Please be assured the number of clinical appointments available for patients will not reduce!

The Pharmacy opening hours will not be changing, they will still close between 13:00 and 13:30

Demand for services

The demand for our services remains at an unprecedented level throughout the whole day! If you have a medically urgent problem then please phone at either 8.30am or 1:30pm to try and get a same day appointment. We appreciate that some people are getting frustrated that all of the appointments have gone by the time they get through. Please be assured that our receptionists are answering the phones as quickly as they can, but with a finite number of appointments available, it is inevitable that some patients are disappointed. If your problem can wait, it may be easier for you to ask for a pre-bookable appointment, which can be booked, a week or two in advance. Please be kind to our receptionists, they really have had a tough year and will always do their best to get you the help you need.

Update on Covid Vaccinations

As you are probably aware by now, Papworth Surgery are not involved in the Covid booster vaccinations this time but we felt it was important to give an update on the booster.

Clarification regarding booster dose timescales. Following national media coverage of the Government announcement over the last few days that eligible people can now pre-book their booster appointment through the National Booking Service after 5 months have passed since their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, we understand that there has been some confusion among patients with regards to the timescales for booster doses.

We can confirm that booster doses are still being offered after at least 182 days have passed since an eligible patient's second dose. Patients who are in the eligible groups can pre-book before this time by visiting www.nhs.uk/covidvaccine or by calling 119. Whilst they can pre-book after 5 months, or 152 days, have passed since their second dose, they will only be offered appointments from 6 months (182 days) after their second dose.

Tree Warden Report

Trees Please 3

The autumn colours have been glorious this year and the leaves have lingered on the trees late into November. Soon, strong winds and frosty mornings will strip the trees of their last few leaves.

Wildlife becomes more visible. Our regular friends, the Starling, Blackbird and Robin are easy to spot but you could also look out for visitors such as the Fieldfare, Redwing and Waxwing. Keep a note of what, where and when you spot any birds; make a recording of their song; start a sketch book. You are likely to see other wildlife in the woods at this time of year. Keep you eyes open and your senses alert!



Of course, as our deciduous trees shed their golden leaves, we appreciate even more the grandeur and contribution of our evergreen pine and fir. The character of their bark, the sweep of their branches, the intricacies of their needles and leaves. Pine cones looking like fat candles at this time of year.

Trees of Christmas



having Christmas Trees in our homes at this time of year comes from 16th century Germany. Brought to this country during the reign of George III and enthusiastically supported by Queen Victoria and Prince Albert. Ever since 1947, Norway has donated a tree to London to say thank you for helping them during World War II. A special ceremony is held

The tradition of

in Norway in November, when the tree is cut down in the forest. It is then transported to the UK, to be put up in Trafalgar Square and decorated in the traditional Norwegian way, with strings of lights going down the tree, rather than cross-crossing it.

Another tree with Christmas connections is the Holly. Before holly was hung in houses to accompany Christmas trees, it was considered to be a sacred plant by the Druids and is now full of symbolism for Christians. While other plants wilted in winter weather, holly remained green and strong, its berries a brightly

coloured red in the harshest of conditions. Before the 1800s the Christmas tree was actually a Holly tree.

Another Christmas staple is the Mistletoe, steeped in folklore and midwinter tradition. Nowadays you might put a sprig in the house under which to kiss your sweetheart. It grows on the branches of trees such as hawthorn, poplar and lime where there is plenty of light. It's seeds are spread by birds such as the Blackcap. So look up and enjoy the spectacle of large bunches of mistletoe with their distinctive pairs of symmetrical evergreen leaves and white, almost translucent berries.

Soon it will be Christmas Day!

I, like a few others I have spoken to, find the pandemic has left me with a sense of time lost; '...did we do such and such then or was that now 2 years ago?' being the sort of thing we are saying.

One of the joys of this Autumn has been the opportunity to get back into most of our local schools, to share in Collective Worship and to be a visible presence again.

Of course, everyone is being careful and clearly infections are very much in evidence all over the area. However, the prospect, we hope, of being able to sing carols together, re-tell the nativity events with one another and to have 'a normal Christmas' once more is both exciting and still somewhat tentative. At the same time the health and social care structures we all need are under immense pressure, with very real concerns locally as to just how these vital services will be able to just get through the winter. They need our ongoing prayers allied to sensible behaviour from all of us.

This sort of uncertainty is at the heart of what may have been felt when Jesus was born, as Mary and Joseph set off from their home to go to Jerusalem to satisfy the politicians demands of their time. That said, it is the story of what happened then and there, and what God was doing through one - apparently insignificant family – that has dominated global history rather than the census demanded by the Caesar of the day. This reminds us that God can use the machinations of human behaviour (eg to get Mary and Joseph to the place where the Christ was to be born) but is often doing something far more important than what registers in our thinking and perspective at the time!

In this respect, as many will be struggling with the sharp rise in prices (when filling our cars, meeting the huge cost of energy price spikes as well as the obvious increase in food bills and the like) let me suggest this Christmas should be less about how much can we spend to make up for who and what we missed in 2020, and more about who can we re-connect with and what sort of giving can we do that will make a real difference for others for whom this is a very worrying time.

A favourite carol for some is 'In the bleak midwinter'. The final verse picks up something of what I am saying – both in relation to God, but also one another. The opening line is What can I give him, poor as I am? ... Sometimes it is when we sing such carols or hymns we start to tune into the whispers of God about what we can do and often want to do, if only someone reminds me!

There will be a number of Carol services and concerts all over the area in the next few weeks. Please think of joining us and others and make this a very special celebration of Jesus' birth as Saviour, for all humankind.

Christmas is fast approaching, but the meetings of the Papworth Craft Group remain suspended. This is hugely disappointing. The library is restricted to sixteen people at any one time and until a health and safety review takes place, there is no prospect of holding meetings of the group.

The rationale behind these monthly musings is very straightforward - to act as an ongoing reminder that the group still exists and hopefully catches the eye of crafters, who have not yet attended the meetings. NEW MEMBERS will be very welcome indeed. There have been frequent mentions in this column about a huge rise in people resuming craft and taking it up for the first time - due to successive LOCKDOWNS. Many people have had time on their hands over the past eighteen months. This triggered interest in crafting, gardening and cooking. The intermittent scarcity of the related products attests to this, with retailers reporting a huge rise in sales. Surely there are some of these people here in Papworth Everard! If you knit, crochet, cross stitch, embroider or quilt and patchwork, we would be so pleased to see you at our first meeting, whenever that may be.

Last month saw another 50th anniversary release by The Beatles - you might have heard of them – this time of Let It Be. This album has been cleaned up by the wizards at Abbey Road - not just given a quick remaster, but reconstructed from the individual multitrack master tapes. Not only that, but expanded with an additional four records (or four CDs) of out-takes.

The original album production by Phil Spector was in his trademark murky 'wall of sound' style and the new version is a whole lot clearer. The recordings were considered subpar at the time and only the Get Back single was released. Within weeks the band were back at EMI to make their final recordings (which became the Abbey Road album). Spector's mix of the album was released after the band had split.

As I write it is the eve of the Get Back film, documenting the Let It Be recording sessions at Apple Corps, and the rooftop concert at Saville Row, shown in three parts (each of two hours).

Let's hope we can all get together in early Spring to hear Let It Be in full clarity. Until then... keep healthy, support your local record shops, our equipment provider Criterion Audio, and your local café.


