bypass.

Due to the Caxton Gibbet to Black Cat A428 road improvement programme, the cycleway will stop at the I-Way Inn with the remaining section to be laid with a temporary surface until the A428 junction improvements are complete when the final section of the cycleway will be installed.

It is also anticipated that the A1198 between Papworth and Caxton Gibbet will be resurfaced once the project is complete.

More information will be posted on social media as it becomes available.

OUTDOOR GYM

We are still waiting for the last few items of equipment to be installed, but it is great to see that the items already installed are being well used!

Please remember this is not children's play equipment and is designed for users aged 14+ who are at least 1.4m tall and weigh no more than 300lbs.

Please only use the equipment if you are sure you can work it safely and for its intended use. If you have any doubts about your health or fitness, you should consult a doctor or health professional before embarking on any new fitness regime.

The equipment will be regularly inspected, but items should not be used if they appear damaged or broken. Any damage should be reported to the Parish Clerk.

Instructions on how to use the item is attached to each piece of equipment, but detailed below are the benefits of each of the pieces of equipment:

The Cross Trainer - is designed to give users a great cardiovascular workout, as well as improving muscle tone in the legs and arms. it will go as slow or as fast as you wish to support you warming up or working out.

The Spinning Bike - is a classic gym machine. This cardiovascular piece equipment works the lower body, whilst improving heart and lung function. All mechanisms are concealed within the housing, making the Spinning Bike extremely safe as well as protected from the elements.

The Overhead Ladder - is a popular piece of equipment. You can transition from one side to the other, individually or in friendly competition with family members! You can also do a range of pull up exercises, wide grip, or close grip. There are two step up bars to facilitate getting on and off the equipment safely and easily. The design of the Ladder inspires beginners to exercise to try it out and more active people use this piece to build upper body strength (especially their shoulders, arms and back).

The Chest Press / Seated Row - is an upper body double station that gives users a fantastic workout. Giving two exercises for the price of one, this is a really popular piece of equipment. Based on lifting approximately 30% of your body weight, this machine works the chest and arms on one side and the arms and back on the other, giving a great upper body workout for all abilities.

Rower - Provides a full-body work-out and helps to tone upper and lower body muscles and develop general cardiovascular fitness. The rower allows the user to perform gentle exercises with no strain on the joints and is ideal for low impact workouts or warm-ups.

Sit on the seat and place your feet on the footrests, keep your back flat and start rowing. Gradually increase the speed and intensity to make the exercise more challenging.

Balance Beam - The fitness balance beam is a great way to improve balance and co-ordination with multiple uses with support from resistance bands.

Air Walker - helps to tone the calf and thigh muscles and improve general cardiovascular fitness, balance, and co-ordination. The air walker allows the user to perform gentle exercises with no strain on the joints and is ideal for low impact workouts or warm-ups

Swing your legs back and forth whilst keeping your abs tight and maintaining a neutral spine.

Sit Up Bench - Specially designed to provide safe yet intense core workout, the Sit Up Bench is suitable for all abilities from beginners upwards. The Bench is perfect for push-ups, exercises to work your back and core, sit-ups, tricep dips, step ups and jump ups.

Opening Up Again?

Things seem to be opening-up again, but a lot of people are testing positive with the virus; many plans are prefaced as 'COVID-permitting'. Meanwhile there is a definite

autumnal feel, daylight hours are noticeably shorter, and there are obvious shortages on some supermarket shelves. Everyday life remains a challenge to many folk.

Maybe this is a feature of the 'new-norm'; it irks those who like to think they are in control of their lives and goes against the grain of our western cultural expectations. On the other hand, maybe it is a wake-up call that will foster a new sort of resilience, a new thankfulness for the blessings of the present, and a new realisation we need to work together locally, nationally and globally, for the common good; in ways that are able to react according to the needs of others rather than to suit our own convenience.

This is one of the insights mobilising climate-change activists. Some may not like some of the inconveniences caused – such as motorways being blockaded – but surely it is time for more of us to listen and take all the actions we can. Little things do make a difference especially when they are built into daily and regular routines. It is inspiring to see how many younger people and children are 'on message' in this and something important to teach, even chastise, some of us who are older but not always wiser!

This is the season when we are giving thanks for the Harvest and being reminded of God's goodness; that we are stewards of this world and have a responsibility to play our part now for the benefit of generations to come. As a Team of local churches we are also extending this season and holding (in Caxton Church, October 31st at 10.30am) a special service to help us to centre our thoughts and responses to the crucial climate-change congress in Glasgow during November; do join us if you can.

One of the powerful messages Jesus gave his followers was that we can learn from nature about how we can best relate to God for the everyday things we need (and often take for granted). Therefore, when we want to grab what we can now, hoard unnecessarily, and live from fear these 'internal drives' may well be indicating a need to re-connect with God as Maker and Saviour.




