The Parish Council will be holding its Annual Parish Meeting on Wednesday 25th May at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. The meeting is open to all residents of the village and is a chance to hear what the Parish Council has been up to over the last year and for electors to ask questions or have their say on anything which they consider is important to the people of the parish.

CYCLEWAY PROGRESS UPDATE

Finally the end is in sight!

The main scheme is still on schedule for completion by 31 March 2022. This includes the main cycleway itself (completion due 31 March 2022) and the carriageway surfacing scheme undertaken alongside main works programme which was completed on 25th March.

The final stretch from south of the Iway Inn Hotel through to the roundabout, was not included in the final scope of the main scheme as this section of the road will be significantly affected by the A428 development works planned to be delivered by National Highways. However, the opportunity has arisen to deliver work to provide a temporary solution for this section of the route, using savings from the main scheme. These works would provide a temporary link to create a more user-friendly route through to the roundabout.

Work will include procurement and installation of signposts, sign plates and bolt down kerbs and posts along the stretch of the newly surfaced lay-by, which will stop being a lay-by and become a section of the temporary link to the roundabout.

The footway will be extended to the roundabout using unbound materials. The final surface will be a compacted granite dust (4mm to 0 grading). This surface is suitable for wheeled users including those with mobility challenges.

The estimate is that the work will take 10 days (2 working weeks) and the contractors are available to undertake the work from 1 April.

The work will be carried out under the existing southbound lane closure of the A1198 Ermine Street South with the diversion route in place as has been the case for the main scheme. There are 10 working days from 1 April which could be used to deliver the additional work in time to take the traffic management and diversion route off by close on Thursday 14 April and it is anticipated that no work will take place from 15 April through to and including Monday 18 April to avoid the Easter break. Any overrun of work will be completed the following week and the road space booking has therefore been extended to 22/04/2022.

Tree Warden Report

My thoughts, our thoughts, have all been with the people of Ukraine at this time. We condemn the aggression, pray for peace and reach out to provide humanitarian support.

Let's talk about Ukraine. Their national plant is the Sunflower. It was introduced to the country in the 18th century and sunflower oil became very popular during Lent (we are in Lent now) as an

alternative to butter and lard which was forbidden by the Orthodox Church during that season. Today, this versatile crop covers huge swathes of central Ukraine; in happier times bringing joy, beauty, symbolism, and snacks to the people of Ukraine. We see the yellow flower in the flag of the country and it has been seen as a symbol of resistance during these troubled times. Perhaps we should all plant sunflower seeds this spring.



The National tree of Ukraine is said to be the willow. Willows occur along riverbanks and canal banks, road ditches, and dam slopes in Ukraine, and there are at least 30 different varieties.

The willow is a tree that blossoms in early spring and signifies the beginning of a new life, according to Orthodox custom. For Ukrainians, the willow branches are a substitute for palms on Palm

Sunday. Willow Sunday is the popular name for the feast, while Willow Week is the name for the entire week to Easter. Pussy-willow branches are blessed in the church and Ukrainians used to tap each other with the willow branches after Palm Sunday ceremonies, to pass on good health, riches, and happiness. Repeating the wish: "Be as tall as the willow, as healthy as the water and as rich as the Earth.'.

As you may know, we are blessed with many beautiful willow trees around the village. Perhaps we should arrange to tie a blue and yellow sash around one of them as we continue to grieve for the situation in Ukraine.

The National bird of Ukraine is the common nightingale, a small bird with a beautiful and powerful voice. The bird is an essential element in Ukrainian folklore as a harbinger of spring and a voice of sweet, happy sounds. A good place for us to go and hear nightingales this spring would be nearby Paxton Pits, at Little Paxton. I am pleased I had a hand in establishing this large Local Nature Reserve in 1988.

On other matters, I had a recent meeting with the Papworth Trust. The Trust owns and manages significant areas of housing and amenity land around the village. Public and tenant safety is a high priority and so, following a detailed tree survey, there is now a programme of tree works being implemented, to reduce risk. The need for some felling and pruning was highlighted by the impact of gale force winds in February and March. I hope to encourage replanting on suitable sites and where possible.

What a good job has been done by Jenny Wilson to brighten up and extend the WI garden beside the library. A patch of colour for everyone to enjoy and a delight for bees and butterflies.

Well done Jenny.

'Being real in a time of crisis'

One of the readings (in churches) during Lent felt especially timely this year, as our hearts are savaged by the horrors we watch and hear of from Ukraine. Jesus cried out: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem ..." At the same time, we would be wrong to ignore other issues ongoing in the church, the locality and the nation. Christianity has always been about us offering light to dispel darkness and salt to provide seasoning and protection for today and what can unfold in generations to come

Lament is a form of complaint; a strong expression of regret; a passionate expression of grief. In terms of spiritual outpouring, lament becomes a way of us searching for understanding and peace in the face of suffering or distressing events.

The Bible is a rich depository for such a time as now. For example, more than half the Psalms are laments; when we find Jesus offering his lament over the state of Jerusalem, he is drawing on the rich tradition of his Jewish identity and heritage. This same heritage has made a similarly profound contribution to our own history. I realise not everyone reading this column has a Christian worldview. Even so I hope you will find it helpful to be reminded of what our Jesus offered into this area of public life and thinking.

Jesus' lament was visceral; definitely not politically correct! On one occasion he refers to a leader as 'that fox', an expression implying strong distaste. There is no prevailing evidence in the gospels of people thinking sympathetically: "... Jesus you are so wrong ... you have swallowed fake news ... you need to be properly informed and if you were you would not speak like that ..." There is permission here for us, having done our research, to offer deep and strong feelings. On the big issues of our time, this is no time to be silent if our main concern is not offending someone; that was the mistake made by huge swathes that turned blind eyes to the Holocaust in World War 2 and so much other suffering.

Jesus' lament set aside the personal risks. Convictions including what we believe, how we serve others and seek the common good should not be reduced to what is merely the art of being risk averse. Therefore, we applaud and support sacrificial responses to the situation in Ukraine and our response to those needing shelter and support now. We also look to do more; for those with power and influence to use it beyond the narrow concerns of what will benefit me, us.

Jesus' lament becomes a cry of sorrow for a city, its history and prevailing culture. Many people, probably including ourselves ... know what it is to say or feel 'Woe is me ...' to feel unjustly treated, not given a fair crack of the whip, bemoan how things turn out for me compared to someone else we know. Jesus invites us to be stretched, enlarged and caught up in the struggle for something bigger, going beyond the timeframe of our own span of years, to impact and transform the atmosphere in which we and others live.

We are back!! The Papworth Craft Group had its first meeting in two years on 5 March. Our librarian, Nicola, welcomed us, displaying a large board advertising our meeting. A huge thank you to Nicola, for organising the tables for us and welcoming us, although the arrival of the group was entirely new to her. The meetings were attended by longstanding members and new ones as well. Everyone settled in as if there had been no hiatus at all. We would love to see more new members. Come with a friend or child and see whether joining the group would be of interest to you. Everyone is welcome to join - age and gender no barrier.

There is a wealth of experience among members in knitting, crochet, cross stitch, patchwork and quilting. Consequently, there is help available, if one encounters a problem in the course of a project, or wants to try something new, but needs some help and encouragement to make a start. One such example came up over the recent meetings - knitting socks. Socks are useful, make great presents and have always been a favoured item amongst knitters. There are hundreds of different socks and sock patterns. Nowadays, there are beautiful patterns for knitted socks. Instagram is full of pictures of socks in myriad colours and designs, a world away from the utilitarian items knitted a few generations back. A new member of the craft group is an expert in knitting socks and a longstanding member wants to learn how to knit socks, but has been apprehensive about making a start for some time. With encouragement from this new member, the novice sock knitter is on the point of beginning to knit one. Having offered help

during the first meeting on 5 March, this member followed up on the subsequent meeting by offering a printout of the pattern suggested previously. The sock is on the point of being cast on, this novice secure in the knowledge that help is at hand if all goes wrong! Someone else had a problem with deciphering a crochet pattern - and the same new member solved the problem! (She will soon become the go-to person for solving 'technical' problems! These exchanges of knowledge and experience demonstrate the value of a group that meets for two hours of uninterrupted time to spend on a craft. There is time to learn something new and time to work on a project, with conversation thrown in. A happy accident that has occurred ever since the craft group began has been meeting people from the village that one has never met before, even if a villager of years long residence. There are many stories that have been related about what the village was like before it began to be developed in the 1980s.

The yarn stash is very healthy and waiting for some volunteers to knit squares for blankets or hats and scarves for next winter. Squares should be 20 cm x 20 cm (8 inches x 8 inches) with all ends sewn in please. Finished squares or hats and scarves can be left with the librarian at Papworth library.
