# John William Mead

27th June 1940 - 20th June 2022

It is with great sadness that we have to report on the passing of one of the village long term residents John Mead on the 20th June 2022

He was Born William John Mead on the 27th June 1940 to proud parents Lillian and John and was their first born son. He became known as little Johnny and has been known by all as John his entire life. He had one younger brother Bob, and grew up In his family home in Papworth after his father was a patient at Papworth Hospital with TB.

He first met his wife Janet when she was 15. Janet took a strong dislike to him in those early years, however when they met up later, now in their late twenties and early thirties, they started in March 1071 in Patter Oburst

a brief courtship and tied the knot on 23rd March 1974 in Potton Church.

They were blessed with their first daughter Emma in February 1975 and then Sarah April 1977. The family grew with the arrival of the Grandchildren, Emma's sons Simon, Jake and Harry all of whom he utterly adored. Sadly Janet passed away in August 2000 after spending 26 happy years with John.

John did love a good gossip with everyone he met and a quick trip to the local shop would take way longer than it should as he would strike up conversations with everyone he knew.

John will be missed by many and we are sure that there are a lot of funny, inappropriate and daft stories out there about him.

Emma, Sarah and family wish to Thank everyone who sent kind and comforting cards and messages on the passing of their Dad and Grandad.

Thank you also to those who attended the funeral service on the 20th July. It was lovely to see so many of Dad's old friends, workmates and people from the village. He would have hated all the fuss and would have grumbled no end, although we still think he would have enjoyed the music choice of The Shadows, which was played during the service.

Thank you also for the donations to the RNLI. We have raised £98 so far.

He is now reunited with our lovely Mum Janet and his parents John and Lilian.

#### Paddling Pool & Play Area

We are well into the school summer holidays, and it's great to see lots of families making use of the padding pool and play area in the village.

The paddling pool opened for the summer as planned on Friday 22nd July and is scheduled to be open until the weekend of 3/4th September. A big thank you to Mark Honeywood and Cllr Paul Phillips for all their hard work cleaning and preparing the pool ready for use.

As in previous years, temporary toilets have been sited at the play area for convenience, including a disabled access toilet with baby change facility. The toilets are emptied and serviced a minimum of twice a week and checked daily. Please do not leave soiled nappies in the toilets or waste bins around the play area.

The pool is maintained regularly throughout the day – but please help us to keep the pool as clean as possible for everyone to enjoy.

Do not allow children covered in mud and dirt to go in the pool – dirt and silt can easily block the filters. Please could we also request that children do not eat food whilst in the pool or in the area immediately round the poolside and that all food scraps are disposed of and not allowed to get into the water as food debris can easily block the filters too.

We would like to thank Will, Fraser, Rebecca and Karen, our Pool Attendants for this year, who are doing a sterling job in ensuring the paddling pool and surrounding area is kept clean, tidy and safe to use.

With the high numbers of people using the paddling pool a huge amount of rubbish is generated.

Please take your rubbish home with you whenever possible, including food scraps and soiled nappies – rubbish bins at the play areas should be used for general litter only.

The paddling pool attracts families from far and wide, many of whom travel by car, which can create parking problems on Ermine Street North, Chequers Lane and Varrier Jones Drive.

If you are visiting the paddling pool why not leave the car at home and walk?

We would request that people who do drive, park with consideration for other motorists, use the car parks where possible, do not cause an obstruction and park within the rules of the Highway Code.

#### **Public Seating**

The Parish Council have recently had its benches and public seating refurbished and repaired where necessary to ensure they can be enjoyed by everyone.

Not all seating in the village is owned by the Parish Council, but if you find any benches that have been damaged or are in a bad state of repair, it can be reported to the Parish Clerk.

In addition, the Parish Council is also awaiting the delivery of a bench to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, which will be installed by the Pavilion.

#### **Cricket Score Box Damage**

Recent damage to the cricket score box on the playing field has been repaired. Damage included including roofing felt which had been ripped from the roof, the locked door being kicked in causing damage to both the door and frame and the boarding on the windows and score box numbers being smashed.

It was extremely disappointing to see that within a week of the repairs being made, the door had once again been kicked in and further repairs are now necessary.

#### Village Hall

The Village Hall is a great space to hold all types of events and can be booked 7 days a week (excluding Bank Holidays).

Both the Main Hall with its stage area and well-equipped kitchen and the adjoining smaller North Hall are available for medium to large sized events plus there's a smaller seminar room on the first floor, available for meetings or small groups.

# What is a Beetle Drive?

On 12th July The Day Centre played a Beetle Drive. Players take turn to throw the dice. You must throw a six to start and draw the body. You must throw a five to draw the head, before you can draw eyes or antennae. Different numbers on the dice correspond to other parts of the Beetle: eyes,



antennae, legs and tail. The first person to complete the Beetle calls "Beetle" and has won the round and gets thirteen points, the other players get one point for each part completed. After a few rounds, the scores get added up to determine the overall winner.

# **Tree Warden Report**

**David Potter** treewarden@pa With all this exceptionally hot weather, I have been thinking about the shade provided by trees along residential streets, in town and city centres and in parks and countryside. There is nothing more delightful in such sunny weather than a well planned avenue of trees to

prove shade and relief from the rays of the hot sun. Shady walks through pools of cool shadows where any breeze there may be seems to be

concentrated, enhanced by the movement of the leaves on the tree branches.

Of course, those trees with a good overhanging canopy provide the best shade from the mid-day sun. And trees with the largest leaves might be even more effective in shielding out the sun's rays.

It's good to see the thought given by developers and planners to the landscaping of housing estates and commercial developments. In the past these efforts have been focused on the amenity value of trees and other planting. Perhaps more attention now needs to be

given to climatic issues - the planning and planting of shaded walks and the positioning of amenity areas where suitable planting can provide shadow and protection for outdoor seating.

Thinking of the advantages of large leaves brings me to the next letter in my alphabet of trees. It's C for the Catalpa tree. The common name is Indian Bean Tree but it neither comes from India nor produces beans. The tree originates from the south east of the USA. The name 'Catalpa' is a misspelling of 'Catawba' by a European botanist. The Catawba were the local people living in the area where the tree was 'discovered' in the 1700s.

By late spring / early summer, we start to see beautiful orchid-like white flowers appearing. The thin, long pods that hang from the tree in the autumn are not edible beans but seed pods. Inside are winged seeds that remain on the tree until winter before splitting and dispersing.

We have a lovely example of a catalpa tree in our village, just by the bus stop outside the co-op store. Here is a photo of the tree in flower. There is another catalpa tree, planted more recently, on the Summersfield estate. I wonder if you can find it!

Newly planted trees need a lot of water to ensure that they thrive so we should avoid any such planting in the near drought conditions we experience during our summer months. The best time for tree planting is in October and November, before any hard frosts, and when we can be assured rainfall will help our efforts to water in the new plants.

August is a good month to start collecting the harvest of nuts and berries from our hedgerows and to search out that winning conker from the Horse Chestnut tree.

Her story kept us on the edge of our seat wondering if she and her friend and business partner would ever make it following many hiccups along the way – plants and trees ordered the previous year grown specially that became infected with disease just weeks away from the show, together with struggling to find a sponsor to cover the costs which amounted to around £27,000! Just one week away from the show Angela had an accident resulting in her breaking her ankle badly. The garden, a garden for water voles, attracted many celebrities with the Queen, Princess Ann and Prince Philip also visiting the garden. The photographs were amazing and the garden, albeit very small, looked fantastic.

I suspect we underestimate its' importance, but its prominence or absence has a bearing on our relationships with others. Most of us prefer to be with people disposed to being thankful and try to steer a path away from others who never seem to stop whingeing!

There's an old hymn some may recall or have even sung. The first verse and chorus is,

When upon life's billows you are tempest tossed, When you are discouraged, thinking all is lost, Count your many blessings, name them one by one, And it will surprise you what the Lord hath done.

Refrain:

Count your blessings, see what God hath done;

It may seem quaint and twee, but it carries a message that has shaped more contemporary versions, both sacred and secular. More sign-ups are very welcome! This year's theme, Gadgeteers, gives a window onto the science and technology in the world. We're asking children to collect stickers in return for reading they complete, with a Gadgeteers Medal and Certificate to claim in September when the SRC closes. Medals will be awarded in the library by our very own Cllr Mark Howell on Thursday 15 September at 3.45pm.

Update from the Maintenance Team with regards work being carried out to properties in the village:

- The rewiring of 28 properties is currently being carried out by the contractor Princebuild
- We have approved bathroom upgrades taking place to 10 properties and work is due to start around October 2022. The contactor for this is BSG
- We have kitchen upgrades to 9 properties which are currently out to tender. The designs have been completed and contractors will be visiting properties to quote for the work around July / August
- There will be gas boiler replacements to 35 properties being carried out by Aaron Services
- The specification for bathroom and kitchen extractor fans has changed and we will now be fitting Greenwood Unity continuously running fans with automatic Humidi Smart control to help prevent condensation. These will be fitted as replacement fans are required and to co-ordinate with the rewire programme
- Entrance canopies to 18 properties in Pendragon Hill and Ermine Street South have been approved to be replaced. The contractor for this work will be BSG and tenants will be contacted in due course



The Library Presents will also start up again in the autumn, bringing accessible arts events to local residents. TLP has taken event choices made by Cambridgeshire residents to put together a selection of performances and workshops for all ages, ticket prices £3 - £8, which will run between October and December this year. 

### News from Papworth Surgery

An update from Dr Routledge:

I would like to say a huge thank you for the warm welcomes and well wishes the residents of the Papworth and Villages area have been kind enough to give me. I can't believe my first 6 months at the surgery have already passed so quickly. Despite working as a doctor for nearly 10 years, any change can be difficult but the brilliant team here has helped me settle right in, though I suspect it will be quite some time yet until I am no longer "the new kid on the block". An extra special mention to the very kind couple who rescued me at the roadside by the old hospital site earlier in July when I got a flat tyre driving home after a long day; your handiness with a jack and locking wheel nuts will not be soon forgotten and I hope your dinner was not too badly burnt!

It would not be a 2022 newsletter without mentioning Covid-19. There has unfortunately been a spike in cases in our area as many of you will have noticed. We have therefore switched back to mandatory mask wearing in the surgery building to protect our vulnerable patients, this includes all patients and members of staff unless medically exempt . If you have any Covid-19 symptoms and are coming for an appointment, please let our receptionists know as soon as you arrive and we will arrange for you to wait somewhere safe and not in the main waiting room. The government has announced that there will be another round of Covid-19 vaccinations before winter and we have asked if we can hold vaccination clinics at the surgery again for our eligible patients as we understand that this is far more convenient than travelling to a vaccination hub. We will let you know when clinics are confirmed.

We thank him for his hard work and dedication to our patients and we wish him the best of luck in his journey. We are pleased to announce however, that from August we should have two new registrars joining to train at the practice, Dr Mir and Dr Fayehun, whom we are looking forward to meeting. "

## PAPWORTH CRAFT GROUP

MEETINGS EVERY FIRST AND THIRD SATURDAYS OF THE MONTH 10:30 - 12:30 AT PAPWORTH LIBRARY

The longest day of the year is now behind us and little by little the days will become increasingly shorter. However, there plenty of long, light evenings to do some crafting. Members of the Papworth Craft Group are beavering away on a variety of projects. There are some members who knit at a fantastic rate and are likely to have completed a project in the space between meetings, so it is sometimes difficult to keep apace of their work! One of the newer members does lace making. That is not so common and we certainly have not had a lacemaker before. In time she may be persuaded to give a demonstration. Are there any more lacemakers in Papworth or nearby villages? Please come along and show us how you make lace. Our sessions have been as lively as usual. At one we were joined by a woman who had not known our group existed. Never receiving the News & Views, she happened to see a copy, read about the group and came along for a chat. Hopefully we shall see her at future meetings. Dropping in for a chat is a very good way of discovering whether you would find joining the group would suit. There is no commitment required, there is no membership fee, there is no age restriction and intermittent attendance may appeal more than coming to every meeting. We love meeting new members and it has been a pleasure to see members again, who have been unable to come for a while before the Covid-19 pandemic. If you know someone you think might be interested in a craft group but may not know that the Papworth Craft Group meets at the library twice a month, do alert them about the meetings.

Most people like to see their project grow. One likes to make progress. The trouble is that it is not always easy to impose self discipline and set goals - this far by x number of weeks, this far by y number of months. This is why knit alongs (KALs), crochet alongs, (CALs) and stitch alongs (SALs) are so popular. Information on these, both current and past, can be found online or in any of the craft magazines. Recently available are a KAL with Rowan yarns for making a blanket in two sizes, a CAL with Stylecraft yarns and a SAL with Cross Stitcher magazine. The frequency of new releases varies. With magazines, each stage is released monthly. However, weekly or fortnightly releases are more common with KALs and CALs. (The good news is that all the details can be found online after the KALs, CALs and SALs are over). This is a brilliant way to measure one's progress of a project, providing you are sufficiently disciplined to complete each phase as you go along. Good intentions are not enough. Facebook groups are set up quite frequently, although it can be dispiriting to find some people have finished the whole of the release in 24 hours - do not look, unless you are one of these exceptionally annoying people!

There is a great stash of donated yarn waiting to be turned into hats, scarves or jumpers. If you are interested contact Rosalind Parnell at parnellrh@aol.com.

A brief word about the library. Papworth library generously hosts the Papworth Craft Group twice monthly meetings. It is a community project. Footfall is so important for all libraries, especially rural ones. The village is most fortunate to have a library and if it closed, it would be a great loss to the community. Combine going to the craft group meetings with renewing or changing your library books. Introduce your children to the joy of libraries and perhaps bring them along to the craft group. Age no barrier to learning a craft or two.

By the time this edition of the News & Views appears, the school holidays will have begun! The year is racing by.
