Papworth Fire Station to Close after 60 years

I am writing to inform you about changes to your local fire station that will hopefully enable us to improve our service to you.

Papworth fire station is crewed by on-call firefighters, which means they do not work from the fire station during the day, instead they respond to an alerter when they are needed and need to live within five minutes of the station to do this.

We are currently struggling with the availability of our fire engine at Papworth, particularly in daytime hours. This means that we do not have enough on-call firefighters available locally to respond to the fire station. Therefore, on around half of occasions, if someone dials 999 in the Papworth area, a fire engine will

come from elsewhere. This situation has worsened since the hospital moved, as it was a significant employer in the area and staff who worked there were able to be on-call firefighters and respond from work. With the hospital now in Cambridge, our staff who work there can no longer respond in the day.

In 2010, when Cambourne was being developed and plans to move the hospital were being muted, we foresaw this issue and used Section 106 money from the developers to build a fire station in Cambourne. We built a modern training facility on the site too knowing that when the hospital did move, our risk profile would likely change and we would likely need to move the fire engine from Papworth to Cambourne. The growing population of Cambourne would also give us more of an opportunity to recruit on-call firefighters who could be available in the day as there would be more employment and residents.

Since the hospital moved, things have played out as we predicted. We have struggled to have enough firefighters available to respond in the day and have been stationing our roaming pump (a fire engine with a full time crew that can be located anywhere in the south of the county where availability of on-call fire engines is limited) at Cambourne to cover the shortfall and ensure we can meet our target response times for incidents in the Papworth area. This is not a long term solution though and is a resource only available in the day.

The hospital was also our greatest risk in the area and now this has moved, the risk in Cambourne with the significant growth in houses is becoming greater.

So taking everything into consideration, we have decided it is the right time to relocate the fire engine and crew currently based at our fire station on Ermine Street to the fire station in Cambourne. We will also undertake a recruitment drive to recruit more on-call firefighters to the station, particularly looking for those who can provide daytime cover. This means we will be able to provide Papworth and Cambourne with a better service and faster response time than we do now.

The facilities at Cambourne are also far better, providing our on-call



firefighters with greater comfort and a modern training building. It would cost thousands of pounds to replicate this at Papworth. The plan is to begin the process of moving in March, which we anticipate will take a few weeks. During this time, the availability of the fire engine to respond will not be impacted. Following the relocation, the station will be fully decommissioned with the site likely to be sold.

We appreciate that the station has been a key part of the community in Papworth for many years, but we have to respond to changing risk and opportunities in order to continue to deliver the best service we can to everyone. Moving to Cambourne provides more opportunity to recruit on-call firefighters which in turn will lead to a better response from us if you need our services.

We'd like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has supported Papworth fire station over the years, either as on-call firefighters or attending car washes, open days and other events at the station. We hope you continue to support the crew as they move to Cambourne.

I would also like to thank our current on-call firefighters at the station who live in both Cambourne and Papworth. They are an incredibly dedicated crew who go out of their way to ensure the fire engine and high volume water pump (one of our specialist vehicles that can be called out nationally) are available as often as possible to make the current situation the best it can be. Some of the crew have served at Papworth for nearly 40 years and we are extremely grateful for their service.

Sebastian came along to help us too.


The trees are just saplings at the moment but will hopefully grow to form an avenue of trees down to the new gate for the Haven; our environmental area.

'When the wind blows'

Storms Dudley, Eunice and Franklin have wreaked havoc. Power cuts, fallen trees, fences destroyed, travel plans disrupted, severe flooding and, tragically, lives lost. Just a few of the consequences experienced by many all over the UK. Once again, we feel vulnerable.

It's not all bad. Sometimes these storms highlight weaknesses we knew about or suspected and could have addressed earlier. At the same time wind power is now an

increasingly valuable source of much-needed power as prices rocket for fossilfuel alternatives which signals how something can be both very good as much as it can be destructive.

Nevertheless, we are not in control of our lives, despite our best efforts. I am thinking, for example, of the person who tripped unexpectedly and had to be hospitalised for urgent surgery; one minute enjoying a casual conversation, the next moment in unwanted agony and distress. These things erupt and take their toll as much more than unwanted interruptions – they demand an immediate response that inevitably get in the way of good and long-awaited plans; they remind us not to put off until tomorrow what can be done today.

This is especially true where personal relationships are concerned. COVID has highlighted the need to keep short accounts with one another, to end each day without the sun going down on anger, to make sure nothing has been left unsaid that will make a difference, bring comfort and the knowledge we have done and said everything needed and possible.

This issue of the magazine will arrive with you during Lent and the run-up to Easter. One of the tragic stories we touch upon as Christians is the betrayal of Judas Iscariot. There is an easily missed and little-known comment on his behaviour towards Jesus tucked away in the gospel text: when Judas saw what he had done resulted in Jesus being condemned "... he changed his mind and brought back the 30 pieces of silver..." Sadly, there is no sign of his remorse prompting him to seek out Jesus and say sorry. He died subsequently a broken and deeply distressed person.

At the heart of the Christian narrative whereby in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus all we need to secure forgiveness and reconciliation with God, our response is required to make this effective for us. The same is true in other relationships – however much I forgive offences someone may do against me there is no real restoration of the relationship unless a perpetrator owns the wrong, expresses remorse and seeks to repair the bonds of trust that were broken.

If unexpected storms can be a gift, let them prompt us to put things right now with God and one another that need dealing with. We can't afford the luxury of thinking they can wait until spring comes and balmy summer evenings arrive. For some that may be too late.

Tree Warden Report

The storms of February remind us of the power of nature and the vulnerability of some of our trees. It was sad to see reported that the old elm tree, beside the former nurses home in Church Lane, fell victim to those very strong winds. But the collapse and break up of this noble tree allows us a glimpse into the pattern, shape, history

and character of this venerable structure.

Elm trees were once a dominant feature of the English landscape. Introduced by our Bronze Age ancestors, their tall form graced our field edges and woodlands with their broad umbrella shaped tops or billowing hemispheres. It is a deciduous tree with oval serrated leaves and winged fruit. The bark is grey brown, rough and fissured, often with suckers growing from the base of the trunk. The flowers of the elm are dark pink to red and hang in tassels, appearing between February and March.

Mature trees grow to 30m and can live for more than 100 years. However, the population of English elms has been decimated by Dutch Elm Disease since the 1960s. Dutch Elm Disease is a serious fungal disease, spread from tree to tree by elm bark beetles. The disease, for which there are no effective controls, is known as 'Dutch' because important early research on it was carried out in the Netherlands.

Historically, elms have been regularly associated with death, perhaps due to their readiness to drop massive branches without warning, or maybe to the use of their wood for making coffins.

Elm wood is strong and durable with a tight-twisted grain and is resistant to water. It has been used in decorative turning and to make boats and boat parts, furniture, wheel hubs, wooden water pipes, floorboards and, as mentioned, coffins.

A fallen elm features in the wonderful poem: 'As the Team's Head Brass' by Edward Thomas, written in 1916.







It's a poem about the war but it takes the form of a conversation between the poet, who sits 'among the boughs of the fallen elm that strewed an angle of the fallow' and the ploughman skillfully managing his team of horses as they plough the field. Do look it out.

There will be a lot more speculation in newsprint and on social media before it is decided if there has been a permanent change to our weather patterns. What we can say is, this year, February was a very windy month when, sadly, so many trees up and down the country were destroyed or damaged.

And what of March, with its reputation for also being a windy month? William Morris, the 19th century artist, designer and poet, wrote a poem entitled 'A Message of the March Wind' which includes this verse:

'Hark, the wind in the elm-boughs! from London it bloweth,

And telleth of gold and of hope and unrest, Of power that helps not; of wisdom that knoweth, But teacheth not aught of the worst and the best.'






PAPWORTH TENNIS CLUB NEWS
