

Housing and Maintenance

The Repairs and Maintenance line is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for our housing tenants to report repairs. If you call Monday to Friday, between 9am and 5pm, your call will be answered by Papworth Trust. Outside of these hours your call will be diverted to a call centre.

You can contact the Repairs Team by calling 0330 678 0008 choose option 1. If your call is not answered straight away you can leave a message, make sure you leave your name and return contact number so that a member of the team can get back to you.

You can also report repairs by emailing repairsandmaintenance@papworthtrust.org.uk If you send an email you will receive an automated response confirming receipt. This means we have your email and we will be in touch as soon as we can.

When you report a repair, it will be given one of three levels:

Emergency – this is a repair that is required to avoid danger to health, a risk to the safety of residents or serious damage to buildings. These repairs will normally be attended within 24 hours to make safe with potential follow up visits required.

Urgent – these are defined as faults causing considerable inconvenience or risk such as a containable leak or a non-flushing toilet. These repairs will be completed in 7 calendar days.

Non-Urgent (routine) – these are jobs which are our responsibility under the terms of the tenancy agreement, such as minor plumbing issues or communal lighting failures. These will be completed within 30 calendar days.

Annual Meeting of the Parish Council

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 11th May.

Following the uncontested election held on 5th May the following were confirmed as Parish Councillors: Pete Cruse (Chairman), Paul Phillips (Vice Chairman), Chris Howlett, Paul Hicks, Terry Cook, Michele Eidevik-Skinner, Jane Coutts and Victoria Carter. Victoria Carter has subsequently decided not to take up her position on the Council due to work commitments.

The Parish Council would like to thank Victoria for her contribution to the work of the Council, particularly in her capacity as Chair of the Village Hall Committee over the past few years.

At the meeting, Mark Hersom and James Garrett were also co-opted on to the Parish Council.

We also welcomed our District Councillors to the meeting - Cllr Mark Howell and Cllr Peter Sandford who is the newly elected District Councillor covering the Caxton and Papworth ward.

The Parish Council currently has some vacancies - would you be interested in becoming a Parish Councillor?

It doesn't matter if you're new to the village or have lived here your whole life - if you have a real interest in the village and want to get more involved why not call for a chat and see if it's for you?

We're looking for people over 18, who can rise to the challenge and make a commitment to improving the quality of life for everybody in our village, no matter your age or experience.

Knowledge and previous council experience aren't necessary, training is available and existing Parish

Councillors have a wealth of experience they are willing to share. The essential element is enthusiasm and a willingness to work as a member of our team to make a difference to our village.

We hold 11 Parish Council meetings per year and in addition you will be required to become a member of one or more of our sub-committees or working groups (Amenities and Playing Fields, Village Hall, Planning) and will be able to get involved in working on specific projects if you wish.

Annual Parish Meeting

A big thank you to everyone who came along to the Annual Parish Meeting held in the Village Hall on Wednesday 25th May. The meeting was open to all residents of the village and was a chance to hear what the Parish Council has been doing over the past year, their plans for the coming year and to raise any questions they may have.

After the formalities of the meeting, written reports from the Chairman and Committees were made available. New District Councillor Peter Sandford introduced himself to the meeting and

Cllr Mark Howell gave a verbal update followed by a financial summary presented by the Clerk.

This was followed by a Q&A session, with plenty of questions being raised – particularly in relation to the former Hospital site, the Church Lane development and Printworks community building and speeding/parking issues in the village

Following the meeting, refreshments were served and attendees were able to chat with the Parish and District Councillors present. We even spoke to one attendee who expressed their interest in becoming a Parish Councillor !

Paddling Pool Attendants

The Parish Council are looking to employ Paddling Pool attendants to cover the summer period.

We currently have 2 people interested in the role but are still looking for additional Pool Attendants to fill a rota of cover to maintain the paddling pool over the school summer holiday period.

The job is for approximately 5-6 hours a day, spread out over the day in 4 x 1-2 ½ hour shifts from early morning until early evening, 7 days a week and is therefore ideal for job sharing (Aged 18+)

This is a paid contract position at a rate of £11.00 per hour, and all necessary training will be provided.

Without people to maintain the pool daily we may not be able to open up the facility for use over the summer period.

Tree Warden Report

As we enter formal period of summertime, trees are generally at their most splendid. Their leaf cover reaching up to drink in the sunshine and keep the power engine of the tree running smoothly, making carbohydrates by using the raw energy of light. During photosynthesis, the chlorophyll in the leaves helps to convert carbon dioxide

(from the air) and water (from the roots) into the products oxygen (into the environment) and glucose (for tree growth).

With trees in full leaf, now is a good time to start to get to know different species by their shape and habit. There are many clues to help in the identification of trees: size, outline, leaf shape, colour, bark, flower, nut/fruit/seeds. The Woodland Trust has a useful app to help with tree identification, which includes an A-Z guide of trees. It can be found on their website: www.woodlandtrust.org.uk.

I have recently had the great pleasure of visiting the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire. 'Arboretum' will serve as my first entry in an alphabet of tree topics for these reports. Arboretum means: 'a large garden where many types of tree are grown for people to look at and be studied for scientific purposes.' The term probably did not come into use until late 18th century and

the first example in this country is Derby Arboretum, opened to the public in 1840. The Cambridge University Botanic Garden, first established in 1846, has a magnificent collection of trees and there is a Garden Trail Booklet specifically on trees in the Garden.

The National Memorial Arboretum covers some 150 acres and the first tree planting commenced in the spring of 1997. Although still a 'young' arboretum there are now around 30,000 trees in the grounds. The trees and the many dedicated memorials on the site make the Arboretum a living tribute to the personal sacrifices made by the Armed Forces and civilian services of this country. The tree planting has been carefully planned to enhance and complement



the growing number of memorials on the site. Many of the trees themselves have been planted and dedicated to the memory of loved ones. I particularly like the detailed botanic label provided for each tree which includes the unique reference number, date planted, botanic name and common name. The label also gives the area of origin for the species and the date the species was introduced to the UK.

For some visiting the Arboretum it is a place to stroll along the many paths and enjoy the trees and wildlife.

For many it is more a place for remembrance and gratitude for service and sacrifice. As the founder of the Arboretum, Commander David Childs CBE, has said:

"The Arboretum is a celebration of life lived".

'Strength for today, bright hope for tomorrow.'

As we applaud the Queen's steadfast service, we are witnessing her seniority in age and increasing signs of physical frailty. The certainty the baton will be passed at some point is very evident. This month we are being given time and making opportunities (through an extra bank holiday and many local events) both to look back with thanksgiving and look forward at one and the same time.

Whether as a parent, spouse, friend or monarch there will have been moments or incidents which are best forgotten; however, by a long stretch, the world will agree (when the time comes) she will have finished well and run her course with immense dignity underpinned by radiant Christian faith. The Queen has been a bright and shining beacon of light and hope in some dark and difficult times. She has provided a stability and signalled agreement to carefully chosen changes enabling her family to serve the nation today and to forge a vision going far beyond her own lifetime.

As witnessed in the State Opening of Parliament (where the Prince of Wales deputised), one person's frailty and vulnerability create opportunities for others to step up, to share the load, to carry the burden and to grow themselves. Sometimes pride can be an unhelpful obstacle. Once more, the Queen is proving to be a model of decorum and realism. With the passing of time and changes we can't control all outcomes; the challenge is to face our own need of and dependence on others.

The world at large is being challenged by our inability to be self-sufficient - as we witness the continuing horrors unfolding in Ukraine amid the complexity of our international obligations, also acute pressures experienced by households due to rises in the costs of living and what it means to good neighbours.

Stories emerging from Ukraine are full of the courage displayed, resilience in the teeth of seemingly overwhelming odds, and the determination to hold fast to their sense of identity as a nation; they are maintaining a vision for the future built upon hope. We can't rely on government to sort all our problems or level everything up across the nation. We have to play our part and, where we can, get involved in helping others even when the odds seem stacked against us in the extreme. The Christian church has a long history of fostering hope and offering hands-on help. But it is far more profound.

The Christian narrative of hope and help is centred on Jesus of Nazareth; it can be accessed through a huge network of local branches! The devastation of Good Friday was not the end. Moreover, there was no powerful PR machine galvanising public confidence; the resurrection appearances of Jesus in the next 6 weeks were to a relatively small number yet within a few years they had turned the known world upside down. The first Christians could have thrown in the towel. They refused, for the most part, and discovered God multiplied their effectiveness, added to their numbers, and built an unstoppable momentum that has been passed down the generations over nearly 2000 years.

We went on a mini beast hunt- I found a worm and it was very long. It was 3cm.



When this issue of the News & Views appears, the Platinum Jubilee celebrations will be in the past, but hopefully the memories of that long weekend will be happy ones to take into the future. To have a monarch, who has reigned for 70 years, is a first for this country, and the last for all of us. Even if the Prince of Wales were to come to the throne tomorrow, his reign would not endure for 70 years, given that he will celebrate his 74th birthday in November.

There will be a plethora of Jubilee events throughout the country. One of those will be the yarn bombing of the lych-gate at the church in Papworth Everard. This has been organised by Rosie Blencowe. The idea was to adorn the lych-gate with crocheted granny squares for the Jubilee and eventually for the squares to be taken down and sewn together to make blankets for charity. Some years ago, there was yarn bombing of knitted squares at the church, so for a change, crocheted squares was the obvious choice. Rosie asked if any members of the Papworth Craft Group would like to contribute some squares. There was only a limited amount of time before the squares were needed. Nonetheless, several members made some granny squares, following Rosie's instructions about size, spaces between trebles. Most important of all - that the last two rows should be in green! One member made twenty six granny squares, far exceeding most people's contributions. Another member learned how to crochet so that she could make some squares for this project. Collecting squares for the lych-gate yarn bombing was less demanding than the second stage - decorating the lych-gate itself with the squares. Do visit the church to see the final stage of this yarn bombing project, in all its colourful splendour.

However, the Papworth yarn bombing appears to be part of a trend. Anyone visiting St Ives cannot fail to notice the yarn bombing there.

Squares have been sewn together to decorate tree trunks and other accommodating surfaces. There are bobbles, knitted and crocheted figures of Her Majesty, post boxes have been 'yarn bombed'. There are so many different items. A decorated bench has a knitted 'hug'. Opposite Lloyd's pharmacy there are crowns adorning a bench. This project has been organised by the owner of Star Dancewear & Crafts. The local news television programme Look East reported this week that there is yarn bombing going on in Oundle. One of the attractions is a knitted London bus adorning a bus shelter together with a knitted roof. In another report on the same programme, a group in Beccles, Suffolk was highlighted. Members of this group are organising an attempt to break the record for the longest ever bunting - 9 miles or 14.5 km. The current record stands at 14.27 km. People are knitting and crocheting bunting flags and putting them together. The French town of Petit-Couronne twinned with Beccles sent over 1,500 flags over as a contribution to the project.

You may be wondering: what is the point of yarn bombing? Firstly, it is something one can do, so why not do it? (A much more modest equivalent of because a mountain is there, why not climb it)? The yarn bombing makes people smile as they encounter ordinary things such as benches, post boxes or trees transformed by a riot of colour. An encounter with yarn bombing may inspire some to learn to knit or crochet. (There are various groups around our area of which the Papworth Craft Group is right on your doorstep). Yet the best dividend of yarn bombing is community. It starts a conversation - what are these woolly things all about? have you seen the lych-gate at the church in Papworth? I would love to learn how to do that? Crafting can bring people together and yarn bombing is a very good way to do that. It surprises people, makes them smile or even laugh out loud. Just some yarn, a pair of knitting needles or a crochet hook can become something that engages people, starts a conversation, and is so much more than a pair of socks!

Perhaps there is someone reading this right now who wants to learn to knit! Or crochet? Or cross stitch! If that is you, pop down to the library on either the first or third Saturday of the month. You would be most welcome.

District Council Elections 2022

District Council elections took place on 5th May and results were published on 6th May.

I was returned as one of the two Caxton and Papworth Ward District Councillors for the 2022 to 2026 period, with 771 votes. Long-standing Councillor Mark Howell was also returned, while Councillor Nick Wright stood down. I want to say a big thank you to all the residents of the Caxton and Papworth villages who went out to vote, and to those who voted for me. For the first time for a long while, both District Councillors live in Papworth Everard. However, residents of the other villages can rest assured that their needs will not be forgotten.

One other good piece of news is that the Liberal Democrats are still in administration, having increased our seats from 31 to 37. The Conservatives lost 3 seats and are down to 8 and are the only opposition group now. Residents of Caxton and Papworth Ward now have a direct voice in the administration.

The turnout was about 43% across the district, but in the Caxton and Papworth Ward, it was only 38%. This is a bit worrying but understandable as many are "fed up" with politics due to the current national picture (we heard more about events in Westminster on the doorsteps than about local issues). Following the council's AGM on 26th May, new cabinet and committee appointments were ratified. I will be a member of the following committees: Audit and Corporate Governance, Licensing, Planning, and Climate Change and Environment Advisory. I will also be a non-executive director of Ermine Street Housing Ltd, the council's affordable housing venture. Green To Our Core – Zero Carbon Communities Grant

Green issues were raised a lot during the campaign, and I was pleased to be able to share with more people some of the good things that the Lib Dem administration has done on them, including creating and adopting the Doubling Nature and Zero Carbon Strategies. For more practical steps, it created the Zero Carbon Communities Grant in 2019, and so far allocated £314,415 to 51 different community groups to support carbon reduction projects. This grant is open for the fourth round of funding from a pot of £120,000! Community groups can apply for funding up to £15,000 for projects which reduce carbon emissions and engage communities on Climate change.

Solar Together

This is the joint programme with Cambridgeshire County Council that provides cost effective opportunities for residents to have Solar Photovoltaic panels installed. The number of households to accept the offer has now reached 701. This is out of a total of 1,820 acceptances across the County since registration for the scheme closed on 1st April. Also, 434 households have accepted the offer of added battery storage, meaning that they will directly benefit from the solar energy produced on their property which would otherwise have gone into the national grid. This scheme plays an important role in encouraging the uptake of Solar PV across the district to reduce reliance on fossil fuel energy. Council Tax Rebate

The Council is now implementing the Government scheme of giving £150 council tax rebate to owners of properties in Bands A-D. This money does not have to be paid back (unlike the energy loan). If you pay your council tax by direct debit, you should have received your payments by the end of May. Those who do not pay by direct debit must complete a short application form. Homes for Ukraine – Hosting Refugees

South Cambs continues to welcome and support Ukrainian refugees. As of the end of May, South Cambs had the highest number of homes offered to Ukrainian families – well over 600. Visas have been issued under the sponsorship scheme to over 500 individuals. This is the highest number in any District Council in England, which is a testament to the generosity of our communities.

The Council has set up officer teams working on themes - data management; accommodation checks; DBS checks; welfare checks; payments to guests and hosts; community, information and communications support. Additional staff have been recruited to assist with this work. There's a lot of work going on behind the scenes to help them get here and settle in.

SCDC has recently increased the initial payment to refugees from £200 to £350 to reduce the risk of relationships breaking down as hosts struggle to manage the inevitable cost burden to them. We have also organised a free bike scheme with OWL Bikes (part of the Papworth Trust) and Camtrust. 40 people had registered for a bike within 2 hours of the press release going out. An agreement to provide refugees with 10 free bus tickets has been reached with the County Council and Stagecoach.
