ONLINE REPORTING

Did you know that many day-to-day issues can be easily reported direct to the relevant Council Department online?

Both Cambridge County Council and South Cambs District Council have an online reporting tool which enables issues to be reported direct to the Council:

County Council - Highways / Footpaths

You can report problems on roads or pavements on the County Council's Highway reporting tool: https://highwaysreporting.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/

This includes:

potholes / road surface issues kerbs verges flooding

hedges and trees public rights of way road markings road signs traffic signals empty grit bins

Supporting photographs to illustrate the issues can also be uploaded to the site.

You can also use the highway reporting tool to track progress on a fault already reported. Enter the reference number for your fault or the area of the fault into the top right-hand box on the map to view updates.

Street Lighting Issues (Most SCDC managed streetlights will have an identifying tag with a number and details of who faults should be reported to)

To report a street lights (not SCDC managed) that are not working or are permanently on, please use the Balfour Beatty reporting form:

You will need to quote the lamp reference number which can be found on the lamp post.

You can also use the highway reporting tool to track progress on a fault already reported. Enter the reference number for your fault or the area of the fault into the top right-hand box on the map to view updates.

REPORTING CRIME

999 - the emergency line

As a general rule, 999 should be used:

when someone is in immediate danger, if the crime is still in progress, you need police help immediately, if property is in danger of being damaged or a serious disruption to the public is likely.

For crimes that aren't urgent, please avoid calling 999.

101 - the non-emergency line

Call handlers can be reached on 101 to:

report minor and non-emergency crimes that are not currently in progress (where immediate or high-priority response is not

required) or to offer evidence in an investigation or to seek guidance or advice from police about a situation you have witnessed or been involved in.

During busy periods, you may have to wait for an operator to assist you. If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use the textphone service on 18001 101

Online

If you have access to online services, online reports or live web chat can be used to alleviate waiting times, and your issue will be dealt with in the exact same way if you were to call 101.

Live Web Chat

Accessed via the Cambridgeshire Constabulary website www. cambs.police.uk live chat can be used to report non-urgent crimes, seek advice, guidance or support, or to report something suspicious you've seen or heard.

Messages are handled in the same way as online reports or 101 calls but can be much faster. The only difference between calling 101 and using web chat is the technology used. The process operators follow after they receive the information is exactly the same.

Online reports provide you with a quick and easy way to report non-urgent crime. There are dedicated reports for reporting a crime, missing people, domestic abuse, road traffic incidents, antisocial behavior, lost or stolen vehicles, civil disputes, hate crime, fraud, bribery and corruption.

There are also dedicated forms so you can report if you have seen anything suspicious or that you think the Police should know about.

Social Media

If you need support, advice or guidance, you can send a direct message via any of the social media pages to save you waiting in line for an operator if you were to call 101.

Social media inboxes are always monitored.

You can contact @CambsCops on Twitter, Facebook or Instagram at any time and operators on the Digital Desk will see your message and respond in due course.

Maintenance Planned Programme of Works

We continue to be committed to improving our tenant's homes. During the last financial year (April 2022 to March

2023) we have undertaken an extensive programme of works to properties in Papworth Everard. These include:

- 33 boiler replacements
- 28 electrical rewires
- 12 new bathrooms
- 14 new kitchens
- 18 front door canopies

Shortly a programme of gutter cleaning will commence to 70 properties within the village.

The Trust carry out stock condition surveys to all their properties, these are completed every 5 years with a set percentage being completed annually. Completing these surveys enables the Trust to forecast budget requirements and produce effective capital and planned works programmes.

For 2023 the Trust would like to offer tenants the opportunity to speak to a member of the Executive Team face to face on a monthly basis. Time for Tenants sessions will take place once a month on a Saturday, between 10am and 12noon at Bradbury Court, Papworth Everard. The first session will be on 18 February 2023. Papworth Surgery New Appointment Booking System

We would like to wish everyone a happy new year! This month we have some big news to share with you about how the practice will be running and the way our patients can contact us moving forward. We know that any change can provoke anxiety but we have been listening to feedback from all of our patients and our staff, and we all agree the current system is not working well. We have set out to solve the main problems the current old-fashioned system has. In particular; the frustrating waits on hold for the phone to be answered, not seeing the same doctor every time, difficulties accessing appointments for people who cannot wait on the telephone and the worry of "how do I get help today when all the appointments have been booked?".

We have visited other practices who use other systems and we are pleased to inform you that from the 1st March we will be moving to a system called AccuRx. AccuRx will be available via a link on our website, and all of our patients will need to use this system if they wish to request an appointment with a doctor. You can use AccuRx to send a short summary of your symptoms and concerns to us. It should only take a few minutes to complete the form.

Every request will be triaged by a doctor on that day. The doctor could send you advice, call you, direct you to another

Outside these events, the library is still offering a warm welcome to those who wish to drop in to choose books, stay to read, relax with one of our jigsaw puzzles or use our free WiFi or a library computer. Our Digital Buddy continues to be in the library on a Tuesday morning, to help you make the most of the online world; if you'd like to make a booking to see them then do just ask at the library counter.

Also to say that February is LGBT+ History Month. Discover a rainbow of reading in our display of books by LGBT+ authors. Additionally, 6-12 February is Children's Mental Health Week. Reading all sorts of books for pleasure can give children a great sense of wellbeing, and we have lots they can choose from. We also have a special collection of books that support children with specific mental health problems, such as anxiety – ask at the library counter for more information

Finally, in this Valentine's Day month, why not take a chance on a blind date with a book? Check out a mystery wrapped book from our display. Who knows, you might fall in love with it!

Library opening hours are still Tuesday 10am – 1pm, 2pm – 5pm; Wednesday 10am – 1pm, Thurs 2pm – 5pm and Sat 10pm – 1pm. service such as a physiotherapy, arrange some diagnostic tests, ask reception to book you an appointment today/ tomorrow/fortnight depending on urgency or an appointment with a particular doctor who knows you.

Our patients who do not have access to the internet or are unable to complete the AccuRx online form themselves are still welcome to telephone us. Our receptionists will be trained to complete the form on your behalf, but they will not be able to book you an appointment until the request has been triaged by a doctor.

There may be times when we have to pause use of AccuRx, for example, if we have staff sickness or there is very high demand for appointments. In these cases, which we expect to be infrequent, patients can still call us if they have a medical emergency, but anything else we would ask to wait for the next working day at 7 a.m. when AccuRx switches back on again.

Our aim is to improve patient safety and quality of care. We want you to be able to see the right clinician, in the right time frame and avoid duplication of work! We also hope that by having a doctor triaging requests instead of the reception team, our patients will feel more confident that a doctor is aware of your symptoms and that we will make a plan with you. There is very positive feedback from other GP practices who use this system. Dr Cronk has recently been working at a local practice who use AccuRx, and reports that it works really well.

For now, while we are trailing the new system it is for doctors' appointments only and all other appointment requests (such as routine nursing appointments, physiotherapy, blood tests, reviews of long-term health conditions/medications etc.) can be requested using the old system via the telephone.

We will have more information on our website soon.

'A Time for Reconciliation'

What I write here can apply, I believe, to seemingly small and apparently insignificant scenarios as much as national or global situations. Where the cap fits, wear it!

War in Ukraine continues. The standing of national politicians is probably at an all-time low. The numbers of 2-income households having to turn to foodbanks is rising rapidly.

The deep dysfunction within the Royal Family is a sorry reminder of how far and wide is the need for a period in which reconciliation is allowed to take place, flourish and be transformative.

I am not expert in the detail that underlies the issues in these and many similar situations; but I do know Christians have a distinctive understanding of what is required to bring reconciliation. One of the momentous achievements of Nelson Mandela, after he became President, was setting up the Truth and Reconciliation Commission in 1996 to address the ills carried out in South Africa in the name of apartheid. Its' very title reminds us, any effective reconciliation is prefaced by the victims or aggrieved parties being able to be heard about the wrongs done. The influence of a Christian worldview was provided by the Chairmanship of Archbishop Desmond Tutu; his task was to allow truth to be told rather than the desire for vengeance to spiral or prevail.

There are a number of essential ingredients in any private or public process of reconciliation. Aggrieved parties need to be able to say how behaviour that has impacted negatively has felt and what it has done. Villains of the piece must own and acknowledge their wrongdoing. Forgiveness has to be extended by the aggrieved party to the other.

The wrongdoer has to change his or her attitude and behaviour to such an extent that what went wrong previously can't happen again. These steps indicate why such things take time; because of the complexity of the issues involved often and the depth of the intrusion wrongdoing has made on the composure and wellbeing of victims. Equally, all of the steps need to be coordinated or brought together.

The role of reconciler is rarely one that will attract recognition and plaudits; because it is about serving the needs of others and in such a way that pain and brokenness can be ameliorated and

transformed and those previously at odds (rather than those facilitating reconciliation) can be celebrated for laying down their divisions and hostility.

My prayer for the coming months is for gifts of reconciliation to prosper and the weeds of hostility to be overcome and wither.

The first-year university student is busy raising sponsorship to facilitate the trips on behalf of Play Action International and Volunteer Zambia Sport. Tree Warden Report

We are now in February, the shortest month of the year and one of the coldest months in the UK. In Finnish, the month is called helmikuu, meaning "month of the pearl"; when snow melts on tree branches, it forms droplets, and as these freeze again, they are like pearls of ice. In Macedonian the month is sechko, meaning month of cutting (wood). In

Slovene, February has been called sečan, meaning "the month of cutting down of trees".

Hopefully there will not be any cutting down of trees in Papworth, but this month is within the dormant winter period that is best for tree planting. I have been consulting with the Parish Council and the Varrier Jones Foundation to agree where and when we will plant a tree to commemorate the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee. An oak tree, funded by the Parish Council, will be planted on Jubilee Green, with the assistance of the VJF tree surgeon. At the time of writing this report, the tree planting will occur at 1pm on Thursday 23rd February. Children from Pendragon School have been invited to participate in the event. I hope the weather is kind on the day!

An important date in February is, of course, the 14th, Valentine's Day. In 2019, the Forestry Commission reached its 100th birthday and, as part of the celebrations it invited people to write about what trees and forests mean to them on Valentine's Day. The renowned poet Carol Ann Duffy created a new work to celebrate the centenary, inspired by the nation's forests. Her poem,'Forest' together with other submissions by members of the public, can be found on the Forestry Commission web site www.forestryengland. uk in their 'Tributes to Trees' section. Duffy's poem includes the line: 'The forest keeps different time; slow hours as long as your life ... These grave and patient saints who pray and pray and suffer your little embrace.'

For my Tree Warden Alphabet I have reached the letter 'i' for insects. The insect and other invertebrate life occur in a bewildering array of forms in deciduous woodlands. Every source of organic matter supports some kind of invertebrate, whether in the soil deep below the litter or on the topmost bud. Leaves are attacked from within and without – they are bitten and chewed by caterpillars and adult weevils, mined by moth, fly and weevil larvae, sucked by bugs and disfigured by gall-forming midges, mites and wasps.

Inside the trunk another community of insects is busy, especially at any vulnerable points of decay. The first invaders are often

bark beetles whose 'softening up' process paves the way for wood lice, millipedes, centipedes, spiders, earwigs and flies. Later still, ants, bees and wasps may colonise the interior of the stricken timber.

Many of these invertebrates exist equally well in the leaf litter. Here earthworms, woodlice and mites abound, breaking down the waste products of everything they find, to the benefit of the fertility of the woodland.

So, walk lightly on the forest floor, look closely at the trees and undergrowth around you, enjoy the diversity of the insects, mammals and birds that inhabit the wild wood.




January 2023



Access to the library on Saturdays is by the rear door

The first meeting of the year had to be cancelled due to a flood in the library. Fortunately, this problem was resolved and the first meeting took place on 22 January. There was a terrific turnout, which was great. Our youngest ever recruit, aged 9, arrived with her dad, wanting to know how to cast on her knitting projects. Already able to knit basic stitches, she soon mastered casting on and also how to make a neat edge to her work - especially important for the scarf she is knitting for ggift. It is truly gratifying to have younger, aspiring crafters coming along to our meetings, wanting to learn how to knit or crochet. Time spent away from mobile phones and computers, engaged in working with their hands is certainly no bad thing. If you are a mum or dad with a young person, who has expressed an interest in learning to knit, crochet or cross stitch, but yourselves unable to satisfy this wish, please bring them to the library on either the first or third Saturday of the month. There are members ready and willing to introduce your young person to the 'mystery' of these crafts. If possible please bring your own materials to start with.

A stand out project of the first meeting was a crocheted square for a throw. What made it so special was the pattern itself - it looked exactly like a stained glass window. This pattern requires skill and patience to execute correctly. When all the squares are completed and assembled into the throw, the effect will be stunning and truly unique.

As our yarn stash is still reasonably healthy, it was possible to

donate some balls of yarn and knitting needles to the Warm Hub that has been set up in Northstowe by one member in the Craft Group. (She learned to crochet during the two hours of the meeting in January. Amazing work)! This serves as a reminder that there are people in 'fuel poverty' here in Cambridgeshire as well as other parts of the country. Warm hubs offer a place to stay for a few hours, have a warm drink and meet other people. Yarn, knitting needles and crochet hooks provide an activity for those who want to make something, or even learn to knit or crochet.

An update on charity blankets. The charity HOPE AND AID DIRECT are sending knitted blankets to Ukraine. It is hoped that our blankets, assembled and finished by Sonja Allerton can be taken to a reasonably local collection point. If you would like to make squares for these blankets they should measures 20 cm x 20 cm (8 inches x 8 inches). Please sew in all the ends. Hope and Aid Direct have volunteers who assemble squares into blankets and are asking people to knit them to their own pattern, which they have found to be much easier to join together. If you would like to knit squares for these blankets, look for this pattern on their website, opeandaiddirect.org.uk or contact Rosalind Parnell at parnellrh@ aol.com. If you would like some yarn to make squares, please contact Rosalind.

The Papworth Library generously hosts the Papworth Craft Group as a community project. It is always worth remembering that rural libraries are precious and the library is at the heart of this village. You can exchange your books and visit the Papworth Craft Group at the same visit. New members are most welcome. Pop by for a chat to see whether the group is for you. There is no requirement to spend the full two hours of the meeting. However, two hours of uninterrupted crafting may be just what is missing from your Saturdays!

District Councillor's Monthly Report – Febuary 2023

Buses

The Combined Authority (the Mayor's office) will levy a special precept within next year's council tax bill, to continue subsidising the rural bus services it rescued at the end of last year. The additional amount is expected to be £12 for a

Band D property.

The Greater Cambridge Partnership's (GCP) "Making Connections" consultation on improved bus services funded by a congestion charge received an over-whelming response. Over 23,000 responses were received from organisations and individuals, together with more than 100,000 written comments. Obviously, it's going to take some time for the GCP to analyse all that data and identify what changes are necessary to the original proposals. They still expect to have a final plan for the County Council (the body responsible for our roads) to vote on in the summer.

Development and the Local Plan

Several residents have asked me about misleading headlines suggesting 57,000 new houses are going to be built in the Greater Cambridge area. The number of residences needed was determined by a government algorithm which estimates the jobs and population growth of the area by 2041, and deduces the number of dwellings required for the additional residents. We have already reached the number of jobs previously expected to be created by 2031 by the end of last year! Consequently, the latest revision of the Local Plan estimates that 5,000 additional dwellings will be required, on top of the 46,000 previously planned. Of that second number, some have already been built, for example, in West Cambourne.

There are several caveats around these numbers.

The councils will not permit large scale developments until the water supply issue is resolved. A new reservoir is planned in Fenland as is a major new pipeline from Grafham Water. However, these sources are at least 5 years away from coming on stream.

Most of the new dwellings are planned for three strategic areas on the outskirts of Cambridge. Rural villages with no or poor public transport links are not considered good locations for large developments.

A new government may change the way housing needs are calculated.

Voter ID

You may have seen publicity about the need to present voter ID when you vote in person. As South Cambridgeshire does not have local elections this year, we will not be affected immediately. If you don't have another form of picture ID such as a passport or driving license, you can now apply to the District Council for a free voter ID certificate online here:

Homes for Ukraine: Hosts still needed for guests already in South Cambs

Hosts are still desperately needed across South Cambs to support families who have already arrived from Ukraine, with hosts eligible to receive up to £500 a month as a thank you payment. Around 770 people from Ukraine have already arrived in South Cambs and, with the war continuing, there is an ongoing demand to provide them with a safe place to stay. Under the Homes for Ukraine scheme, hosts sign up to provide a home for guests for a minimum of six months. However, around 20% of current hosts are not able to continue past that initial six-month period. Guests who have been staying with them would benefit from alternative accommodation locally, so

they can continue to build on the relationships and community connections they have already been able to make.

Hosts receive comprehensive support from the District Council, along with a £350 monthly Government 'Thank you' payment. The District Council also offers an additional opt-in monthly payment to hosts of £150. This takes the total host payment to £500 per month. Anyone who can offer a spare room and warm welcome is being asked to text ROOM to 88802. The Council will support applicants through the process and match hosts to guests who have already started to settle in the local area.

Key Amnesty

South Cambs District Council is running a Key Amnesty campaign throughout February. People who are misusing council properties are being offered a one-off opportunity to #DoTheRightThing and return their keys without facing criminal proceedings. It gives tenants the opportunity to voluntarily hand in their keys, for a limited time, with no further action taken. Situations where tenants should hand in keys include where properties have been left empty or are illegally sub-let. For more information, email fraud@scambs.gov.uk or call the Housing department.

Batteries

You can now recycle batteries by putting them in a plastic bag and tying the bag to the handle of any bin. Previously you could only recycle batteries with the blue bin. Please do not throw old batteries into the grey bin, as this presents a fire hazard. Recently one of our bin lorries caught fire in Cambridge due to burning batteries and the lorry was only saved by the quick action of the driver who dumped his load into the street!
