SMALL ELECTRICALS - RECYCLING



Recycling small electricals like toasters, phones and hairdryers is now easier for Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire residents, after local councils installed more drop-off points.

Greater Cambridge Shared Waste Service, a partnership between Cambridge City

Council and South Cambridgeshire District Council, has placed eight new collection banks for small electrical items at recycling points around the two areas, with more locations planned. One of these locations is at the recycling point in the Car Park at Cambourne opposite Home Bargains.

Small old electrical items are one of the fastest growing waste streams in the UK. According to the Recycle Your Electricals campaign, the number of old cables alone that remain in UK households (140 million) is enough to circle the Earth more than five times. In the Greater Cambridge area, figures from the RECAP waste partnership show that an average of 450 tonnes of small electrical equipment is disposed of in black bins every year, ending up in landfill where it will never break down and harms the environment.

Greater Cambridge Shared Waste is joining the national Recycle Your Electricals Campaign to stop as many old small electrical items as possible from cluttering our homes or worse, going into kerbside bins where they end up in landfill.

The unwanted small appliances will be sorted for re-use and recycling by specialist company. Items that are undamaged, uncontaminated and repairable may be suitable for re-use within the UK. The refurbished small appliances can be comprehensively tested to ensure that they are safe and functional. Items that are unsuitable for re-use will get dismantled into component parts. Many of those components are also suitable for re-use. For example, screens from broken monitors or power units from laptops. Items that fail the re-use screening are sent to local and national specialist operators who will recycle those items into new substances or products.

What kind of small electrical items can I recycle?

Anything up to 29cm in its largest dimension, which has a plug, battery or cable. If batteries are removeable, take these out and recycle them separately.

Some examples of suitable items include:

- Kettles, toasters, sandwich toasters, stick blenders
- Games consoles, DVD players
- Hand-held vacuum cleaners
- Electric toothbrushes
- Mobile phones, tablets and smart devices
- Cables and headphones
- Printers and scanners
- Laptops, keyboards and IT accessories

Please note that smoke detectors, light bulbs, e-cigarettes, batteries, paints, chemicals or aerosols are not accepted in these banks.

September was a very sad month. The Queen died at Balmoral on 8 September and on most of the television channels, right up until the funeral itself, were programmes about the Queen, documenting her long life and her seven decades as Queen. Her funeral on 19 September was watched by an estimated 4 billion worldwide! It still feels strange that we have a King! Comfort can be found in crafting, so without a doubt many people found gentle pursuits such as knitting, crochet and cross stitch softened the edges of a very difficult time.

September brought new members to the Papworth Craft Group - fabulous. One of the newcomers, who has been making lace for about thirty years, brought all her lace making materials with her to the second session in September. There were so many bobbins to keep track of, the emerging lace pinned at critical points, but the process is mesmerising! It is amazing that such fine thread, all on the numerous bobbins, begins to reveal itself as the bobbins are passed to and fro, either 'cross' or 'twist' to use the correct terms. Our new member had brought two lace angels to show as examples of what can be made. At the first meeting in October, our new lace making member is going to show a couple of us how to start off making lace and to give us the opportunity of having a go ourselves. Absolutely terrifying, as lace making is totally out of our comfort zones, but so exciting too! Perhaps we shall be so smitten that we shall wish to take it further?

Another new member has just moved to Papworth from Scotland. Her main interest is making stained glass making. Definitely a first in the group. Unfortunately, it is not possible to do that at the group sessions, but hopefully she will bring in some of the work she has done. During the Saturday sessions, our stained glass expert is crocheting for now.

September brought three little ladies to the group with their mum, because they want to learn to crochet. We were so thrilled by this, having tried to encourage anyone to come and learn one of the

Turn Off Lights

Turn your lights off when you're not using them or when you leave a room. This will save you around £20 a year on your annual energy bills. Switching lightbulbs from incandescent or halogen bulbs to LEDs can save you even more money.

Careful With Your Washing

By using a 30 degree cycle or reducing your washing by one load a week could save you around £28 a year from your energy bill.

Avoid The Tumble Dryer

Dry clothes outside where possible or on a clothes airer inside (make sure your rooms are well ventilated) to save up to £60 a year.

Be Savvy In The Kitchen

Kettles are one of the most used appliances in the kitchen. Avoid overfilling the kettle and save yourself £11 a year on your electricity bill. Always cover your pans when you are cooking, they heat up quicker and need less energy to continue to boil. Around 4% of your energy bill is spent on powering kitchen appliances including the hob, oven, kettle and microwave.

Washing machines, dishwashers and tumble dryers account for 14% of a typical energy bill. Fridges and freezers also account for around 13% of the average household's energy bill. By their very nature these appliances need to stay on all the time, so they continually draw power to maintain a constant temperature.

Consumer electrics, such as laptops, TV's and game consoles account for around 6% of your energy bill and lighting takes up around 5% of an average home's total energy bill.

Help!

I like to have a clear idea of the route before setting out on a journey. I may get a sense of the anticipated journey time from my phone AND like to see if the route makes sense; so I look at the road map under the seat in the car also! Of course, neither the phone nor the map can anticipate traffic jams and accidents on the road. My son tells me to chill and has very little sense of geography when making a journey because he can trust the maps app on his phone! Annoyingly he is right usually, and my cautious instincts proved wrong!

There are many things we can't control. Far more than we often realise or remember. A year ago, none of us thought we would have a new Prime Minister, that war in Ukraine would have broken out, inflation rocketed and fuel bills soaring to eye-watering levels. The weather conditions accelerated the harvest; now (writing in early September) there is a desperate need for rain so that the next crops can be sown.

The COVID lockdowns could have taught us to be less reliant on our own plans, making us much more flexible and reactive to what the journey of life throws at us. The sense I get is 2020/2021 was for many a time of deep trauma and some are left looking for more certainty rather than feeling better equipped for uncertainty. Whether we are anxiety-ridden or rolling with the punches may be a matter of temperament, how we are wired, the environment we knew earlier in life; which – for some of us – seem yet more things we can't do much about!

Through the good efforts of those who have campaigned hard for a better care and appreciation of the environment, we have become more accustomed to using 'Bags for Life' rather than relying on single-use items that litter our streets and demand landfill sites. This may be a good time to ask ourselves if we have a "Faith for Life"?

I find the Bible speaks into these issues (and much more!). We can't expect to be isolated from challenges and dilemmas; bad things keep on happening to good people. It wouldn't be like that if I had my way! But there is good news: we can know the presence and peace of God in the tough times, to uphold us as we go through the many ups and downs. He remains the God of miracles.

Over the next few weeks there will be services and suppers in keeping with the season; to give thanks for God's provision and to celebrate in community for work done. Whether we are full of faith or quaking in our boots, these can be helpful meeting places; that reawaken our recognition of God and our dependency on him. Join us if you can. Look out also for opportunities to give something to help others in great need and who depend on our generosity as a feature of God's bounty to them.

Tree Warden Report

We look back on the sad events of last month and reflect on the many years of service given by the late Queen. She would have planted so many trees during her reign and it is good to know that one of these, a fine beech tree, was planted by the Queen in the grounds of Papworth Hall. Planting a tree is a sign of hope, because it will grow and flourish

beyond our lifetime, and a sign of love, because it gives beauty and diversity to the environment around it. The late Queen brought hope and love to the many people she met in those long years of her reign and we mourn her passing.

In my tree alphabet, E is for evergreen. In botany, an evergreen is a plant which has foliage that remains green and functional through more than one growing season. This contrasts with deciduous plants, which completely lose their foliage during the winter or dry season.

There are many kinds of evergreen plants, including most types of conifer – Scots Pine, Cedar, Cypress, Spruce, Yew and other trees such as Juniper and Holly. They can be elegant and statuesque; a carefully planned feature in the landscape and graceful when seen alongside important buildings. Cedars of Lebanon, for example, became popular in the eighteenth century and became a feature in many of the landscapes designed by Capability Brown.

There are good examples of evergreen trees to be seen in the parkland setting of Papworth Hall. There is also a fine Yew tree in St Peter's churchyard.

Conifers play a special role in supporting wildlife in winter by

providing a much needed source of food. Needles, twigs, bark and seeds contained in the cones provide nourishment for birds and animals.

There was once a very large and ancient yew tree outside the church in Selborne, West Sussex, where the famous naturalist Revd. Gilbert White (1720-1793) held the living and who wrote an influential study about the natural history of his parish. In 1778 he described the yew tree:

'In the churchyard of this village is a yew tree whose aspect bespeaks it to be of great age: it seems to have seen several centuries, and is probably coeval with the church, and therefore may be deemed an antiquity: the body is squat, short and thick, and measures twenty-three feet in girth, supporting an head of suitable extent to its bulk.'

Sadly, the yew tree was brought crashing to the ground in the storms of January 1990. Despite many efforts, it was not possible to save the tree but cuttings taken from the base of the tree proved successful and a new sapling is now thriving close to the original position of the ancient tree.

So take the opportunity to enjoy the many different evergreen trees that grow in the village. Enjoy their different shapes and the many different shades of green. Look for the cones along their branches, some that perch along the top of the branch and some that hang down. Look for the seeds held in the closed cones. And remember, every part of the yew tree is poisonous!


Finally, the Scouts will be helping Santa again with his trip around the village to see everyone. There is still plenty of time to make sure you have been good!!

District Councillor's Monthly Report – October 2022

Four Day Working Week Trial

Between January and March, South Cambs District Council will trial a four day working week for office staff. The new arrangements are intended to improve staff recruitment and retention by making the council an employer of choice.

The strategy is 100-80-100, 100% of the services in 80% of the time for the same salary. Different departments will implement this differently, but customer-facing areas will remain open for the same, potentially longer, hours. Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) will be monitored to identify if service standards are maintained or improved. After that, a decision will be made whether to continue with the shorter working week permanently.

No trial is yet planned for manual staff such as refuse operators until a way of implementing a 4 day week around their particular patterns is developed.

The trial has generated a great deal of interest as SCDC is the first U.K. council to consider the shorter working week. (There are many private businesses which have implemented a 4 day week, so the strategy is well proven.) Bridget Smith was interviewed on BBC Radio 4 and Radio Canada(!), and there is a lot of coverage in the national press.

Aircraft Noise Update

Complaints about additional noise from aircraft landing at Luton continue to trickle in. Councillors in affected wards were scheduled to meet with the airport and NATS in September but the meeting was cancelled as it fell within the mourning period following the death of HM The Queen. The next meeting is planned for October. In the meantime, residents should continue to email concerns directly to noise.enquiries@LTN.aero or submit them online at <https://www.london-luton.co.uk/corporate/community/noise/making-a-noise-complaint>. If anyone has evidence of aircraft flying lower than 7000ft, that information should also be submitted to Luton.

Cambridge Access (Congestion Charge) Update

The Greater Cambridge Partnership's (GCP) proposals for a congestion charge for the city of Cambridge to fund a much improved bus service across the county has caused a great deal of comments, both positive and negative. One particular pain point seems to be the inclusion of the Cambridge Biomedical Campus (specifically Addenbrooke's, Royal Papworth and Rosie Maternity) within the charging zone. The GCP is developing a list of groups that would be exempt from the charge including patients and staff. This list will be published in due course.

A consultation on these proposals has been delayed by the royal mourning period but it should be opened sometime in October. When it becomes available, please take the time to enter your comments. The GCP is obliged to listen to comments submitted in response to the official consultation.

Separately, Stagecoach has announced it will be discontinuing 18, most rural, bus services at the end of October. The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority (the mayor's office) is responsible for bus routes and will put the affected routes out to tender, allowing other operators to potentially take them over.

Reservoirs

You may be aware that proposals have been published by Anglian Water to build two new reservoirs, one in Lincolnshire and the other somewhere on the Fens. (The exact site of the Fens is yet to be confirmed but is expected to be near the Cambridgeshire-Norfolk border.) These are long-term projects and will not be supplying water before the mid 2030s at the earliest. Cambridge Water is a partner in the Fens project and that reservoir will eventually supply drinking water to our area. In addition to providing water to our

region, the reservoirs will include recreational facilities, similar to those currently available at Grafham Water. Expect more information and a consultation from Anglian Water as planning progresses. In addition, Anglian Water is working on a water drainage and water management plan, which will (amongst other issues) address the excessive quantities of sewage being discharged into our water courses.
