Changes to household battery recycling collections

Adjustments to the bin lorries mean that residents can now receive a weekly battery collection by leaving batteries on their blue, green or black bins. To aid crews, residents are now asked to place batteries in a sealed or tied small plastic bag and place this loose on top of the bin lid, rather than tying it to the bin handle. This will help crews to collect them more efficiently. Batteries must never be put inside bins, where they can be damaged and catch fire.

Dog Fouling

With the lighter evenings upon us soon and more children playing out on the on the fields and public areas in the village, please can we remind dog owners to pick up after your dog. Allowing your dog to foul and not clearing it up is unacceptable.

Dog mess left on pathways can end up on shoes, scooters, bike wheels and prams and spread all over the place – it really isn't nice. Dog fouling is particularly unpleasant when it is left on the playing field for people playing sports to tread in. The sports pitches are in regular use for football, but unfortunately, prior to each match, the football coaches have to scour the playing field removing piles of dog mess before they can start playing which wouldn't be necessary if dog owners took responsibility for clearing up after their dogs.

Dog fouling is not only unpleasant, it can also be dangerous – particularly for children. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness and seizures.

It is illegal not to clear up the mess left by your dog as soon as it has fouled and those that leave their mess behind could be liable to a fixed penalty notice. It is the responsibility of the dog owner or the person in charge of a dog to clear up any mess - being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse.

There are many dedicated dog waste bins throughout village so there is no excuse to leave dog mess on the paths and open spaces. If you can't find a dog bin, you can bag your pet's poo, seal it well and place it in any standard litter bin – or take it home for disposal in your black bin.

Changes to Making Appointments at Papworth GP Surgery

What is changing?


From 1st March we are introducing a new way of making appointments to see a Doctor.

We will be offering the same number of Doctors appointments, either face to face or on the phone. We will have the same number of clinicians working daily.

All appointments for nurses, blood tests etc can be made in the same way as they are currently i.e. by phoning the surgery.

Why is this changing?

We want to improve the patient experience by offering a more



The weather has started to get warmer, so up the allotments we are all starting to get back on our plots and plan what we are going to grow for 2023.

My wife and I have been adding an extra layer of wood chip to the paths on our plot over the winter, we have also been adding manure to our planting beds so that when it warms up we can plant into rich, warmed up soil and our seedlings can get off to a great start. This also gets us out and enjoying the fresh air in winter as well as a lot of exercise carrying and spreading the contents of the bags.

We will probably still get frosts before May so any seedlings delivered to our house we will grow on and harden off before we plant on the plot, but just planting them up at home can make you feel Spring is just round the corner.



On our plot we have some perennial planting such as fruit canes (black currants, gooseberries, raspberries etc), asparagus, strawberries and globe artichoke. We then add to that with annual plantings such as potatoes, sweetcorn, broccoli and beetroot. We also plant

leeks and onions, in fact we are usually self sufficient for the year with the onions we grow. I also grow large pumpkins, not to eat

just for fun and to give to friends' children for carving at Halloween.

If you fancy joining us up the allotments we have a few spare plots at present (when they are gone you can be added to the waiting list). This is a great time to join as you can prepare your plot before planting time. We can offer fresh air, plenty of exercise and at the end of the process

some gorgeous fresh food. We have a few plots that have been used so you will not be starting with an empty never before dug

What if I cannot use the website?

You can still call the practice and our team will complete the form for you. Your request will be dealt with in the same way as requests made online

What happens when the service is not available?

If your need is not medically urgent please access the service from 7 am the following working day.

'For everything there is a season'

I am no horticulturalist but by my reckoning this year's crop of daffodils are late and my wife has noticed! It's another simple reminder there are many things we can't

Christians have a long tradition of reminding themselves we are creatures of our God. This tells us there will always be major areas

of mystery and much we don't fathom or understand. For some this engenders excitement, for others it's a reason to worry or become anxious.

An important question is, therefore, how to live well and not let the things we can't control or manipulate drag us down. I find this is where the teaching of Jesus remains so relevant and timely. The second half of Matthew chapter 6 is an excellent example.

First, he encourages us to have a utilitarian approach to money, possessions and wealth; rather than be driven to accumulate as much as we can – for the simple reason we have these things for this life and can't take them with us. This is not an argument against prudence or wise self-management but an encouragement to examine our underlying motivations. Then he addresses the reality of living with anxiety, but against the backcloth of having entrusted our hopes and ambitions to God. Look carefully and find a step-by-step approach to facing the things that worry us and finding a place of rest and composure in the eye of the storm.

We are now in the season of Lent. For some it is something to ignore, for others a time to give up a few luxuries in the hope of getting ourselves in better shape for the spring and summer whilst there are those who see it as a season to take on new challenges and disciplines – whether or not we are people of faith. Whatever you do or don't do, it can be helpful to take time to review or take stock of what is going on in and around us. One outcome can be to seize the moment for something that has been denied, ignored or simply not given enough time to address.

For the past 2 years I have begun the year making or updating a list of a few people I intend to make time and space to see – going beyond the annual exchange of cards at Christmas! Two weeks ago, I was brought up short by a phone call, telling me that one of those people had died before I got round to seeing again. Here was another plan I had pencilled into my thinking in good faith

but not made the space and time to fulfil. Now it is too late. I am annoyed with myself because it is a mistake, I have made more than once. Note to self: in future make good plans and action them without delay!






Papworth Everard INSPIRING WOMEN Womens Institute

There were some bright and sunny days in mid February, an opportunity to get out and about to enjoy the displays of snowdrops and aconites in places like Anglesey Abbey. Now we are in March and the sap is beginning to rise in trees and hedgerows. Buds are swelling and soon the dark woods will show a green

haze of fresh growth. The longer days and warmer temperatures are encouraging the birds to sing out and to build their nests. In other words, we are on the cusp of Spring.

For my tree warden alphabet, I have been focusing on 'J' for Jubilee. The commemorative tree marking the Queen's Platinum Jubilee has been planted on Jubilee Green by the school children of Papworth, with representatives from the Parish Council and the Varrier Jones Foundation also in attendance. Planting the tree is a mark of celebration and appreciation for all those years of service to the nation by our late Queen. And, because the planting of any tree is an investment in the future, it is also a signal of confidence and hope for the future.



The Queen's 70 year rule is the longest of any British monarch. Her reign covered a period of accelerating social and technical change, during which the Queen stayed constant in her Christian belief and her commitment to service. The 'Queen's Green Canopy' is a nationwide initiative to create a living legacy with over a million trees planted in Her Majesty's name across the nation during the first planting season, October 2021 to March 2022. The tree we have planted on Jubilee Green is part of that legacy and a lasting tribute to Her Majesty's extraordinary service to her country and her people.

It will be Mothering Sunday on the 19th of March. A time for families to be together, for cards to be written and posies to be given. A time for sharing memories. So much can be said with a bunch of daffodils. I hope that, by then, in our gardens and the parks we might visit, we will find hosts of golden daffodils to delight our inward and outward eyes.

The year is marching on and signs of spring are popping up everywhere. February has been a really good month at the Papworth Craft Group. We have new members and that is always so gratifying, whether it is someone who is new to the village or someone who has read this column and is finally free to come along. At the second session of the month a young mother joined us, and is looking forward to two free hours twice a month to spend with others and her knitting. The membership now has a wide spread of ages with the youngest at nine years old and the oldest at.....well, wise in years and experience. There is plenty of chatter, laughter and mutual support. Each one has their own individual contribution to make, with the opportunity of learning from one to another. There is always room for more to join us, so please do not be shy or worried that you may not be good enough at your chosen craft. Enthusiasm will have brought you to the group and that will more than suffice. Help is at hand with knitting, crochet and cross stitch most definitely. If you embroider or do patch work, you may be the ones to offer help, although there are a few members who have a rudimentary knowledge in them.

The Danish Advent Calendar being stitched by Michele Eidevik-Skinner is almost complete and it is beautiful. One irritation has cropped up though - there is insufficient white floss to finish it! Hopefully Permin, the Danish company responsible for the kit will send some more on request. Running out of floss is one of the hazards of buying a cross stitch kit. It is possible that there has been a miscalculation or an error in the assembly of the kit to account for insufficient floss, as in the case of the Advent Calendar . Not only was there a shortfall in the required amount of white floss but a surplus of the red. However, if you take out your work due to recurring mistakes, running out of floss is increasingly likely. Fortunately, manufacturers are more than happy to supply you with extra floss, usually without charge. Our delightful, youngest member, Nor, is progressing with her scarf and learning a few tips as she goes along. The prospective recipient of the scarf will surely be delighted with her gift.

A brief heads up for those who enjoy going to crafting events. From 23 - 26 March the Stitch Festival is taking place at the Business Design Centre in London. Tickets are £16.50 for adults, concession tickets, (age 60+, students, disabled visitors) are £15.00, children (5 -18 years) are £7.50 and children under 5 years old are free. Carers are also free. There are workshops to sign up to and a load of exhibitors with more than enough goodies to make your wallets a lot lighter! For more information go to

Stitchfestival.seetickets.com. The venue is in Islington, one stop from King's Cross/St Pancras to Angel. The Business Design Centre is a short walk from the underground station. Alternatively, there is a car park at the venue.

For those who are passionate about cross stitching, one of the most important events in the calendar is the Nashville Needlework Market 2023. Although this event is for retailers only, there are plenty of places to see the new designs that will be exhibited there on Instagram as well as on the websites or YouTube channels of the designers. Retailers in the USA preview new designs and at least one online retailer of cross stitch in the UK is doing the same, (see Peaksideneedleworks.co.uk). Although this is primarily an American event for American cross stitch designers, there are some European ones as well. There is plenty on which to feast your eyes and there are some spectacular designs on exhibit, from contemporary one to older traditional samplers that have been transferred from the original works into cross stitch charts.



You can hand in squares to Nicola at Papworth Library, bring them to either of our meetings or contact Rosalind Parnell at parnellrh@ aol.com. For anyone wishing to help assembling the squares into blankets or if you need yarn, the same contact applies. Thanking you in advance for the gift of your time.

Every visit to the library contributes to footfall. By attending the Papworth Craft Group you are making that contribution. This matters. The library cannot be taken for granted and it is vital that it is used as much as possible. It would be dreadful if our library joined the list of closed rural libraries.
