## Papworth Everard Parish Council Report

#### **Councillor Vacancies**

The Parish Council currently has 10 Councillors but still has vacancies for 3 more to bring us up to the full complement of 13.

Why not make it your New Year's Resolution to step up and get involved !

If you have a real interest in the village or are a newcomer and want to get more involved, why not call for a chat and see if it's for you?

We are looking for people who can rise to the challenge and make a commitment to improving the quality of life for everybody in our village, no matter what your age or experience.

Knowledge and previous experience aren't essential, training is available and existing members have a wealth of experience they are willing to share. The essential element is enthusiasm and a willingness to be an active member of our team to make a difference to our village.

We hold 11 Parish Council meetings per year and in addition you will be required to become a member of one or more of our sub-committees or working groups (Amenities and Playing Fields, Village Hall, Planning) and will be able to get involved in separate working groups looking at specific projects if you wish.

## Papworth Surgery

#### Pressure

The NHS is under extreme pressure at the moment, and our surgery is no exception, with very high demand for appointments. We understand how frustrating it can be in trying to get an appointment and always try our best to help.

Pre-bookable appointments for non-urgent matters are usually available 2 -3 weeks ahead. We have a limited number of urgent 'on the day' appointments which are released at 8.30am for a morning appointment and 1.30pm for an afternoon appointment. All 'on the day' appointments are for medically urgent issues only. Our reception team is trained in what is medically urgent and what isn't. If they are in any doubt then they know to refer to the Duty Doctor. The number of requests for urgent 'on the day' appointments varies hugely from day to day so on busy days you may be asked to call back in the afternoon or the next day.

Whilst we do understand patients getting upset if they find it difficult to book an appointment we cannot tolerate the increased level of abuse from some of our patients that is aimed at our reception team. Abuse of our staff results in a warning letter from the surgery, advising that if there is a repeat of similar behaviour then the patient will be removed from our list and required to register elsewhere. This is not something we do lightly but we have to protect our staff.

Our practice staff are here to help you. Our aim is to be as polite and helpful as possible to all patients. If you consider that you have been treated unfairly or inappropriately please ask reception staff to contact the Practice Manager or Assistant Practice Manager who will be happy to address your concerns.

From Monday 31st October we will no longer be holding late night surgery at Papworth on a Monday or Wednesday evening.

Instead West Cambs Federation have been given the contract for extended hours provision by the ICB (Integrated Care Board), and they will be offering appointments with GPs, nurses and healthcare assistants every evening between 18:30 til 20:15 Monday to Friday and from 08:30 til 12:15 on a Saturday and Sunday. These appointments will be either at Roman Gate Surgery in Godmanchester or the Acorn surgery in Huntingdon.

These appointments can be booked via our reception team by calling the usual number for Papworth Surgery – 01480 830888.

We hope in the New Year to be able to offer West Cambs Federation appointments located at Papworth Surgery on at least a couple of days a month, but the details are yet to be confirmed.

#### Flu & Covid Vaccination Clnics

We have had a great turnout for our Flu and Covid vaccination clinics over recent weeks. We have no plans for further Covid clinics, but we may put on another couple of flu clinics if we have sufficient demand. If you still need a Covid jab please call 119. We are happy to do flu vaccinations opportunistically, so if you already have an appointment and have not yet had your flu jab, please ask the clinician for a jab at the same time. Alternatively please call reception and see if you can be squeezed in anywhere for a flu jab and we will try and accommodate you.

Sadly Nurse Muriel will be leaving us at the end of November. Muriel has been with us for many years and is taking well-earned retirement.

#### Housing & Maintenance Updates

#### Cost of Living

Registered Charity No: 1044680 As the cost of living continues to bite, as a Papworth Trust tenant we are here to help and if you need any help or advice with paying your rent or if you are worried about your finances then please get in contact with us.

You can do this by calling us on 0330 678 0008 option 2 or by emailing housing@papworthtrust.org.uk

It is important that you contact us if you are experiencing any problems with paying your rent or other household bills. We can arrange to speak to you in a way and at a time that suits you.

#### **Positive Action Fund**

The Positive Action Fund is a scheme available to support Papworth Trust tenants and customers facing genuine financial difficulties caused by the continuing rise in the cost of living.

There is a limited sum of money available to make discretionary payments in exceptional circumstances to provide small scale, short term support for tenants and customers. This might be to help with paying a utility bill or for food or paying for other essential items.

Any payments made to tenants and customers will not be required to be paid back. It is intended that this scheme is a temporary one, and may be withdrawn at any time, either due to a reduction in the cost of living or if the Trust is unable to continue to fund the scheme.

Tenants and customers are able to request up to £100. Only one request per household will be considered. The scheme is confidential, only the necessary people will see the applications submitted. We now have three young ladies who have joined us for both of our November meetings, all three learning to crochet. It is great to welcome younger members to the groupand we had more new members arriving at our group over November.

There were no further lace making sessions in November due to absences. A member who is an expert in stained glass work brought in a piece for everyone to see. There are many factors to take into consideration, when working with glass. Is there anyone reading this, who also makes stained glass items? If you do, please come along to one of our meetings with some of your work.

Advent calendars are in the shops and online, the paper variety that is, and chocolate ones are in the supermarkets. For the countdown to Christmas, it is always fun to have a candle with the numbers 1-24 on it. There are also Advent calendars that one can make oneself. Ones that are very attractive are sewn in cross stitch, although time might be a little tight for finishing it in time for 1 December this year. There are kits for cross stitch Advent calendars, try Etsy.com or the Historical Sampler Company. historicalsamplercompany.co.uk. A member of the group is stitching a very large Advent calendar by Permin of Copenhagen that promises to be awesome when finished. Try lovecrafts.com for kits by Permin. Another Danish company to look up that does cross stitch Advent calendar kits is the Danish Handcraft Guild, (Haandarbejdets Fremme, Danish-handcraft-guild-uk.com). Also on Etsy there are plenty of downloadable PDFs for Advent calendars by designers from across the world. There are cross stitch books on Amazon and cross stitch magazines for Christmas cross stitching. Particularly good are current and back issues of Cross Stitcher Magazine. Any Christmas, November or December issues are useful. Look on ebay or willow fabrics.co.uk. If cross stitch is not for you, how about crocheting twenty four little drawstring bags, each with a number on? Take a look at Your Christmas Crochet 2022 from Simply Crochet magazine. Or you could knit or sew little bags for your Advent calendar. When your work is ready, pop a little treat into each bag. You can choose the type of treat that would best please your recipient, although chocolate is overwhelmingly appreciated!

Our yarn stash is very healthy at present. A huge thank you to Andrea Rowland for the gorgeous winter hats and to Carol Watt for her beautifully crocheted items. #### Papworth Surgery Patient Link Update

Christmas Opening hours: The surgery will be open as usual 8.30am - 12.30pm and 3pm - 5.30pm in the week leading up to Christmas and then on the 28th, 29th, 30th December and then back open on Tuesday 3rd January 2023. On the day appointments for medically urgent problems are released at 8.30am and 1.30pm.

The surgery is still experiencing unprecedented demand for appointments so please do take the advice of the receptionist if they direct you to a different service from the one you were expecting. The practice is making full use of all staff and types of appointments to manage patient demand to try and get as many patients seen as possible.

From Monday 31st October the surgery stopped offering late night surgery appointments at Papworth. West Cambs Federation have taken over the contract for extended hours appointments, offering evening appointments between 18:30 and 20:15 every weekday and morning appointments from 08:30 to 12:15 on Saturday and Sunday. These appointments are at Roman Gate Surgery in Godmanchester or the Acorn Surgery in Huntingdon. The surgery hopes to offer extended hours appointments in 2023 but this is still being finalised. These appointments can be booked by Papworth Surgery reception staff on your behalf.

The NHS is under extreme pressure at the moment both with demand and financially, how can we do our bit to help I hear you ask?

Staff are leaving the service for a variety of reasons so please be kind to the staff you engage with. All staff, and in particular our reception staff at Papworth, are getting more verbal abuse from some patients, the surgery will not tolerate this and will take action if there is a repeat of behaviour.

Unused prescription medicines cost the NHS  $\pounds$ 300 million every year! – 40% of people admit to binning them potentially wasting up to an estimated 445 million prescriptions a year.

At a time when all our public services are under enormous financial strain and we as individuals can feel pretty helpless, this is an area where we could make a difference. Please only order what you need, when you need it to do your bit to help.

# 'Blessed are the peacemakers...'

2022 has forced people all over the world to realise that peace is more than the absence of conflict. As a teenager I was part of a Youth Club where one other member made a habit of annoying and even taunting others; his presence brought unease into the group. Neville Chamberlain's infamous 'Peace for our Time' declaration was an effort to

keep an uneasy peace for a few months and did nothing to settle the underlying issues. Such moves are often an essential element in the overall scheme of creating peace; yet inadequate if not a means of allowing the work of making and establishing lasting peace a reality. During the tumultuous months of 2022 a number of military and political analysts have been heard saying the relatively unopposed annexation by Russia of Crimea in 2014 made the attempt to overrun Ukraine this year an inevitable next step. The whole thrust of the Bible for Christians explains how God's heart is to rescue people, refusing to settle for an uneasy truce or keeping our sinfulness under some degree of acceptable control. Jesus says peacemakers are God's children. He means making peace is a mark of those who carry the same DNA and are members of the same family. The question then becomes what does peace-making look like?

In the Old Testament, or Jewish Bible, we hear of a man called Nehemiah. He was a Jew in the 5th century BC, living in exile who, having gained relatively high office in his adopted country, hears of the devastation of Jerusalem and - given unusual favour - returns to rebuild the city walls. It turned out to be no small feat; achieved in the midst of such conflict that his workforce ended up being divided into 2 groups – one working with trowels and stone whilst the other stood guard – weapons ready and poised to protect their colleagues' work. When the rebuilding was completed, the text declares, in effect, 'the walls were shalom-ed'. They were at peace once more – the security and boundaries of the city and its' people intact again. It is an evocative picture or metaphor for what peace-making involves; much more radical and lasting to settling for keeping an uneasy truce or peace.

Making peace as an expression of God at work; restoring safety as well as secure boundaries for the territory or relationships we can influence. This often has three elements or integrated steps:

- a) caring enough about the threats and disturbance to insist on bringing about change;
- b) getting our hands dirty and soiled with the messiness of how things have become to ensure the work of full restoration is brought about, also
- c) putting in place the essential brickwork, mortar and reinforcing ties to fill the gaps exposed or made by the forces of destruction and evil.

Peacemakers are needed more than ever – in some homes, many communities, between workers and employers, to help politicians unite round the common good as well as promoting goodwill, and mutual respect between cultures and nations.

# **Tree Warden Report**

In December, we enter 'the bleak midwinter', the season of the holly and the ivy, carol singing, roasted chestnuts and Christmas trees. Our winters might not be as severe as they used to be but it is still an important period of dormancy for our deciduous trees and an ideal time for planting trees and moving shrubs.

The festivities and decorations of Christmas, perhaps

unsurprisingly, owes a lot to trees and their foliage. Mistletoe hung up high, holly and ivy in Christmas wreaths, fir trees decorated with lights and baubles, painted cones from pine trees adorning the home. And, of course, the original nativity scene with its wooden crib or manger for the baby Jesus, whose earthly father was a carpenter.

Many trees are mentioned in the Bible. There is the Almond tree (Ecclesiastes); Apple tree (Song of Solomon); Chestnut and Fir (Ezekiel); Cedar and Myrtle (Isaiah); Sycamore (Luke); Mustard tree (Luke); and Fig (Matthew). The Wise Men brought to the infant Jesus, Frankincense, obtained by tapping Boswellia trees, and Myrrh, a gum resin extracted from the Dindin tree.

My tree warden alphabet has reached the letter G and we will have G for Garden. Trees can be a great benefit in your garden, providing colour, shade, spectacle and even food. But, you must, of course, be careful in choosing what tree might be suitable for planting in your garden, and also consider whether you have sufficient space, the right soil conditions, adequate drainage and suitable aspect for accommodating and growing the plant.

Most modern gardens are not large and the result of planting the wrong tree could, in a few years time, have an adverse impact on your own and your neighbour's amenity. A few year's ago, the child of a friend of mine planted a conker in the middle of their back

garden. It sprouted and it's height soon shot above that of the child. It became a very fine horse chestnut tree but it overshadowed the surrounding gardens and eventually had to be taken down before my friend was able to sell his house. Large trees like horsechestnuts are not suitable for your normal domestic garden.

Reputable garden nurseries should be able to recommend what tree might be suitable for your situation and the Royal Horticultural Society also provides advice on their website: www.rhs.org.uk. If you have the space and inclination, I always think it is good to have a fruit tree in your garden, with the beauty of springtime blossom and then the reward of later fruit. Of course you need a careful eye on the ripening fruit because nature, in whatever form, is always ready to get there first!

The top five trees for small gardens recommended by the RHS are: Acer Griseum

Amelanchier x grandiflora 'ballerina'

Crataegus persimilis 'prunifolia'

Sorbus 'Joseph Rock'

Prunus 'Amanogawa'

Before the 'frosty winds make moan', take a walk round your garden and make sure everything is tidy and safe from any future wind damage. Check your fences and ensure that young trees are properly staked. Take the opportunity to remove any branches or hedges that might be overhanging boundary fences, especially where these could be causing obstructions to public paths, pavements or open spaces. Check that your bird feeders are regularly replenished. If you have a garden pond, place an inflatable ball or a plastic bottle with a few stones in it (to stop it blowing away) on the surface. This will stop the pond from freezing completely over and so protect the wildlife living there.



District Councillor's Monthly Report – December 2022

#### **Black Mould**

We were all shocked by the recent death in Rochdale of two-year old Awaab Ishak from respiratory illness caused by black mould in the family home. As a matter of priority, South Cambs District Council (SCDC) is reviewing housing records to identify any residents who

have reported black mould that hasn't ben eradicated. If you live in a council property and have concerns about black mould, contact the housing department or drop me an email.

#### East-West Rail

As you may have heard in the Chancellor's Autumn Statement, the government has now allocated funds to build East West Rail (EWR) through from Bedford to Cambridge. The next stage of the planning process will be for EWR to develop a business plan for the government's approval. No word yet in the location of the Cambourne station, or whether the Northern or Southern route into Cambridge will be chosen. South Cambs leader, Cllr Bridget Smith, will be writing to the new rail minister next week to explain concerns of residents about this project.

#### **Boundary Commission Review**

The Boundary Commission recently reported on the results of its consultation on proposals to (amongst other changes) create a new parliamentary constituency called St Neots and Mid Cambridgeshire. As well as St Neots, the new constituency will include all of the Caxton and Papworth ward villages, in addition to 14 other South Cambs wards including Cambourne, Swavesey, and Bar Hill. # News from Papworth Library

The second The Library Presents event at Papworth Library hosted artist Jude Devoil, who took a full house through three ways to observe light effects and make art; through prisms, through oil, colour and water, and more oil, colour & water in a petri dish blown about with a pipette and beamed onto a screen through a projector. Everyone fell quiet as they watched the effects, and then a whirr arose as they experimented with their own creations.

As we go to press we're awaiting our next The Library Presents (TLP) event, a production of Earwig, a play put on by Time & Again Theatre on Thursday 1 December from 7pm, again in Papworth library. We'll let you know how this play went - it's the one about Marigold, a deaf woman in 1927 whose unparalleled research into beetles is ignored. It brings our TLP events at Papworth to an end for this year, but to see what TLP has in the wings in other areas of Cambridgeshire before Christmas have a look at www.library.live/ the-library-presents, or pick up a booklet in the library.

We're also very pleased to announce our next Engage talk, to be given in the library by Dave Horan on Thursday 8th December 10am – 11.30am. His talk's called 'Bringing Them All Home', and he will expand on what happened after the explorer Shackleton's ship, the Endurance, sank. It took ten months for Shackleton and his crew to reach dry land after an epic voyage and hiking across an unknown mountain range. Come join us to hear more; refreshments will be provided, with a £1 suggested donation.

Next, to flag our First Steps Library Club for 0-4s, which gives our youngest members a paw stamp on their Club card for each library visit. Six paw stamps gives them a certificate - and there are 10 certificates to collect. Our weekly Rhymetime (singing and nursery rhyme sessions for 0-4s held on Wednesday mornings from 10am to 10.30am, term-time only) would be a good time to ask after the Club; our last session for the year is on Wednesday 21 December,

SCDC is implementing a wide range of support worth almost £400,000 for the most vulnerable, after hearing how the rising cost of energy and food bills is having a major impact on individuals, families, and businesses across the district. A total of £180,000 has been put towards support measures from the District Council and a further £211,000 will come from the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Integrated Care System (ICS). The ICS are providing this funding to ensure support is co-ordinated effectively and directed at those in need locally.

£100,000 in top-up for Discretionary Housing Payments will be available to support an extra 100 eligible families with housing costs. £60,000 of Discretionary Council Tax discounts are available to anyone who can show they are in financial hardship and are not claiming from a scheme elsewhere. Localised Council Tax Support will provide up to 100% discount to some households and increase support for working claimants.

A charitable giving fund www.gofundme.com/SCDCcostofliving has been created that residents can donate to; SCDC is pledged an initial £15,000. The money will go towards low-cost methods of staying warm and cooking such as slow cookers and electric blankets.

There will be an expansion of Warm Hubs which are free spaces where residents of all ages can visit to socialise, work, and catch up with friends. Food parcels will be available for people attending the Warm Hubs who are identified as being most in need, in parishes where there is no foodbank already in place.

An additional £15,000 has been set aside to expand the Warm Packs that are provided to Council tenants. They will now include an electric blanket, hot water bottle, thermos flask, blanket, thermal socks, gloves and hat. Environmental Health officers can distribute Warm Packs to residents living in very cold conditions.

#### 4 Day Week Trial

Some concerns have been expressed as to whether the 4-day working week trial planned for the first three months of next year will affect the council's service quality. While details are still being hammered out, councillors have been assured that there will be no reduction in opening hours. In fact, SCDC is looking to extend opening hours, whether via telephone, a soon-to-be-launched webchat service, or Teams or Zoom meetings.
