# Changes To Making Appointments at Papworth GP Surgery

The new appointment booking system went live on 1st March. There have been some issues with the new system but the practice report on the whole changing to a new system has gone well. Below is a reminder of a few key points.

The surgery will be will be offering the same number of Doctors appointments, either face to face or on the phone with the same number of clinicians working daily as before the changes.

All appointments for nurses, blood tests etc can be made in the same way as they are currently i.e. by phoning the surgery.

The system has been changed to improve the patient experience and reduce frustrating telephone waiting times.

To make an make an appointment

Visit the surgery website www.papworthsurgery.nhs.uk and click on the Contact Us Online button. You can then choose to submit an admin query or help for a medical issue.

If you have a medical issue and would like to make an appointment please choose this option. Complete the form with as much detail as possible, including photos if appropriate.

The service will be switched on every weekday morning at 7am and all requests will be viewed and triaged by the Duty Doctor on the same day to ensure your are seen and treated appropriately for your need.

If you cannot use the website you can still call the practice and our team will complete the form for you. Your request will be dealt with in the same way as requests made online.

### PADDLING POOL ATTENDANTS REQUIRED FOR THE SUMMER HOLIDAYS

The Parish Council will be opening the paddling pool once again this summer.

The paddling pool is a great asset to the village and well used each year by children from the village and from further afield. But, we need helpers to keep it running - without people to look after the pool, we would be unable to open it up for the summer. It takes a great deal of work to maintain the pool so it is safe and clean to use.

We are hoping to employ 3 or 4 people (Age 18+) to share cover of approximately 5-6 hours spread out over the day from early morning until early evening, 7 days a week, from mid-July until early September. The pool attendant is a paid position, and all necessary training will be provided.

#### **OVERHANGING HEDGES & TREES**

Cambridgeshire County Council's Highways Department have asked us to remind householders that hedges and trees should not be allowed to encroach onto the public highway.

As we move into spring, vegetation is growing rapidly and can very quickly cause problems for pedestrians when it starts to encroach the public footpaths. This is particularly an issue for wheelchair users and parents with children in prams and buggies, when twigs can be at face height and easily cause scratches.

The owner or occupier of a property has a legal responsibility (Highways Act 1980 s154) to ensure that the 'public highway' adjacent to a property is not obstructed by vegetation from their property. The public highway is defined by law as consisting of any verge, footway, bridleway or footpath that is maintained at public expense and over which the public has right of way.

Local Authorities have a legal duty to ensure that public highways are unobstructed, so usually inspect roads regularly and often receive complaints from members of the general public.

When Local Authorities become aware of such obstructions, they can issue a formal notice for the work to be undertaken, which, if ignored will result in the Local Authority undertaking the work and charging their costs back to the owner/occupier.

If your hedge is a starting to get a bit unruly, with twigs and branches sticking out towards the pavement, now is the perfect time of year, before the birds are nesting, to get those shears and hedge trimmers out and get trimming to help keep our pathways clear and unobstructed!

Issues such as overhanging hedges, bushes and trees or any other highways matters such as potholes, street signs, damage to street furniture and obstructions or debris and mud on the road can be reported online via the Cambridgeshire County Council Highways Department reporting tool https://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/residents/travel-roads-and-parking/roads-and-pathways/roadworks-and-faults

### **VOTER ID CHANGES**

From 4 May this year, voters will be required to show photo ID in polling stations before being allowed to vote. There are no planned elections in South Cambridgeshire on 4 May, but the new requirements will be in place for any elections that follow this date.

Any resident without an accepted form of ID can apply now for their free Voter Authority Certificate. # Giving thanks for the service we receive

The deadline for writing this article seems to come over the horizon faster with each passing month! Thinking about it this time, I was reminded that, of course, I am one of a host of contributors to what is a source of information interest and even inspiration to many more. Commitments and projects that are worthwhile and serve a wider community than those active in its production are,

usually, the fruit of vision and cooperation.

We saw this powerfully in early March – with the row over 'Lineker-gate'; resulting in a favourite programme for many over a typical weekend being greatly curtailed. The voluntary or forced withdrawal of what one person could do impacted millions.

One big difference I have noticed living in a rural village is the realisation some important tasks or jobs need to be actioned by local people doing their bit voluntarily (rather than assuming the local authority will step in). It is very heartening to drive down a road and realise a team have been out the previous day litterpicking; although why the mindless behaviour that prompts a few to toss their takeaway meal containers out of the car window rather than putting them in a waste bin prevails is a mystery, (or a sign of widespread selfishness).

So, thank you, again, to volunteers – what you do makes a huge difference and matters.

With daffodils currently (as I write) in full bloom, I am reminded, also, that some of our small seemingly inconsequential actions last for years and just keep on blooming year after year. What was sown and buried at one time can have the potential to bring cheer, comfort and strength for many generations to come. This analogy offers an insight into how Christians celebrate Easter – where God's action in Jesus of Nazareth in the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday keep on repaying faith nearly 2,000 years later. This was the supreme act of voluntary service for which the right response is to offer thanks and live thankfully before God and one another.

Unlike others, I have little or no horticultural understanding. Neither do I get much of the science that has undoubtedly helped us come alive to the threats of environmental disaster lurking just around the corner and the need for us all to do our bit now. I am grateful for those who do and offer their wisdom so liberally; but I do value

the fruit of their study and labour. To do so is an expression of trust and wisdom which is returned as the experts in one field do something similar to enjoy the expertise of others in other matters. One again this is how spiritual faith works, not boiling down to what I can understand and explain but a realisation of what is true and transforms the world.

Whether you are a person of some faith, much faith or no faith in what Christians believe about Jesus please consider joining us to give thanks and worship on Easter Day.



### **Tree Warden Report**

Proud April 'puts a sprint of youth in everything'. The promise of sunshine and showers to bless our gardens. The beauty, colour and allure of blossom around every corner of the village. From the lowest bough to the tallest tree, buds are swelling and leaves are beginning to unfold. There will soon be a fresh green

flush over our woods and the woodland floor will be carpeted with bluebells and primroses. Our garden birds are becoming bolder and the insect kingdom will be busy in every flower, nook and cranny.

I hope you have kept up to date with preparing your gardens for the growing season ahead. There is so much to do, but good advice is available in books and magazines, on TV and online, as well as from friends and family, to encourage productive and sustainable gardening. Gardening that is good for nature, good for your wellbeing and good for your plate!

With Spring, we move into the season of open gardens. As well as those large houses and parks open to the public, there are many private gardens opened up for charity, usually at weekends, so look out for the yellow booklet of the Open Gardens Scheme (also available online).

My tree warden alphabet has reached the letter 'K' and I want to take the opportunity to look at tree knots. Knots in wood are formed when branches are broken off or cut close to the trunk, and the exposed wood is left behind. As the tree continues to grow, the trunk expands and overtakes where the branches once grew, and knots form around these bases. Knots and blemishes can also be formed by injuries to the tree or by fungal infections.

Knots are known to affect the technical properties of wood. Knots are pretty hard to cut through themselves, but they also reduce the local strength of the wood that surrounds them. Knots are not always bad though; they are often exploited for visual effect. In some cases, knots add to the aesthetic appeal of the planks that are sawn from those trees.

Knots that can be seen on the trunks of living trees have their own visual appeal and there is a wide variety in their appearance. If you take a walk through the village and up to the woods around Papworth Hall, as I did recently, you will soon discover several trees with magnificent knots of different shapes and sizes. You will find them on oak trees, birch trees, ash trees and others; at eye level and above. They are imperfections or blemishes on the surface of the trunk or main branch. They have a beauty of their own and perhaps that is a general lesson for us all.

I came across some creative writing resources from Liverpool University, using the character of trees. It is suggested you: find a face in the bark of a tree: maybe where the knots in the wood, bark and moss create a face-like shape, and where the branches make the hair. Think about what kind of character it has. Could the texture of the bark, the shape of the branches, roots and leaves give you any clues about its personality? After you have decided on the character of your tree, try to write a poem that has this tree tell its story. This could be what the tree sees from where it stands, what it hears climbing amongst its branches, the animals that burrow under its roots or how it watches its leaves change with the seasons. You might write a descriptive poem or an acrostic poem, a pattern poem or a Haiku poem. There are other writing ideas on the Liverpool University, Alder Hay Trees Competition web site.

I would be interested to see any of your creative writing and artwork, inspired by looking at the trees, hedgerows and woods around Papworth.

There is plenty of activity at the meetings of the Papworth Craft Group and it is always interesting to see how projects are progressing. Our youngest member, who is knitting a scarf for a friend, has started a new colour and has a further two colours to add later. The yarn is a beautiful, chunky, merino one, also incredibly soft, ideal to help make it a warm and cosy garment. It has been mentioned in this column, no doubt on more than one occasion, that being a group of crafters of varying experience in several crafts - mostly in crochet, knitting and cross stitch - there is the opportunity to pick one another's brains and get help if difficulties arise. It was good to see this in action during our last meeting in March, when a problem arose with a crochet project. Could a different stitch provide a close 'fabric' that the project required? It did not and the discussion moved to the size of hook. Our next meeting will reveal the outcome. This is just a small example of the advantage of having several heads looking for a solution to a problem. It was a satisfying exchange and hopefully helped.

The big event of the year will be the coronation of His Majesty King Charles III. For cross stitchers there is a large, very attractive sampler in the May 2023 edition of Cross Stitcher magazine. This is a lavish project with the coat of arms, guardsmen, the royal coach, the King and the emblems of all four countries of the United Kingdom. The sampler can be stitched as a whole, or individual motifs can be chosen to make a smaller commemorative design. In The World of Cross Stitching, a very different project is on offer - a profile of the King with the date of the coronation underneath

and a border of green foliage. There is less opportunity to extract motifs from this project and like the other project would involve a significant investment of one's time. For cross stitchers without access to the Internet, these are perfect projects. When buying DMC thread for your projects, take care where you buy. There is an astounding range of prices for DMC, ranging from 0.80 pence to £1.30! There is a great deal of choice of project online. To highlight a couple of examples, there is a crochet along offered by Sirdar (sirdar.com) to make a blanket that has the Crown, orb and sceptre and the rose of England at the corners of the blanket and is a very attractive design and a pleasing colour palette. On Etsy there are projects commemorating the coronation, a number of very attractive cross stitch charts, knitted crowns, crocheted figures of the King and Queen Consort - naturally, this is not an exhaustive list! If you have a mind to make something to mark this momentous event, there is surely something out there for you. There will be readers of the News & Views who do not have the Internet at home. Perhaps friends might like to share projects that they think might appeal to them.

At present, we still have a stock of squares for charity blankets. However, our yarn stash is depleting, so this is a CALL FOR YARN. If anyone has some yarn that is surplus to requirements, your donations would be gratefully accepted. Yarn can be left with the librarian or brought to any of our bi-monthly meetings at the library. If you would like to knit or crochet squares, they should measure 20 cm x 20 cm, (8 inches by 8 inches). Please sew in all the ends. If you find making squares 'square', a very efficient method is to knit them corner to corner. Start with one stitch and then increase by one stitch at the beginning of each row. When the sides measure 20 cm, decrease at the beginning of each row. You will get a very neat edge if you slip the first stitch of each row and knit into the back of the last stitch of every row also. Please bring any squares to the library. 



### South Cambridgeshire District Council – Caxton and Papworth Ward District Councillor's Monthly Report – April 2023

#### Bins

The Shared Waste Service reviews bin lorry routes every few years and has now begun a review. This will ensure routes are accommodating new developments in the most efficient way. The results of the review will also allow the service to start to plan for its own four day week trial. The

results of the review will be published in May and adequate notice will be given to residents of any changes.

Separately, all households will be provided with a waste food caddy later this year, in addition to the three wheelie bins. This is a central government initiative to reduce food waste and has been piloted in a number of villages including Milton. Cambridgeshire's waste disposal sites and systems require adaptation before they can handle large quantities of food waste.

### Composting

If you are thinking about home composting but don't know where to start, South Cambs has some pointers online here:

https://www.scambs.gov.uk/recycling-and-bins/reducing-waste/home-composting/

The council's collaboration with www.getcomposting.com allows you to buy low-cost compost bins. A basic composter costs local residents about £32.50 from this site, compared with around double that for the same product on popular online shopping sites.

#### **East West Rail**

The government has now said the route alignment of East West Rail will be announced in May. The possible choices are south via Harston and the Shelfords or north via Northstowe. Both options include a new station at Cambourne. The government also says it will be providing up to £15 million in economic support for communities along the route.

#### Buses

The reliability of buses continues to be an issue across the district. I have submitted a question to Council, asking that the Combined Authority (the mayor's office, which manages subsidised bus services) ensures council tax payers are receiving value for money. We need more robust monitoring of service standards and easier ways to report issues with specific buses.

### **My Litter Pick**

My litter pick started off with a meet up at The Poacher pub in Elsworth at 10am on a Sunday morning. The adult volunteers were driven up to the Cambourne round-a-bout and they were going to walk back towards Elsworth, picking up litter all the way

On the other hand, I stayed in Elsworth on the park, around the shop, Fardell's Lane nature reserve and the school grounds as

this was safe for children. I worked with Mrs. Bennett, our Headteacher and Mrs. Harrison, one of our Governors. We collected 3 bin bags of litter from these areas.

We really enjoyed our morning, even though it was really scary how much litter we found. Hopefully next time we won't find as much litter! Please keep our lovely village LITTER FREE


