PADDLING POOL – SUMMER 2023

The paddling pool closes for the summer on Sunday 3rd September after 6 weeks of use over the school summer holidays.

We would like to thank Fraser Botting, Rebecca Bownass, Amy Bownass and Ellis Cruse for all their work in keeping the pool clean and the water safe for everyone to enjoy. Thanks also to Mark Honeywood for preparing the pool and training the guys to use pumps and testing equipment.

It's not a small job, as the pool has to be vacuumed to remove debris for around two hours a day and the water treated and tested 3-4 times a day and the pump filters flushed and cleaned – in addition to maintaining the general area. The guys have been out in all weathers ensuring the pool is safe and clean for our children to use - and have done a fantastic job!

The paddling pool is a great asset to the village - if you have any ideas or suggestions to make it even better for future years, we'd love to hear from you!

BIN COLLECTIONS

Bin collections are going to change for approximately 80% of households in Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire from mid-September.

New bin collection arrangements will be introduced from the week beginning Monday 18 September 2023.

Greater Cambridge Shared Waste, a partnership between Cambridge City and South Cambridgeshire District Councils, is sending a letter in the post to every household affected which will confirm their new collection arrangements.

Bin collections will not change for any resident who does not receive a letter.

Residents can check their bin collection dates online via the South Cambridgeshire District Council website. There will also be reminders on the councils' social media channels and website.

The changes follow a review of bin rounds which are typically completed by all councils every few years. This takes into account new homes that have been built across the area and ensures bin collection rounds continue to be spread as evenly and efficiently as possible.

The councils are also moving to collect bins over four weekdays, instead of five. This means that, from the week beginning Monday 18 September, household bins will not be collected on a Monday. One benefit of this is that it avoids the disruption to collections that has previously happened after

bank holiday Mondays throughout the year as crews catch-up.

In addition, the routes have also been designed based on the capabilities of the Council's increasing fleet of electric vehicles.

With all this considered, bin rounds have been thoroughly reviewed to ensure that all existing collections – and those from newer homes – can be completed efficiently within a new timetable. As a result, there are changes to bin collection arrangements for many South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge residents – whether that is a new bin day, or an adjustment to the order in which their black or blue and green bins are emptied.

In Papworth, collections will be moving from a Thursday to a Friday.

The frequency of bin collections will remain fortnightly with bins

emptied on alternative weeks. Initially, some residents may find they have two consecutive weeks of the same colour bins being emptied as the new schedule is introduced. After that, all residents will continue to have their black bin emptied one week and their blue and green bins the other.

As is the case now, bins should always be put out ready to be emptied by 6am on the day of collection.

CONTACTING THE POLICE

We have been asked to remind residents of the following:

How you can contact Cambridgeshire Police, and when it is most appropriate to use each method of contact.

Calling 999:

If you are involved or are witness to a situation where:

- · you think things could get heated or violent very soon,
- · someone is in serious danger or at risk of imminent harm,
- · a disruption to the public is likely,
- · you require police assistance right away,

please call 999 - this is what we would classify as an emergency. If you accidentally dial 999, please stay on the line and tell the operator you're safe and that no crime has occurred. If you're in danger but you can't talk on the phone, you should still call 999.

Call 999 from a mobile: If you don't speak or answer questions, press 55 when prompted and your call will be transferred to the police. Pressing 55 only works on mobiles and doesn't allow the police to track your location. If you don't press 55 your call will be ended.

Call 999 from a landline: If you don't speak or answer questions and the operator can only hear background noise, they'll transfer your call to the police. If you replace the handset, the landline may remain connected for 45 seconds in case you pick it up again. Calling 999 from a landline automatically gives the police information about your location.

If you have a hearing or speech impairment, you can use the textphone service 18000 or text on 999 if you've pre-registered with the Emergency SMS service. If you're a British Sign Language (BSL) user, you can call 999BSL use a remote BSL interpreter.

Calling 101 the non-emergency phone number.

Please use 101 to:

- · report minor and non-urgent crimes
- \cdot to report crimes that are not currently in progress (where a high-priority response is not required)
- · or to offer evidence in an investigation.

If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use the textphone service on 18001 101

When you call 101, call handlers will ask you for some information about the reason for your call so they can 'triage' the call and direct you to the relevant team.

During busy periods, you may have to wait for an operator to assist you. If you do have access to online services, these can be used to skip the queues on the 101 phone line.

There is also a live web chat service which can be accessed via the Cambridgeshire Police website (click the green speech

bubble in the corner of the screen and you will be connected to an operator). Web chat can be used for advice, guidance or to report a non-urgent crime. Web chats are dealt with in the same way, and by the same people as 101 calls.

You can also report non-emergency crimes via the website at any time using the online report forms. Again, these are dealt with in the same way, and by the same people as 101 calls. You will receive an auto-response with your crime reference number, your crime will be recorded by our operators and they will be in touch if they need more information from you.

Please note that waste and litter, fly tipping, pests, noise complaints, discarded syringes or drug paraphernalia, dangerous buildings or structures and burst water mains are all council issues, and not police.

Social media

You can also direct message on Facebook and Twitter to report non-urgent crime. Replies are not instant but the inboxes are monitored.

As always, please report anything that concerns you as without it being reported, the police are unable to take any action. Any report made may not result in immediate action being taken but will help the police to build up a picture of what is happening and enable them to take appropriate action.

'Coming home'

This has been the great cry over the summer as the Lionesses progressed to the World Cup Final in Sydney. Sadly, it was not to be.

Home is about the people we are close to, the experiences we have with them and the memories we share; more than the place in which these things happen. That's why home is

so precious and important to many and (tragically) can be a chilling nightmare to others.

Just over 40 years ago I went to live in Scotland. Not only was the weather colder, the accents different but some of the turns of phrase took getting used to - for example someone would ask 'Where do you stay?' meaning 'where do you live?' The adjustment was that the place I 'stayed' was where our belongings were put down but where we 'lived' was about life with one another and others!

In the next few weeks some of the younger people in the village will be heading off to college or university and others staring secondary school. For parents this can be stressful as we wait to see how they settle down, whether they feel 'at home' because new friendships are made and enjoyed. Again, it is a lot about the people rather than the place.

I have the privilege of being invited into many homes – usually to talk about weddings, christenings, funerals and other similar matters. Occasionally I cross a threshold and feel immediately this is a cold place, an unhappy place and so on; not because of the surroundings but because of how relationships have been conducted there.

Jesus echoed the same idea of home being where the people we love and cherish have space and spend time in; when speaking about his Father's house, having many rooms with his promise to the disciples that 'where I am you may be also.' It is for this and other similar reasons people often think of a church as like a family and they leave Sunday by Sunday feeling better about the week to come because of the people they have spent time with, including God also!

The Lionesses are now home – with family and friends, just without the cup they so hoped to be carrying; because home is where we celebrate success, commiserate over losses, find comfort in failure, encourage one another to try again and bring out the best in one another.


David (Dave) Moss 1951-2023

Tree Warden Report

September 2023

In September, as the month progresses, we might feel we are on borrowed time. The landscape scene might be about to change, a cooler wind might be on the way, but not quite yet. The trees take in the last of the food from their leaves, produced by the summer sunshine (photosynthesis). Their seeds have ripened and provide a nutty harvest on the ground beneath the canopy and a feast for wildlife. Hedgerows are displaying the last of their fruit and berries. Nature is turning its attention to making ready for the approach of winter.

The footpaths through our woods are still dry, or at least not as wet and muddy as they will soon become. It's a good time to go exploring, to walk deep into the wood, find a tree trunk to sit on and

immerse yourself in the sounds and sights of the woodland around you. When you have settled, so will nature settle around you. Be patient and as still as possible and you will become part of the background, your senses will become more alert, your eyes more observant. Enjoy the moment.

The Canadian author, Lucy Maud Montgomery called September 'a ripe sheaf of many golden days'. September sunshine can be gentle and warm, providing every tree and hedge with a golden glow, even if the harvest will already have been safely gathered in by then. There are glorious sunsets to be enjoyed that give so many colours to the evening sky a blush of pink, yellow, orange and red.

September is a good month for collecting and storing seed and so increase the number of plants in your garden for free. Seeds can be collected from many trees, shrubs, perennials, aquatic plants, alpines, annuals, biennials, bulbous plants, ornamental grasses, vegetables and herbs. Choose healthy and vigorous plants from which to collect seed, and remember only ripe seed will germinate. Place a paper bag over exploding seed head or where the seed is easily scattered by the wind. Carefully place seeds in collecting envelopes, label and date. In this way you should be able to keep track of your seed archive. Store your seed packets in a cool

dry place (the RHS recommends in a refrigerator at 5 degree centigrade). Finally, check on line or in a gardening book when is the correct time to sow your seeds – make a diary entry.

My Tree Warden alphabet has reached the letter 'P' and this month we will have P for Photography. A camera, or a smart phone, is the perfect companion for a visit to the woods. You can capture the changing seasons, photograph wildlife, record a favourite tree, learn new techniques and create memories that will last forever. Interesting shapes and shades, close-up and distance shots, take photos from different and unusual vantage points, careful use of focus and light. Don't be afraid to experiment.

Top tips

Ensure your camera/phone is fully charged and has plenty of free space on its memory.

Make sure your camera/phone is ready to snap that perfect shot straight away

When shooting images of people, go for informal shots, but make sure you have their permission first.

Try lots of different angles and compositions, you can always discard or edit later on.



Bin Collection Changes – Another Update

Plans for a trial of a four day working week in the Shared Waste Service have changed (again) since I last wrote. For Papworth, the bins will be emptied on Fridays, commencing on Friday 22nd September, when the black bins will be emptied.

The last Thursday collection will be on Thursday 14th September, when blue and green bins will be emptied. Collections will continue to alternate between black bins one Friday, and blue and green bins the following Friday.

Letters will be sent to all households by Royal Mail at the end of August to confirm the new arrangements. To help with the transition, additional staff will be assigned to the call centre to handle issues including missed bins. Funding for New Council Homes

South Cambs has been awarded significant funding to provide 13 additional homes from phase 2 of the government's Local Authority Housing Fund for refugees. This is in addition to the funding for 40 homes that it received for in phase 1. In total, the council has been granted just over £2.4m. The latest award, together with Council borrowing, will be used to provide 10 homes for refugee families from Afghanistan, plus three additional properties which will be used for temporary housing to reduce the dependency on bed and breakfast type accommodation. Under the terms of the grant, when the properties are no longer needed for refugee or temporary housing, they will be treated as normal HRA housing and added to council stock. The long-term legacy from this project will be an increase in social housing within the District. The Council is looking to acquire a mix of new-build properties from developers, and open market properties through Estate Agents.

Update:

An assistant to Anthony Browne MP contacted Whippet and received the response below which she forwarded to me today. If you haven't already gone to press it may be helpful to include this information. Hopefully it will give some comfort to people in the village who are struggling to get to work in Cambridge.

Please find below the response that Anthony Browne's Assistant recieved from Ed Cameron, Commercial Manager of Whippet.

Like many other industries, the bus industry has faced challenges in recruiting and training bus drivers. The Covid pandemic had serious implications in this regard and delayed the ongoing training we were running. At the same time, there were major delays caused in the issue of new licences, and the booking of driving tests, and we are only now starting to see an improvement in this.

This means that there is a shortage of bus drivers, although in recent

months I'm pleased to say that the situation has continued to improve. At Whippet, we are working hard to improve things both in recruitment of drivers with existing bus licences, and in the training of new people into the industry.

We are also investing heavily in our fleet of buses, with nine brand-new electric buses due to enter service during the summer on our Universal route in Cambridge. This will allow us to upgrade our fleet of buses that run on our other routes.

These two factors mean that the number of cancelled journeys has been continuing to reduce for several months now, and we are working hard to further improve this.

We are also aware of how important communication with our customers is. To this end, we are engaging with the organisation who run the electronic departure boards in Cambridge with the view to ensuring this data is always accurate and used to its full potential. We are also launching a new website and mobile app later this year, which will allow customers to track where all our buses are in real time and be aware of any delays should they occur.

I hope that Mr Browne is starting to see the improvements we're working on, and trust that the situation will continue to get better in the coming months.
