

Knowing who we are!

The question of identity is prominent and under scrutiny in many arenas. For individuals and people groups, it can include questions such as "Who am I ..." and, "What factors should prevail in conclusions we arrive at?"

For example, it is close to the heart of whether Northern Ireland should be known as 'the north of Ireland' or 'Ulster'; it affects how children may be treated at home and in school; it is generating a lot

of (often heated) debate among sports participants.

In truth the complexity of some aspects and unacknowledged pain felt by some people caught up in these debates has often been ignored rather than faced up to. One of the spin-offs in the 21st century is discussing these things should encourage us all to be more careful in how we address one another; and, as a result, to think through some areas of behaviour that may have been unchecked for too long. If this produces a more caring and thoughtful culture, this has to be a good thing, in my view. If, on the other hand, it prevents us talking and exploring what questions or crises of identity simply for fear of causing offence, this will be a bad outcome. It's good to talk!

We may think Christianity has nothing helpful to inject into such conversations. I disagree!

I am not suggesting a quick reading or consultation with the Christian's Bible will give categorically clear answers to all questions and issues arising from discussions about identity in the 21st century. But I do think we need to make sure we are starting from the right place.

If we are ready and willing to open the Bible, we find ground zero for human identity starts with how we came into being. Christians believe God made us and, as a result of what is commonly known as The Fall, we were robbed of that capacity to relate well to God. The good news is this can change. Christians believe also that through Jesus and what his life and death achieved, we are offered the equivalent of a new passport and certification that alters our status: from creatures God made, to children God has joyfully embraced into his family.

My point is this: if and when we enter the fray on matters of identity and do not take account of our creator and his rescue plan for us, or refuse to give the topic the healthy air-time it deserves, we

risk going off (or shooting our mouths off!) in ways that lead us into cul-de-sacs of confusion, disappointment and where more unnecessary hurt is caused.

When we can say 'Yes God made me, has unlocked a way to rescue me and unleash my full potential as a human being...' we can begin to allow other powerful feelings and opinions to find their place and be reconciled rather than being forces that, unchecked, dominate perspective and some behaviours in ways that divide us or cause harm.

It's often said that time goes faster the older we get. I recently got quite worried – Lent seemed remarkably early. Having only just recovered my waistline and survived dry January, and my waistline and survived dry January, and starting to think about my son's birthday (his middle name is Valentine, so you can guess...) I suddenly find everyone asking me about Lent! Whatt!? I rushed to my calendar and yes - there it is. Pancake day on the 13th with the 14th now hosting not only Kieran's birthday accompanied with roses and hearts but now to be preceded with arguments about maple syrup versus lemon and sugar and conjoined with versus lemon and sugar and conjoined with 'Ashing' as the church marks the start of Lent!

Fearing that at this rate we might soon be doing Fearing that at this rate we might soon be doing Lent over New Year, my next stop was to check out how the dates for Easter are actually set (the 40 days of Lent ending with Easter Sunday). It's a long story – something to do lunar cycles, as well as Holy week being just that – a week, and much to do a myriad of complications involving term times and bank holidays should ever these dates become fixed. Like Lent, many aspects of faith can't be pinned down, easily understood or held on to too rigidly. That at least is good news.

Whilst God changes not, the way we do God can and does. Often. Across time, across space and across culture.

Lent is commonly understood as a time of denial. Most often cakes or chocolate (this year coming too soon again for alcohol I suspect!). It's seen as a test of will power and resolve. But Jesus, after his direct experience of the Holy Spirit, an experience of assurance of belonging to God and God's call on his life went into the wilderness for this period.



Wilderness is often misunderstood as barren and harsh. But in fact it can be a place of respite and refreshment - a time to contemplate who we are and what our priorities in life should be.

Lent does come early this year. In a year pivotal nationally and internationally with more people across the world electing leaders and representatives, perhaps an early reassessment of our personal priorities and how we reflect these in our day to day lives is not unhelpful. Perhaps having a time of unneipui. Pernaps naving a time or withdrawal however brief each day or each week might resource and refresh us and help us all discovering we might live more wholly, holistically in line with what really matters in our lives. Understanding what's important and how to reflect that in how will live throughout the next year.

Tree Warden Report David Potter

At last, there is some colour appearing in our gardens and in the woods. Snowdrops have shown their delicate heads, white fairy bells, green and yellow veined, defiant to whatever the February weather might bring. Tread carefully.

Snowdrops have attracted many alternative names over the years: 'death's flower', 'dewdrops', 'drooping bell', 'Eve's tear' and 'white bells' amongst them. In Essex, we find 'Candlemas bells' and 'Mary's tapers' were also used.

The Cambridge University Botanic Gardens informs us that they have 48 different species, varieties, cultivars and hybrids of snowdrop (Galanthus) to see in their Garden. It might be that a similar number can be seen in the winter garden at the National Trust Anglesey Abbey. These many cultivars also have interesting names. Unfortunately, the cultivar Galanthus 'grumpy' is not currently in the Botanic Garden collection!

Also on show at this time of year are yellow winter aconites, sometimes called winter hellebore or winter wolf's bane. This is a woodland member of the buttercup family. It opens its yellow petals in late winter to attract any early pollinating insects and continues to carpet the woodland floor well into Spring when Bluebells arrive to give even more beauty to the woodland scene.

Ted Hughes wrote a short, complex poem entitled 'Snowdrop'. It has been set for study at GCSE.

Hughes poem is a nature poem about the brutal struggle against the pain of winter and death. He describes the snowdrop with 'her pale head heavy as metal'.

My tree warden alphabet has reached the letter 'T' and it will be t for texture. On a crisp February morning there is much of texture to admire in our trees and woodland. The lattice of bare branches, the bold grain of tree trunks and the intricate twigs and runners created by the shrub cover along the woodland floor. And there is colour and shade in all this texture. Be still and enjoy the winter vista. Listen to the chatter and excitement of the birds as they prepare to celebrate Valentine's Day. Look up and notice a red kite wheeling over the trees, beneath the scudding clouds.

Texture gives interest and variety on your walk. Reach out to touch the tree's rough bark or the Silver Birch's smooth edge. Look down at the sky reflected in puddles and listen to the wind blowing through the branches. Enjoy the feel of the soft, muddy earth beneath your shoes. There is an extra day in February this year so why not set it aside for a walk in the woods?

We seem to be having an increasing number of winter storms at the moment. I hope all your trees are well supported and your fences in good order. When it is too cold or wet to go outside you might use the time to plan for Spring and Summer in your garden seed trays to fill and new plants to buy. Have fun.

Following on from recent text messages sent to patients we thought it best to clarify the situation with West Cambs Federation (WCF).

WCF who were employing our Clinical Pharmacist (Clinician who carries out medication reviews for patients), Social Prescriber, Health and Wellbeing Coach, Community Matron and some IT staff, has ceased to operate, and all staff made redundant. As a result services that these staff provided will be significantly impacted.

In the future we anticipate that we will be able to provide these services again.

Papworth Surgery itself is still fully operational and none of the surgery staff are affected by redundancies. It does however mean that the Drs are under even more pressure than usual, so please bear with us while we navigate this difficult situation.

Papworth Pharmacy is an independent company and is NOT affected by this and remains open as usual.

In other news, we have a new GP joining us from the middle of March. Dr Nicola Howard will be working on a Wednesday and a Friday. She is a very experienced Dr and we are sure she will be a big asset to the Surgery.

Local man David Duker and his family have spent many hours researching the life of Victor Ekins, from a boy growing up in St.Neots, to joining the RAF in his early twenties. Followed by his training and eventual involvement in the Battle of Britain. The bravery of young men, just like Victor, resulted in the Germans never being able to occupy Britain during



The first meeting of 2024 of the Papworth Craft Group was a New Year celebration, kindly arranged by Sonja Allerton with cake and a festive drink. There was quite a large group and a great deal of chatter and not as much crafting as usual!

It will be two years on 24 February since the Russian invasion of Ukraine. There have been huge efforts by various groups all over this country to contribute different kinds of support to the people of Ukraine. A few years ago in the News & Views the Papworth Craft Group invited anyone interested to knit squares for charity blankets. Over time many knitted squares, (20 cm x 20 cm with all the ends sewn in!) have been brought to the library, knitted by people in the village. Since the latter part of 2022 donations of the finished blankets have gone to support the aid effort to Ukraine and more recently to Ukrainian refugees who left their country with very little and in need of items to keep them warm. Subsequent to the call for knitted squares was a request for hats and scarves. The first lot went to Hope & Aid Direct before Christmas. The pile has grown again since Christmas and more hats and scarves have been donated – beanies and bobble hats with flaps, adorable mini beanies for tiny tots. Carole Watt is a one woman manufacturer of crocheted hats and Tina Carter knits them in quantities as well. Is anyone reading this now, who fancies making some hats and scarves? They do not need to be crocheted or knitted in complicated patterns using complicated stitches - functional is the name of the game. You are, of course, free to follow any fancy, as Andrea Rowland did a while back, donating the most beautiful hats and scarves that she had knitted. If you would like to knit or crochet hats and scarves, but you do not have any spare yarn, please contact Rosalind Parnell at parnellrh@aol.com. There is still yarn in our stash. Any contribution to this ongoing project would be most welcome.

Perhaps you would prefer to support Ukraine by stitching a project to keep for yourself or give to someone special to you? There are more than a few designers who are selling specific patterns and kits of which some of the proceeds from their sale are being donated in support of Ukraine. If you are a stitcher there are a couple of colourful kits - yellow and blue - that can be made into cushion covers, glasses cases or simply framed as pictures. Jolly Red have a kit called Brighter Days Daffodils that retail between £19-£39 and £10 from the sale of each kit goes to the Disasters Emergency Committee. To date they have donated £2,200. Stitch a jolly canvas and contribute to this worthy cause. Go online to view them at jollyred.co.uk or you can call to place an order on 01460 281111. They also have a making up service. Hannah Bass Needlepoint are donating all profits from their kit Peace for Ukraine Charity Needlepoint Kit to the Disasters Emergency Committee. Go on their website, hannahbass.com and read about the support they had from suppliers, meaning that more money can go to the charity. A Ukrainian cross stitch designer, Kateryna, was mentioned in this column some months ago. She is originally from Kherson but fled with her husband, grandmother and cat to Odessa. Her resilience and courage are humbling. Although they escaped to Odessa to be safer, they have endured Russian attacks there as well. Throughout all the many challenges she and her family have faced, she has continued producing cross stitch designs in her charming, unique and recognisable style. She sells her designs on Etsy and showcases them on Instagram under @ stitchy_princess_black. Her designs have also appeared in Just Cross Stitch and World of Cross Stitching. If you are a cross stitcher, take a look at her designs, buy one or two and it is one small way of supporting Ukraine.

Civil Parking Enforcement

Civil Parking Enforcement has been live in South Cambs since late December, but from 1 February tickets, with fines attached, will begin to be issued by the Civil Parking Enforcement Officers. Officers can only enforce existing legal restrictions, such as parking on a single or double yellow lines. Other parking matters, such as causing an obstruction by parking on the pavement, remain Police matters.

As there are only two enforcement officers dedicated to South Cambs, their time will be prioritised according to need while minimising travel time across the large rural area they will cover.

To report parking violations, send an email to parkingcontrol@ cambridgeshire.gov.uk, including the following information: Restriction (what restriction is being contravened?), Time (what time does the contravention usually occur?), Day (what day does the contravention usually occur?) and Occurrence (how often is the contravention observed?).

Have Your Say on the Future of Local Housing

Residents are asked to help shape the future of housing across Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire by responding to a consultation on the Housing Strategy for Greater Cambridge. This strategy sets out a vision for the next five years which promotes healthy, safe, affordable and sustainable homes where people of all walks of life want to live. The consultation runs until 3 March 2024, and the Strategy will be finalised in the summer. It stands alongside the council's Local Plan, existing Homelessness and Rough Sleeping Strategies, and a number of other local strategies and plans.

South Cambs DC is pledged to delivering at least 375 new council homes during the next five years. It will undertake a stock condition survey of all existing council homes to produce a 15-year plan for improved energy efficiency. It will continue to deliver a cost-of-living support programme, including increased money advice support.

Cambridge 2040

Cambridge 2040 is the code name for the government's proposal to build a significant number of additional houses in the Greater Cambridge area. A few days before Christmas, DLHUC minister Michael Gove held a press conference in which

he indicated the number of additional houses is 150,000, rather than the 250,000 rumoured in the media. This figure includes the 50,000 additional homes included in our draft Local Plan. As there is insufficient space in Cambridge City for that many homes, we anticipate most will be in South Cambs and East Cambs.

The project will be managed by a "DevCo" (Development Corporation), staffed by civil servants and supported by a "flying squad" of planners. It is not yet clear what influence, if any, local councils will have on the project. Local leaders have met with the minister and his staff, and asked about the necessary water, infrastructure and amenities to support this development. When they receive answers, I will share them with residents.

Ermine Street Housing


South Cambs DC is proposing to lending Ermine St Housing (a wholly owned subsidiary of the council) a further £20 million. Much of this money is to buy single occupancy homes on the open market for homeless people. The properties will be run by Shire Homes, which manages the council's social housing. This proposal is described as "investing to save" – currently those who become homeless at short notice are placed in expensive bed-and-breakfast accommodation. Having its own pool of properties will permit the council to reduce the spend on such accommodation. The council is aiming to acquire about 100 units across South Cambridgeshire.

Four Day Week Data

When the government issued a Best Value Notice in response to South Cambs DC Four Day Working Week trial, it requested five years of historical data on nearly 200 data points, with weekly updates.
